Walker to sing new song

This time Paulius Klimas is singing not walking. Over thirty years ago, Klimas walked from Rochester to a meeting at the White House in Washington, D.C. and helped free a Lithuanian dissident from a Soviet prison. There is no need for such actions today, but there is a desperate need for faith.

The premiere of the song *Yellow Green Red* will take place on Tuesday October 19th at 8:00 pm at Dynamic Recording 2844-46 Dewey Ave in, Rochester. Singer/songwriter Bonnie Abrams and the studio band "*Paulius & Friends*" will appear, and the director of Dynamic Recording is Dave Kaspersin.

During the 1980s and early 1990s, Klimas was a Lithuanian American human rights activist in Rochester. His 1988 Walk to the White House and subsequent 400-mile Baltic Freedom Walk, across the Baltic States in 1991, spread a message of hope and belief in democratic ideals.

Democracy is based on open debate; all opinions should be respected. Whether secular or religious, faith helps everyone concentrate on the key aspects of life and overcome a myriad of mental roadblocks.
