As a reminder, we are collecting Dr. Seuss books for one of the GFWC Grand Initiatives under the 2018-2020 administration – the goal set for clubs across the United States to collect a total of 1,000 Dr. Seuss books over a two year period. Half of the books collected would be distributed by the club in their community and the other half would go to GFWC Headquarters and be distributed in the Washington, DC area. Well...an update was given at the International convention in June at Austin, TX and halfway thru the administration, over 50,000 had been donated SO FAR! Wow! Remember I told you last year that Dr. Seuss books were trending on best seller lists for the first time in many years? That's why!

So...a new national Grand Initiative goal has been set – it's now 55,000 by June 2020 and this is where we come in. We will be wrapping up our Dr. Seuss book collection at the end of October and we will send in half in November and distribute our half locally in November and December. *We have collected 67 Dr. Seuss books and our CSP has set a goal of 100 books so if you would please bring a Dr. Seuss book or two to the September or October meeting so that we can meet our club goal – we only need 33!* Let's hit our goal!!!!
