Community Service Programs (CSP)

The Arts & Culture CSP has held two dinner meetings at my home, 9/2 & 9/8/25.

We discussed our contributions to the upcoming year, to include our speaker and food for the October meeting.

We are excited to present our October speaker, Greg Gerrald of Classy Cruet, who will speak on Mediterranean Lifestyle.

In the monthly Newsletter, we will feature some history about our country, since 2026 we will be celebrating the 250th Anniversary of America!

This month's entry is about Constitution Day, which began September 17, 1787.

Every September 17 is designated as Constitution Day and is Federally mandated to have educational programs on the anniversary of the signing of the Constitution. This year's SC event is at the SC State House Chambers, (HR 4309}, Friday, September 19, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., presented by the American Board of Trial Advocates. Our keynote speaker will be The Honorable J. Michelle Childs, U.S. Court of Appeals Judge for the District of Columbia Circuit. Area High School students, teachers and parents have been invited and students will have the honor of sitting in the Legislators' chairs. As Program Director, I am inviting all of you to attend. Public seating will be available in the House Chamber Balcony.

In addition, with the upcoming cool weather, our CSP would like to share soup recipes. This month's recipe is a well-loved family recipe from Nancy Schmidt's Mother:

Corn Chowder:

8 oz. (like Hormel) salt pork, trim off hard skin & cut into small pieces, brown slowly until completely rendered, about 20-30 minutes

Saute diced onions in rendered pork, about 5 minutes. (Flavor of the soup is the salt in the pork).

In the same pot, add

2 cans undrained corn

2 cans petite diced tomatoes

1-2 cups water

Scant amount of sugar
Salt & pepper to taste
4 diced potatoes
1/2 cup milk or half & half
Add water if needed, but not too much
Cook til spuds are done, then simmer until serving. Enjoy!
Note: Does not freeze well because potatoes will become mushy.

I hope you have all been saving your plastic film during the summer months to give us a big head start on our new yearlong **Trex Challenge** which begins on Oct. 1. This year we will keep another 1000 pounds of plastic film out of the landfills and rivers and in the process win/earn a new Trex bench for a home in the Aldersgate Special Needs Ministry in Irmo.

As a reminder of what kinds of (clean and dry) **plastic film** you can collect, they are: *produce bags; *dry cleaning bags, *bubble wrap, *bread bags, *grocery bags, *store bags, *Ziploc and other resealable bags, *cereal box <u>liners</u>, *case <u>overwrap</u> (ex.- around cases of bottled water, paper towels, TP, etc.), *stretch plastic film (ex.- around furniture or pallets), *plastic mailer envelopes (ex.- Amazon mailers), *any plastic film with either a 2 or 4 inside the recycle triangle. Your fingers can stretch it!!

* It is <u>NOT</u> "crisp or crinkly" <u>cellophane</u> which cannot be recycled. Examples are clear gift bags to hold cookies or the wrap around bunches of flowers in the store or candy wrappers. If it tears instead of stretches - it isn't plastic film.

We will also collect these items every month:

- REAL corks, not synthetic "corks"
- pull tabs from drink cans or vegetable/fruit cans
- dead batteries (AAA, AA, D, 9 volt) (no car batteries!)

Health & Wellness: Daryl Hendrix & Ann Keisler

The theme of the GFWC International Day of Service for 2025 focuses on raising public awareness and providing resources to combat domestic and sexual violence. GFWC has designated Saturday, Sept 27 for this focus.

H&W is leading this service project in our club although all club members are asked to participate. The entire week of Sept 21-27 will be a week of service to recognize this vital issue in our community.

Our speaker at the general meeting on Sept 22 will be Lisa Kejr who represents Lighthouse For Life. You will remember that SAWC made a large contribution to this cause from Bunco funds in the Spring. One of the centers this organization sponsors is the HARBOR on St Andrews Road. This is a day center/resource center for those who have been/or are victims of trafficking.

That week members of H&W are preparing 3 different lunches for attendees at the center and have prepared a lunch for a retreat. H&W is donating a FREEDOM BAG (a book bag full of supplies that a person might need if they wish to change their lives).

We are asking that each club member participate by donating items for a second Freedom Bag. A list of the items will be available at the meeting or if you prefer, a donation of \$10 to \$15 will be accepted and H&W will purchase the items for another bag.

There are also volunteer opportunities available if you wish. We will have flyers available at the meeting for individuals who would like to support this cause. Thanks in advance for your support of this GFWC focus.

On another H&W topic, the Walk to End Alzheimer's is again being held at Segra Park in downtown Columbia on Saturday, October 4. Registration is available on line.
