Next week is a doozy. The House is meeting for three days straight. Every controversial bill imaginable is up for debate. Now that they are back in the House Chamber, they do not have a time limit as to when they have to be out. I expect there will be at least one if not more late nights. Pizza companies will be thrilled to see the big orders again after two years of not meeting in Concord. Senate only meeting one day.

What's up for us. Tons of employment and vaccine bills that impact employers and employees, particularly in healthcare providers setting. Also, most of the special education bills are up for a vote as well as bills dealing with education for children with disabilities. One key bill that will be voted on by the full House is HB1513 which clarifies the definition of a child with a disability for purposes of special education. It is slated to pass.
