Legislative Update-Teresa Rosenberger, Lobbyist, Bernstein Shur

The House held its first session and it was relatively uneventful. Most bills went as predicted. There were a few surprises such as a very close vote on a tabling motion and then when the bill was not tabled it passed by an overwhelming bi-partisan majority. So it is proving to be just as we expected, unpredictable and interesting.

Next week for our priority bills:

HB 386, lowering the age for mandatory seats belts from 7 to 4. The public hearing is Tuesday, the 7th at 11:30. The executive session is following the hearing which is very odd. I am assuming from that the committee know s how it is going to vote. We are opposed to the bill.

SB 118, rear facing car seats for children 2 and under should have an executive session. Fingers crossed on this one. We support the bill. It will be a tight vote so hoping we can get one or more republicans on the Senate Transportation Committee to vote yes.

There will be a number of executive sessions on bills we are watching. Only another 10 days before we know what the Governor is thinking about for a budget for the biennium.
