State Budget Update-Teresa Rosenberger, Lobbyist, Bernstein Shur

What a week. The Senate finished their work on the budget and passed it unanimously on Wednesday. They took a 5 hour recess to add a number of things in the document which would allow Senate Democrats to vote yes. It worked. Vote was 24-0. The House did an amazing thing and concurred on the Senate budget yesterday. I have never in my decades of working each biennium on the budget seen a House concurrence. So why. Finally conventional wisdom prevailed and House Majority and Minority leadership knew things would only go downhill in a committee of conference so they both held their noises and voted to concur. Wow.

So a good win. Medicaid rates increased. Medicaid expansion has another 7 years of life. Brain Injury line item for ABD services made it intact. Good year for health care and for brain injury.

Other big new is SB 118, the rear facing car seat bill we have been championing all year passed the House. It's off to the Governor. Huge win for kids and great job by brain Injury folks with others in the coalition.

Now the only things left are a number of bills to have committee if conferences formed which will be on the 15th. Then come back for a final vote on Committees of conference on the 29th then summer. There is some concern that with things basically done, many members will choose the beach or golf instead of Concord. If so, you could see some Democratic initiatives that have been tabled, come off the table and pass.

I am not even seeing study committees or retained bill scheduled. Folks are ready for a break.

We are basically slow until study committees start in late summer. Teresa
