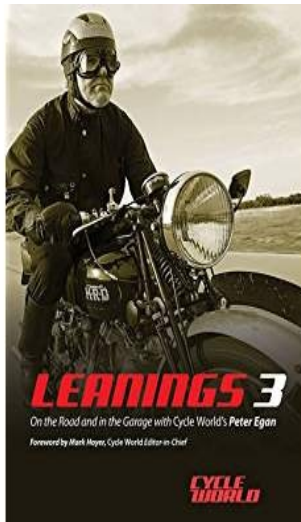

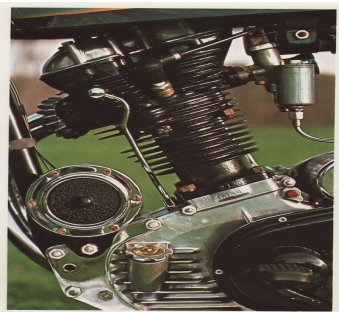

Tech Tips



Some basic tech tips.

- High-pressure car washes can force water into the plugs, wires and electrical connector plugs. The water in these connectors can change resistance values and will cause poor performance and misfiring even when everything appears to be dry.
- Always check the oil when the bike is in the position outlined in the manual.

- When experiencing starting issues, make sure there's gas in the tank.
- When replacing fork seals, always put a piece of wax paper over the end of [fork tubes](#) before sliding the new fork seals on. This will protect the new seal lip.
- Never clean [acrylic screens](#) with ammonia-based cleaning products or glass cleaner. The solvent action of the glass cleaner will destroy the acrylic. Do not allow brake fluid, alcohol or strong solvents to come in contact with the screen. Permanent damage will result.

Ninth annual TELUS Manitoba Motorcycle Ride for Dad.

A total of 1,510 registered riders took part in this year's Manitoba Motorcycle Ride for Dad, surpassing the old record of 1,437 set in 2014. Bringing the nine-year fundraising total to over \$1.8 million. Proceeds stay in Manitoba for prostate cancer research and education.

In its nine years, the Ride for Dad has become a finely-tuned machine.

All of the expenses are covered by corporate sponsors and that means 100% of what is pledged goes to the cause.

Starting at Polo Park, the Ride for Dad headed down Portage Avenue to Assiniboia Downs then north to Selkirk, Gimli and back. Joining the Ride for Dad official start were four Celebrity Ride Captains: women's motocross champion and monster truck driver Ami Houde; CTV News anchor Gord Leclerc; and former Blue Bombers Doug Brown and Obby Khan.

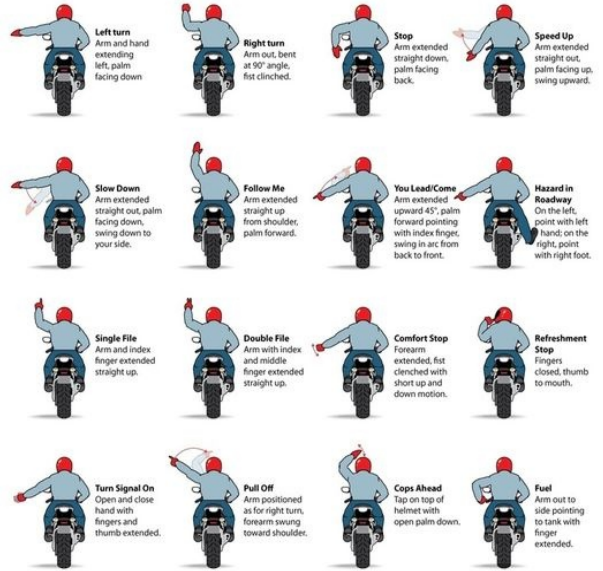
Additional funds were raised in a motorcycle raffle with the winner receiving a 2017 Indian Scout from Headingley Sport Shop.
