### Trinity Teacher Gets Piper Award

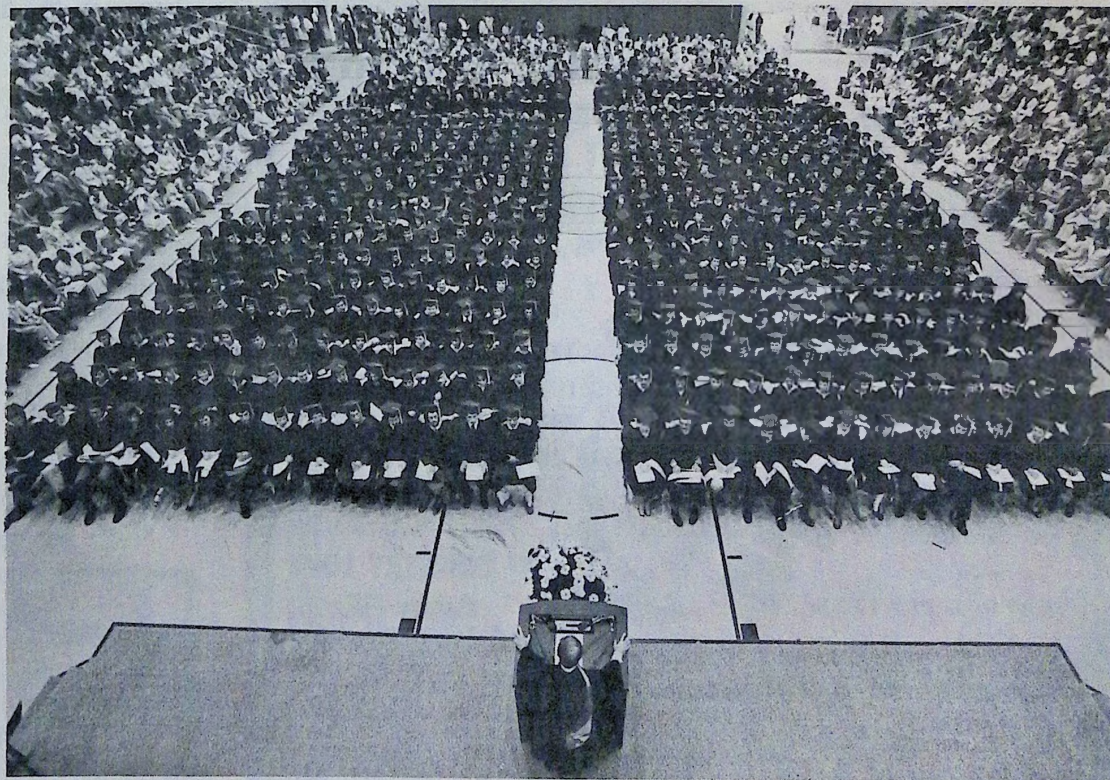

## Edwards Okays Recharge Dam

Middle Verde Creek recharge dam 13½ miles north of Hondo on the Jack Finger ranch was dedicated Wednesday, May 24, by the Edwards Underground Water District and transferred to Medina County for maintenance.

The second such flood water retarding structure initiated and completely funded by the EUWD—both in Medina County—Verde Dam is a rock-fill, concrete-face structure spanning a canyon with bluffs some 40 feet high on each side. Built by Terry Construction Co. of South Carolina at an overall cost of nearly \$375,000, it will divert an average of 585 acre feet of flood water annually that otherwise would be lost

downstream.

Finger, who gave EUWD the site for the structure and a 22-acre-foot flowage easement, told William H. Spice, Jr., board chairman, he considered the recharge dam "aesthetically designed and constructed."

In a called meeting in the Hermann Sons Steak House in Hondo, the board voted to make another effort to acquire a site on San Geromino Creek.

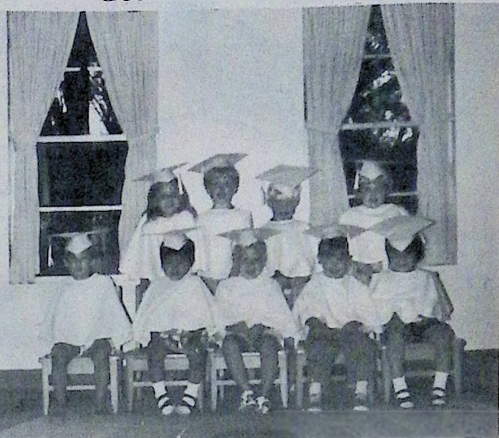
The current City Council has also appointed as Municipal Judge, David Rogers; Prosecuting Attorney, Ray Adams; and City Attorney, David Waggett.

The little ones at Forest Hills Presbyterian Child Nurture Center were honored this week with graduation ceremonies, marking their introduction in many cases to education.

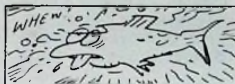



## Festive Fillings

### A Surprise For Father's Day

You can turn a pork loin roast into real party fare if you treat it a special way for a very special man—Dad.

A roast with a surprise filling may be just the thing for a gala Father's Day dinner. To simplify its preparation, you can have the butcher cut a pocket in it and crack the ribs to make slicing easier. You might open the festivities with a serving of Bacardi Golden Punch, a refreshing rum libation.



### FATHER'S FAVORITE ROAST PORK

- 1/2 teaspoon allspice
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground mace
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- 5 to 5 1/2 pounds pork loin roast
- 1 1/2 cups chopped dried apricots
- 2 medium apples, cored and chopped
- 1/3 cup raisins
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup Bacardi light rum
- 6 tablespoons currant jelly
- 1 1/2 cups fine dry bread crumbs
- 1/3 cup melted butter or margarine

Combine allspice, 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon, salt, cloves, mace and pepper. Rub into surface of pork. Refrigerate overnight. Combine apricots, apples, raisins, the remaining 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon and rum. Refrigerate overnight. Drain fruit and reserve liquid. Cut a long, deep pocket down length of roast. Stuff with fruit. Brush roast with fruit syrup. Place roast on a rack and bake at 325 degrees F. for 1 1/2 hours. Remove from oven and spoon jelly

over it. Coat with bread crumbs. Baste with butter. Return roast to the oven and roast 1 1/2 hours longer, or until done. Let stand 15 minutes before carving. (Makes 10 to 12 servings.)

AN ELEGANT MAIN DISH for a Father's Day dinner could be this version of the pork loin roast.

### BACARDI'S GOLDEN PUNCH

- 1 can (6 ounces) frozen pink lemonade, thawed
- 1 can (6 ounces) frozen orange juice, thawed
- 2 1/2 cups water
- 2 1/2 cups pineapple juice
- 1 can (12 ounces) apricot nectar
- 1/2 cup lemon juice
- 1 bottle (four-fifths quart) Bacardi light rum
- 1 quart lemon-lime soda
- 1 quart orange or lemon sherbet

In large pitcher, combine lemonade, orange juice, apricot nectar and lemon juice. Chill. Just before serving, add rum and soda. Pour punch into footed glasses, and top each serving with a small scoop of sherbet. (Makes about 24 servings.)

## May Rainfall

Totals 1.6 Inches

Although June 1 provided a series of showers amounting to a promise of a moist month, May tallied only 1.6 inches for the entire month. Total for the first five months of 1978 stands at 11.5 inches, below average for this time of year, according to records of Henry Brauchle, local weather observer.

The fields in the Helotes area are not damaged so far, but rain is needed for livestock range grasses and food crops, local ranchers and farmers report.

June in recent years has proved cooler than average and ranchers are hopeful the trend will continue.

## Social Security Changes Noted

Gilbert G. Gonzalez, manager of the San Antonio social security office, announced the method for crediting coverage under the Social Security Act has been changed by the 1977 amendments.

Before 1978 a worker received a quarter of coverage for each \$50 of covered earnings paid in a calendar quarter. However, effective 1-1-78, that amount is \$250. "This means," Mr. Gonzalez said, "that a quarter will now be credited for each \$250 of earnings in a taxable year."

Another change arising from the new amendments is that a quarter of coverage will no longer necessarily be credited to the calendar quarter in which it is earned. Quarters of coverage

may now be assigned to any quarter during the calendar year in which the worker has earnings.

Also before 1978, different types of income may have been treated in different ways for coverage purposes. Mr. Gonzalez said that with the recent amendments all covered income is totaled for coverage purposes. The yearly total determines the number of quarters, i.e., a quarter is credited for each \$250 of yearly earnings.

Various other provisions of the Social Security Act remain unchanged. For example, specific coverage requirements relating to agricultural workers, domestics, and the self-employed are the same. Net earnings from self-employment of at least \$400 in the taxable year is still required for the crediting of self-employment earnings.

"Additionally," Mr. Gonzalez mentioned, "the amount of covered earnings required for the crediting of a quarter of coverage will rise automatically as average wages increase." By the same token, should average wages not increase, the amount required for a quarter of coverage will not change.

Mr. Gonzalez reminds the residents of this area to telephone the local office for additional information concerning the recent amendments.
