GREY FOREST LOWERS TAX EXEMPTIONS

City Hopes To Pave Streets

The Grey Forest City Council, Stappenbeck, city secretary, is on after mulling the question of tax exemptions for senior citizens on

ad valorem taxes within the boundaries of the city, voted to lower the exemption from the \$10,000 allowed last year to \$5,000 for the next tax period. It had been proposed to limit the amount to the State minimum of \$3,000, but council members agreed to give older citizens a bigger break.

It was concluded that there are 29 properties affected. Lowering the tax permits practically all of them to be re-added to tax rolls. A need for the money outweighed original generosity, one council person said.

Faust To Head School Lunch Expands Air Force Village Annual Drive

E. F. (Sandy) Faust, senior vice president, National Bank of Fort Sam Houston, has been announced as chairman for the 1976 Air Force Village Support Campaign by John H. Foster, chairman of the Air Force Village Foundation Development Committee.

"Theme for this year's campaign is 'The Foundation Is A Trust'", Faust said, adding: "We want to stress that this is for support of needy widows."

Faust, a native of San Antonio, is retired from the U. S. Army. He entered the military service in 1943, earned a commission in Officer Candidate School in 1949 and completed the Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kan., in 1965. He was promoted to colonel in 1970.

His most recent service was as Chief Army Mission, Venezuela, until retirement in 1972. Faust is a graduate of McNeese State College, Lake Charles, La.

Upon returning to San Antonio from his Venezuela assignment in 1972, he became an officer in the National Bank of Fort Sam Houston and was appointed Senior Vice President in 1975.

Air Force Village, a retirement community for military officers and families and widows, is located at Ravenswood Drive and Loop 410. The non-profit tax-exempt foundation was opened in 1970 and since that time more than \$270,000.00 has been donated for those who cannot pay their way.

In addition to Faust and Foster, the Air Force Village Development Committee is composed of Maj. Gen. Robert W. Maloy, President, Air Force Village Foundation, Maj. Gen. Richard T. Coiner, Jr., Mrs. Elna B. Fox, Brig. Gen. Frank L. Gailer, Jr., Col. David L. Hill, Brig. Gen. William T. Lindley and Col. Paul K. Walker.

The Foundation Trust Campaign will continue through February and conclude in March, according to Faust.

New federal guidelines make more Northside Independent School District students eligible to receive reduced-price lunches in school cafeterias. Families whose incomes and size correspond with the guidelines are eligible to buy school lunches for 20 cents instead of the regular 50 cents (elementary), 55 cents (middle school), and 60 cents (high school).

Beginning March 1, approximately 10 percent more families can buy reduced-price lunches, as the scale for a one-child family goes up to \$5,040 annual income and up to \$20,000 for a 12-member family.

Details on family eligibility are currently being distributed by Northside schools. Any parents wishing to avail their children of this program must fill out the forms and return them to the school principal.

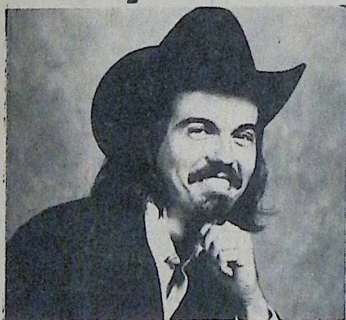

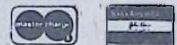

Thunder Soccer To Open March 31 At Alamo Stadium

The roar of Thunder will resound through Alamo Stadium this summer, in the form of cheering from the fans of the San Antonio Thunder Soccer Team.

In a joint announcement from Jim Smith, Thunder Vice President and General Manager and SAISD Director of Athletics Marvin Gustafson, agreement has been reached for the San Antonio entry in the North American Soccer League to play its 1976 season at the Hildebrand Avenue stadium.

The premier game will be Wednesday, March 31 when the New York Cosmos visit San Antonio for an exhibition game featuring the incomparable Pele, in his only regularly scheduled appearance in the Alamo City.

The regular season home games begin April 14 and carry through August 13. They will feature Coach Don Batie's warriors against twelve different opponents in this, the turn-over year.

In another turn-over move, Smith has announced that all home games will have an 8 p.m. starting time. Thus enabling the so-called "sun side" of the stadium to be engulfed in

shadows, offering no hindrance to the fans.

"We are extremely pleased to be able to play our second full season at Alamo Stadium," stated Smith. "The facilities rank as one of the finest throughout the League and we can stand with our heads held high when hosting our visitors. The playing field is in excellent condition and the cleanliness of the stadium reveals the complete effort put forth by Marvin Gustafson and his staff. The sight lines are perfect for watching soccer, in fact there isn't a bad seat in the house."

Known as the "King of Soccer", Pele is the most prolific goal scorer of all time. Before joining New York last season, he tallied 1220 goals in a career that spanned from 1956 through 1974.

During that time he scored 3 goals in a game 90 times, 4 goals, 30 times, and 5 goals in a game 6 times. His highest output in a single game was 8 goals in an 11-0 win for his home club of Santos in 1964. In one season, 1959, he alone scored 129 goals, a pretty good entire season for most soccer clubs. Scoring is the name of the game. Pele does it best.






