



Legend has it that temples and lost cities inhabited by early Mayans or Aztecs and races of other Indian tribes once abounded in the Hills. But they were gone by the time the Europeans arrived. Spears, arrowheads and talismen are often found in this Ranch country. Seldom are the larger pieces found in such excellent condition as the limestone head shown here.


