

#### Farm Bureau Pays Claims

Texas Farm Bureau paid 269 claims worth \$232,500 through the organization's accidental death program in 1978, said M. L. Stolte, Bexar County Farm Bureau president.

Traffic related incidents caused the most deaths with 147 claims made for auto-truck mishaps, 6 claims for motorcycle or minibike accidents, 5 claims for pedestrian incidents, plus 2 claims for bicycle

accidents.

Deaths caused by tractor, firearms, drownings, falls and burns ranked high among the 269 claims tallied.

Methodist Hospital Gets Astronaut Oxygen Unit

A \$500,000 hyperbaric chamber, a mammoth 12-ton pressurized unit to be used for oxygenation therapy, has been donated to Southwest Texas Methodist Hospital by the McDonnell Douglas Corporation in St. Louis.

The chamber, once part of the aircraft firm's backup safety system for training Skylab astronauts, will be installed in the new 300,000 square-foot Methodist Plaza, a professional building in the South Texas Medical Center across from Methodist Hospital.

The new acquisition is expected to be ready for patient treatment in the late fall. Methodist's hyperbaric chamber will be the only one available for full medical use in a civilian institution in the five-state HEW Region 6 areaTexas, Louisiana, Arkansas, Oklahoma and New Mexico. A military chamber is located at Brooks Air Force Base, but it is only available to civilians on an emergency basis.

The 7 x 20-foot chamber, designed to deliver high-dose oxygen, was used in the Skylab program as insurance against decompression sickness in the event of accidental exposure to the vacuum environment of the space vehicle.

This condition, also known as "the bends" suffered by deepsea divers who come up too fast, is treated by placing the individual in a hyperbaric chamber, pressurizing it until the symptoms are relieved, then s-l-o-w-l-y returning pressure to normal atmospheric conditions

Besides decompression sickness, the hyperbaric oxygen inhalation treatment is also the established mode of therapy for gas gangrene, gas embolism and carbon monoxide poisoning, as well as promoting the healing of failing skin grafts, osteomyelitis and other healing difficulties with bones and soft tissue wounds.





#### UTSA Is Now Six Years Old

The University of Texas at San Antonio celebrated its sixth birthday Tuesday, June 5.

The university opened its doors to its first students in 45,000 square feet of leased space in the Koger Center, Loop 410 and Babcock, with 50 faculty members and 671 graduate students.

During the school year just ended, UTSA enrolled 8,886 students on its 600-acre campus

on Loop 1604, at HemisFair Plaza and at military bases throughout the city. The projected enrollment for this fall is 9,500 students.

The city's only four-year, public university, UTSA now offers 31 undergraduate and 15 graduate degree programs. The first doctoral program, a joint program with the UT Health Science Center in psychology, is pending approval.






