Helotes Asks For Bank

A charter application for a local bank-the first for Helotes-has been filed in Austin recently. Organizers who have been working on the plan for several years include Harry A. Olson, John H. White, W. Gene Garrison, M. Luther Ealy, and William D. Standley.

To be known as Hill Country Bank, the new institution is being sponsored for a state charter by National Bankshares Corporation of Texas. It will be located near Helotes Park Plaza—and the arrival of The University of Texas at San Antonio on a campus just 3.9 miles away is deemed a factor in favor of the granting of the charter.

The bank is to have a proposed capital of \$500,000, a spokesman said. Capital stock will be \$250,000 and the remainder will have \$150,000 certified surplus and \$100,000 in reserves, according to the proposal, made in late April. Earlier proposals were delayed because of lack of concentrated population.




