As July went out in the rainstorm which will be remembered longer than the floods of 1919 and 1921 in this area, rainfall for the first seven months of the year measured 16 inches with 2.1 for July, Henry Brauchle reported.

Although Helotes escaped

flood damage so far, as the ECHO goes to press, local citizens are concerned for their Hill Country neighbors who experienced losses of lives and property. Many here had homes in the Medina Lake area or ranches in nearby counties and they have reported losses. Residents also were calling on their family members scattered throughout the damaged area to check on their safety. Local residents were also pleased to hear from out-of-state friends and relatives who heard of the Texas flood and were con-cerned. To those who suffered losses, the community is offering not only sympathy but also help where needed. Rainfall reports are incomplete here, but seven to 11 inches were tallied by various citizens.

Connally Opens Folklife Festival

SAN ANTONIO—Ten years after he christened the Institute of Texan Cultures as the Texas Pavilion for the 1968 HemisFair, former governor John Connally returned Thursday to open the Institute's annual Texas Folklife Festival.

annual Texas Folklife Festival. It was under Governor Connally's leadership that the Institute was constructed to build an exhibit where visitors could "get the big picture of all the people of Texas" and Texans "could recapture our culture and our understanding of ourselves."

In 10 years, the Institute has grown from an exhibit floor to a comprehensive learning and communications center for Texas history and folk culture. The Folklife Festival is part

The Folklife Festival is part of that growth. Started in 1972, the Festival brings together 5,000 people representing 30 ethnic groups for four days of traditional food, games, music, dance, stories, crafts and contests.

The Festival covers 15 acres surrounding the Institute on HemisFair Plaza in downtown San Antonio. Gates open at noon today, Saturday and Sunday. The Festival closes at 11 p.m. each night.



Energy Costs Hit Water Board

Inflation has the City Water Board of San Antonio in the same financial bind as the average consumer, according to a survey of the utility's current operating costs compared with prices paid for goods and services 10 years ago.

pared with prices paint of goods and services 10 years ago.

Figures compiled by CSB comptroller John Shields show the greatest increase in the utility's expenses has been the cost of electric power for operating the system's water pumps, which has jumped 293 per cent in the past 10 years.

CSB's electric bill in 1968 was

CSB's electric bill in 1968 was \$402,272. This year Shields has budgeted \$1,582,390 for this

expense.
During the 10-year period the budget for personal services - wages and other employee benefits - has grown from \$2,947,200 to \$8,599,380, a jump of 192 per cent. Shields attributed part of this growth to an increase of employees in the 10 year period from 557 to 731.
Cost of materials used in

Cost of materials used in extending service to customers also has skyrocketed. A foot of six-inch water pipe, the most popular size, which cost \$1.28 in 1968, is \$2.46 today.

Fire hydrants, which the City Water Board buys, installs and maintains for the City of San Antonio free of charge, are \$333.06 each today compared with \$125.11 a decade ago.

Shields said the utility pays 44.95 cents for a gallon of gas today compared with 15.9 cents 10 years ago, an increase of 183 per cent.

Shields noted that while the City Water Board's charges for water service have climbed 64 per cent during the past 10 years, the utility's operating expenses have gone up 217 per cent in the same period.

Despite the rate increases, San Antonio water still is a bargain compared with Dallas, Fort Worth, Houston and other major Texas cities, all of whom charge more for this service than the local utility, he pointed out.

Geologist Jack Schmitt explored the moon as an Apollo 17 astronaut. Schmitt, now a U.S. senator from New Mexico, says our trips to the moon were right on the beam – putting vast new knowledge within our

Schmitt explains, "Our observations on the face of the moon have taught us the moon have taught us about its origin and about the origin of the earth. This will lead us to new mineral resources and new knowledge of such things as the origins of the oceans, and of life itself. We'll still benefit from this knowledge dozens of years from now."

Outer space is only one of the fascinating way-out frontiers explored by geologists. Geologists work on ocean floors, in craters of active volcanoes and in the middle of Antarctica.

According to Schmitt, "There's a lot we don't know about this spaceship we live on, and we need to understand more...much more than ever before

New Ramps Being Built

SAN ANTONIO—State Department of Highways and Public Transportation personnel began two important ramp improvement projects on Loop 410 this week.

The first ramp will reduce the problems facing existing south-bound Loop traffic to U.S. 90 west. This ramp is used by motorists headed for Lackland and Kelly Air Force Bases and Wilford Hall Hospital. It will be constructed about half a mile to the north of the existing one. This will permit existing traffic to move safely off of the Loop 410 southbound mainlane

The other project will move the northbound exit ramp to Marbach Road 1500 feet further south

The total cost will be \$55,000. Department maintenance personnel will do the work which is expected to take several months

Motorists on these sections of Loop 410 are urged to pay particular attention to department personnel working on the roads. Appropriate warning signs and when necessary, flagmen, will be used to safeguard both travelers and workers. All motorists are urged to drive with care, obey the signs and save a life.


