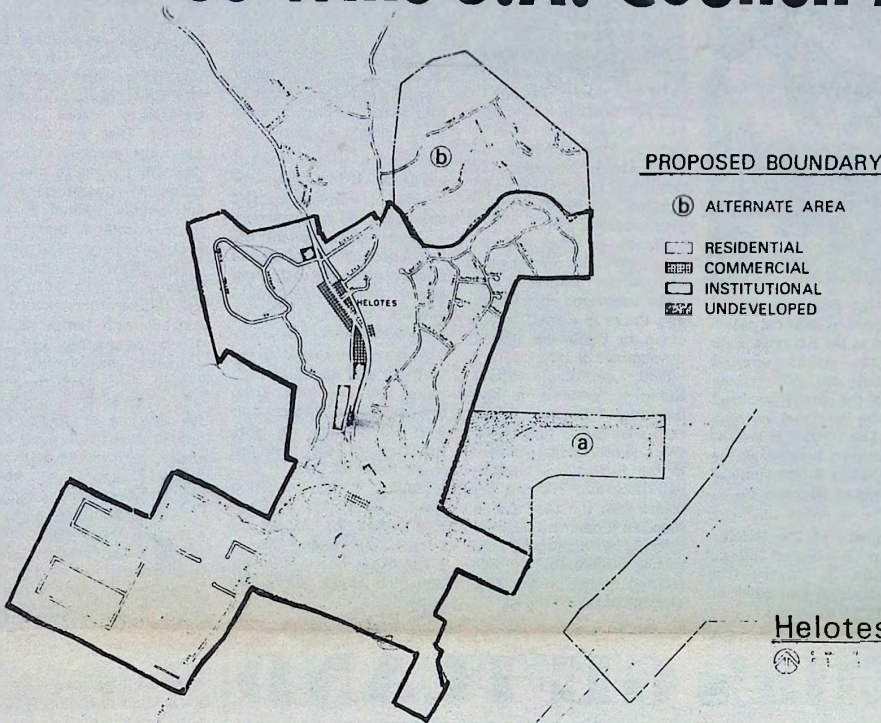

Helotes Wins S.A. Council Approval

Incorporation Election To Be Set



The proposed new boundaries of the city of Helotes are the dark lines on the map. They take in a 2.8-square mile area. Included are Downtown Helotes, Helotes Park Plaza, Helotes Park Estates, and Helotes Ranch Acres (including the newer units in the rectangle in the lower left corner of the map). Not included are the areas designed "a" and "b." The "a" area is along Hausman Road and includes Evans Valley. The "b" area is Helotes Creek Ranch. In the lower right corner of the map is the intersection of Loop 1604 and Highway 16, blocked in by the city limits of San Antonio.

The long fight to incorporate Helotes reached a climax on Thursday, May 14, when the San Antonio city council voted to give Helotes area residents permission to call an incorporation election.

The election will be held later this summer after the official ordinance with the legal metes and bounds of the new City of Helotes has been passed by the San Antonio council, and the organizers of the new city have petitioned the county judge to call the election.

Every registered voter living within the 2.8-square mile area designated to be the new city will be entitled to vote in the election.

Following the vote to incorporate will come an election for a mayor and city council and the organization of the new city. The long historical identity of Helotes will be preserved.

Members of the committee to incorporate reported to the Helotes Home Owners Association Monday night. The vote in the San Antonio city council meeting the previous Thursday was 6 to 3 in favor of Helotes' petition. The San Antonio planning and zoning commission had recommended that Helotes not be permitted to incorporate, but the majority of the council went against its commission's recommendation.

Rev. Bill Henderson of Helotes Hills United Methodist Church, chairman of the committee to incorporate, was given a vote of gratitude during the meeting.

The successful fight to get permission for Helotes to incorporate began almost exactly three years ago. An earlier attempt, some ten years before, had been unsuccessful.

Helping in the successful fight was Rep. Don Rains, who introduced a bill in the current term of the Texas Legislature to grant permission for Helotes to incorporate without the approval of San Antonio, in whose extraterritorial jurisdiction the Helotes area lies.

The Helotes Incorporation Committee is continuing to work on pre-election details.

Helotes Bank Moves Ahead

The new Helotes Bank is on schedule and expects to be open for business in temporary quarters at Highway 16 and Hausman Road by about mid-August, a spokesman said this week.

Following approval earlier this year by the State Banking Commission, an appeal was filed by an opposition bank. The commission heard the appeal and denied it.

The organizers of the Helotes Bank must now submit to the state commission a roster of proposed bank officers, and make application to the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation for coverage of deposits the bank will receive.

Meanwhile a building committee has been formed among the organizers so that a temporary building will be ready when the officers have been approved and the FDIC has approved the bank insurance application.

The new Helotes Bank is on schedule and expects to be open for business in temporary quarters at Highway 16 and Hausman Road by about mid-August, a spokesman said this week.

School Bonds Pass 2 to 1

Northside School District voters approved on Tuesday the \$48½ million bond issue proposed by the school board to build new schools and renovate old ones in the face of the fast growth of the district.

Approximately 3,700 out of 70,000 registered voters in the district turned out for the election, and voted two to

one in favor of issuing the bonds. The vote at Helotes School, one of seven polling places, was 135 in favor of the bond issue and 73 opposed to it.

A new high school, new middle school and two new elementary schools are included in plans for construction with the new bond money.

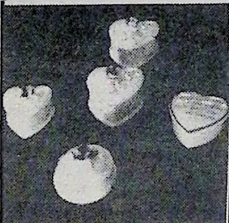

5th California Player Signs

UTSA Basketball Coach Don Eddy has signed his fifth California basketball recruit to a grant-in-aid with the commitment of 6'6", 220-pound center-forward Vern Kinney of California state champion (Division II) Barstow Junior College.

Barstow Junior College has won the Division II California State Championship two years in a row. The year before (1978-1979) Barstow Junior College was 0-24. Kinney averaged 14 points and 11 rebounds while Barstow compiled a two-year record of 53-13.

Kinney is from Denver, Colo., where he did not play high school basketball but was discovered by Coach Jim Parks in a AAU tryout camp in California during the summer of 1979.

Eddy comments about Kinney, "Vern is a big, powerful, mature young man who brings fine defensive and rebounding abilities to the Roadrunner basketball program. He can rebound with the best and is sound in fundamentals, considering he did not play high school basketball. He has learned quickly under fine tutelage of Coach Parks."

Madison Ex Picks UTSA

Robert Wallace, a 5'11" guard of Jimmy Jowers' Madison High School basketball team, has signed a scholarship to attend The University of Texas at San Antonio.

Wallace has been a starter at Madison for the last two years. He has been selected to play in the San Antonio High School All-Star game on June 6, and as a junior was named to the District 3A first team. Wallace averaged 17 points a game this season.

Coach Eddy says of Wallace, "He has the quickness and explosiveness we are looking for at the guard position. If Robert can master the details of the lead guard position he could become a quality NCAA Division I player."

Wallace also competed for Madison in track in the high jump and the long jump events. His best high jump was 6'6 1/4" and he participated in the regional track meet this year.

Wallace had a 3.0 grade point average at Madison and plans to major in business management at UTSA. He is the son of Bobby and Alice Higgs of San Antonio.

Heatstroke May Kill Pets Left In Cars

Last year's South Texas heat wave will be long remembered by many, and not necessarily just by the human inhabitants. The possibilities of illness and even death from overexposure to extreme heat is a danger to pets as well as their keepers.

Heatstroke has become a real danger for animals, according to Capt. (Dr.) Dennis Tooley, chief of Wilford Hall USAF Medical Center's Veterinary Public Health Service. Dogs and cats are the most susceptible since they don't perspire and are frequent passengers in automobiles, which is the most common place for heatstroke to occur in pets.

The inside of a car can become an oven when outside temperatures exceed 80 degrees with temperatures often reaching 120-140 degrees, explained Dr. Tooley. And, when the outside temperature climbs to 100 degrees or more, the temperature inside a car will easily reach 190-200 degrees. Animals exposed to these high temperatures, coupled with high humidity and inadequate ventilation, are prime candidates for heatstroke.

The time it takes to reach these deadly temperatures varies, Dr. Tooley continued. Darker-colored cars become hotter than light ones, while parking a car in the shade will obviously help cut down on the inside temperature. The common notion that cracking windows will protect a pet from heatstroke is a myth.

Treatment of heatstroke has to be immediate, the veterinarian emphasized. The animal should immediately be immersed in cold water from the neck down or sprayed with cold water. Whichever method is used, the pet's head should not get wet.

If heatstroke occurs in an automobile, take the animal to the nearest veterinary hospital for emergency treatment. If the animal's temperature is 104-105 degrees, reducing it with cold water will probably correct the problem if it is done properly. If the temperature is higher than that, hospitalization will also be necessary. During this time, intravenous fluid, corticosteroids and antibiotics are normally administered.

If the animal has had a body temperature of greater than 107 degrees for 20-30 minutes or more, treatment is usually futile, cautioned Dr. Tooley.

To help protect your animal against heatstroke, Dr. Tooley offered these preventive measures:

—During the hot months, don't leave pets in parked cars, or chained to trees or stakes. Provide adequate shade at home for them, and if they're caged, be sure there's adequate ventilation. Fresh water should be available at all times.

—If you're on vacation and take your pet, get the pet out of the car everytime you stop. If this isn't possible, park so you can see the pet at all times.

Wells Rise After Rains

Rainfall in April, particularly west and northwest of Bexar County, and reduced pumpage resulted in increases in water well levels throughout most of the Edwards Underground Water District, General Manager Tom Fox has announced.

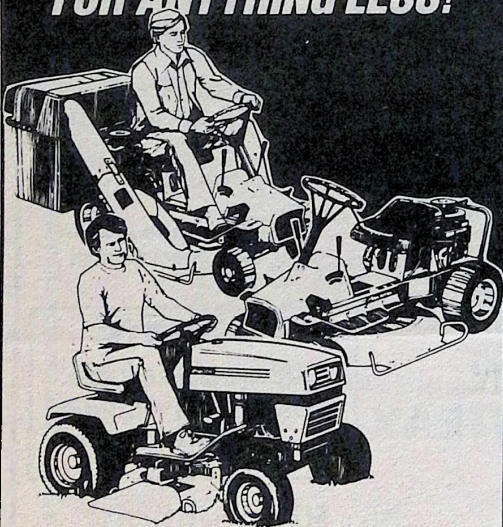
Except for New Braunfels, all well levels rose, although San Antonio's level went up only four-tenths of a foot at the end of the month. Comal Springs at New Braunfels showed no change, flowing the same 294 cubic feet per second that was recorded at the end of March. But San Marcos Springs rose 7.9 cfs to a flow of 138 cfs.

Average flow at New Braunfels is 285 cfs and is 138 cfs at San Marcos.

Following are the water well levels at the end of April shown in altitude above mean sea level, with the recorded highs in parentheses: Castroville: 702.2 feet, up 1.9 feet (737.8). Hondo: 732.6 feet, up 5.0 feet (773.8). San Antonio: 670.4 feet, up 0.4 foot (696.5).

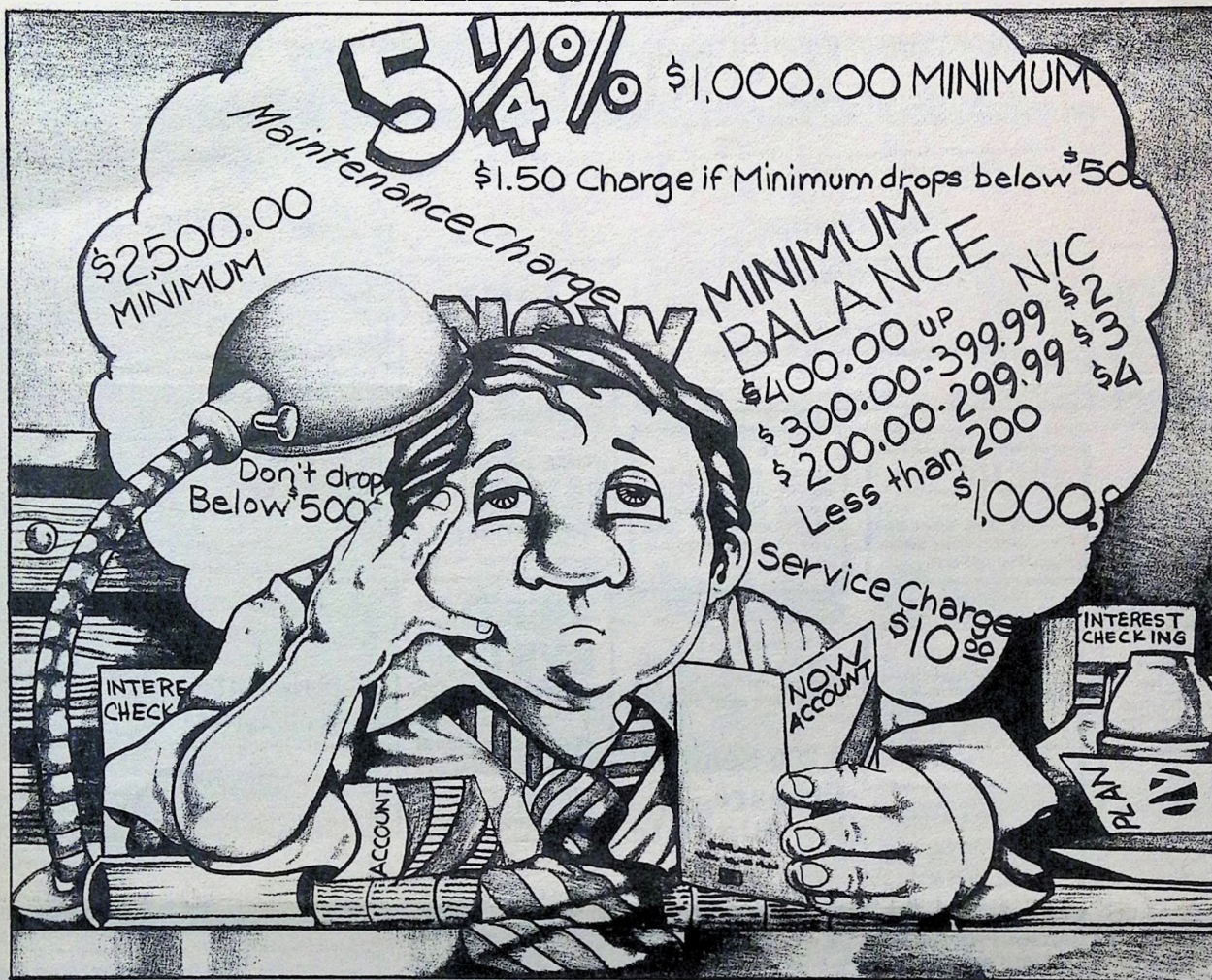

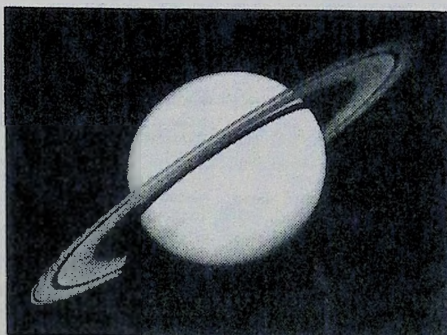

July To Bring SS Increase

William M. Archuleta, social security district manager in San Antonio announced that Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments will increase automatically by 11.2 percent beginning with the July checks.

"Under the law, Social Security and SSI checks increase automatically each year if the Consumer Price Index rises by 3 percent or more over a specified measuring period. Through this mechanism, the purchasing power of Social Security and SSI recipients is maintained despite inflation," Archuleta explained.

The average monthly Consumer Price Index rose by 11.2 percent from the first quarter of 1980 through the first quarter of 1981, the measuring period for the 1981 benefit increase. This increase results in an automatic 11.2 percent cost-of-living increase.

Archuleta's statement followed the announcement by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the March CPI increase. Calculation of the benefit increase was, according to the law, based on the CPI for urban wage earners and clerical workers.

The increase in social security benefits will be reflected in the checks to about 36 million beneficiaries. The SSI increase will go to about 4 million recipients.

The estimated fiscal year 1982 cost of the social security benefit increase to the trust funds is \$15.4 billion. The SSI increase will cost an estimated \$0.6 billion, paid from general funds of the Treasury.

Poisoning

Many accidental poisonings happen to children under the age of five because of their natural curiosity and tendency to put things into their mouths. Since being introduced in 1972, safety packaging has helped reduce the number of certain product poisonings by 56%. However, it's still vital to keep medications and other poisons out of reach of children and locked up.

Texas AG Receipts Down

Cash receipts from Texas agricultural products for 1980 should be just over \$10.0 billion, down about \$280 million from 1979. Still, it means some \$37 billion in economic activity generated in the state. The livestock sector, including dairy and poultry, generated \$5.7 billion in cash receipts, crops contributed 3.8 billion, and another \$633 million came from such agriculturally related areas as timber, horses, fish farming and hunting leases.

20% Offered Scholarships

Twenty percent (20%) of the 207 graduates of Central Catholic who receive their diplomas Sunday, May 24 at 8:00 p.m. have received at least one scholarship offer. Of the 96 scholarships offered to 41 graduates, two were awarded to National Merit Scholarship finalists and one to a National Merit Scholarship semi-finalist. All scholarships are based on scholastic merit except two which are athletic related. Three of the 41 recipients are National Achievement Scholars.

Non-Texas Colleges and Universities offering scholarships are Stanford (2), Yale, Princeton, Tulane (3), Northwestern, Notre Dame (2), Columbia, Marquette, Brown, Loyola, Vanderbilt, Vassar, Florida A & M and several others.

Central Catholic scholars received equal attention from U.T. (Austin) and St. Mary's U, each University offering six scholarships. Aggie Jokes notwithstanding, four Centralites chose to accept Engineering, Merit and Presidential Scholar awards from Texas A & M. Rice offered three scholar-

ships and both U of Dallas and Southern Methodist offered two, Baylor and Texas A & I settled for one each.

In addition to the six scholarships offered by St. Mary's, Trinity offered seven, Our Lady of the Lake, three, Incarnate Word, three and Texas Lutheran, two.

Military Academies have accepted four graduates: Two for the U.S. Air Force and two for the U.S. Army. Four ROTC scholarships (Navy—2; Marines—1; Air Force—1) have likewise been offered.

Scholarship Foundations and Organizations underwriting at least 14 scholarships are Baumberger Scholars, Knights of Columbus, Texas Church-Related Colleges, Ida V. Holland Scholarships, Bexar County Scholarship Clearing House, Republican Women's Club, San Antonio Junior Forum, and the Jack Burkitt Scholarship.

Prior to coaching at Jacksonville College, Gatewood served as head basketball coach at Killeen High School from 1975 to 1980. During the 1975-76 season his team was district champion, winning the most games and compiling the best record in the school's history. He had five straight 20-win seasons there.

Gatewood also was head basketball coach at Waco's University High School, where he was named coach of the year for the 1974-75 season. He coached the first district championship team in the school's history. With a record of 24-8, his team also set a school record for games won.

Gatewood played college ball at Baylor University, where he later served as freshman basketball coach. He was the second leading scorer in Baylor history and All-District 6 Regional All-American. A member of the 1967-68 Baylor Southwest Conference champion runner-up team, Gatewood was All Southwest Conference.

After graduating from Baylor, he signed with the Miami Floridians of the American Basketball Association.

The new Roadrunner assistant coach has a bachelor's degree from Baylor and a master's degree from Southwest Texas State University.
