Col. Crane's new development—which he is still perfecting—is called "All-weather Flitegag." He is a flight pioneer—honored many times for his contribution to aviation. He and the late Col. W. C. Ocker authored the first text on instrument flying and developed the first Link Trainer.

### Miss Helotes Election To Open 7th Festival

The curtain goes up on the 7th annual Helotes Spring Festival—better known as the Cornnyval—on Thursday, May 4, at 7:30 p.m. And by the time it goes down on Sunday, May 7, at midnight, many more than last year's 32,000 visitors and homefolks are expected to attend.

Larry Bergstrom, president of this year's event, has issued an invitation to everyone to attend and participate.

The first event—the Coronation of Miss Helotes 1972—will be held in the CCD Building of Our Lady of Guadalupe Church on Riggs Road in downtown Helotes, 1971 where the dance is held, are in Miss Helotes—Sharon Gorsuch—charge of this event.

Moore's Greater Shows will stage a carnival coinciding with the Festival and will be set up next to Floore's Country Store.

#### Parade and Booths

Saturday's opening event is a parade—which will include bands, floats, horses, bicycles, and a unique True West flavor—at 11 a.m. Primary voters can vote early and arrive in plenty of time by coming out Loop 410 and down Bandera to Helotes on Highway 16. The parade will wind through downtown Helotes on Bandera Highway beginning at Hausman

## Texas' Longest Trail Ride To Leave June 4

The second annual Six Flags Over Texas Trail Ride from Helotes to Arlington—282 miles—will be made June 4-21. It has been announced by Trail Boss Kitty Fischer. The first ride, last July, attracted national attention.

Persons interested in making the 1972 ride are invited to contact Mrs. Fischer at 695-3747 or Roy

McDonald, assistant trail boss, at 695-3324. The fee is \$35, with children under six free. All riders under 18 must be accompanied by a sponsor.

A kick-off dance at Floore Country Store on Saturday, June 3, will precede the early-morning departure of the riders from Helotes on June 4.

The route will be via Grey Forest, Leon Springs, Bergheim, of the Six Flags Over Texas

Marble Falls, Burnet, Lampasas, Evant, Hamilton, Hico, Glen Rose, Cleburne, and Burleson, with an average of 20 miles to be covered each day. It is the longest trail ride in Texas.

Entertainment is planned at the camping areas each night as well as a number of official receptions in towns the riders pass through. On June 20 the group will be guests of the Six Flags Over Texas

Kendalia, Blanco, Johnson City, amusement park in Arlington.

## Sheriff Extends Anti-Burglary Program To County Areas

Bexar County Sheriff Bil Hauck has announced that a program of Operation Identification for residents of the county, including the smaller towns and communities, will go into effect here by April 15. The program to fight crime—by identifying all portable possessions of the householders—is similar to one inaugurated recently within the city of San Antonio.

Sheriff Hauck said that those wanting to participate should call the sheriff's office and request use of an engraver for marking their possessions. Twenty-five engravers will be on loan at all times for marking items with the owner's driver's license or social security number.

When marking is completed, the engraver will be called for and each participant will be given a decal to place on the door of the home. The engravers are loaned with no fee, although they may also be bought from other sources, such as Holy Cross High School.

The decal will warn burglars

that all items are registered, Sheriff Hauck explained. 'Fences who deal with stolen goods are wary of easily identified property, and the market for burglarized goods virtually disappears, according to the sheriff. A card with each person's name and address and registration number will be on file at the sheriff's office.

Neighborhoods may work together for faster registration if they wish, he said further. This way the engravers can be passed from one neighbor to another before being returned.

Mrs. Ben (Ann) Primer, Jr., wife of a San Marcos physician, has filed for State representative, District 45 on the Republican ticket.

Mrs. Primer, mother of five, has been active in Hays County civic affairs, serving two terms on the Board of Education of the San Marcos Consolidated Independent School District. A graduate of the University of Texas School of Nursing, Mrs. Primer has for 12 years sponsored the Hays County Allied Health Career Club, which has helped many area youths choose medical careers.

In announcing, Mrs. Primer said, "My experience in the education and health fields would enable me to bring fresh ideas to a body not recently noted for original thinking. These two fields will need a great deal of attention, along with the four major pieces of legislation passed by the last session, which have been declared unconstitutional and must be rewritten."

Mrs. Primer will be in this area of Northwest Bexar County visiting eligible voters. "After winning the G.O.P. primary", she says she will "use a three-wheel bicycle transported on a pick-up truck" to visit the towns in the 45th District—Bandera, Blanco, Frio, Hays, Kendall, Medina and this area of Bexar County. The Republican candidate visited Helotes last week, and expressed interest in the unique growth situation of this community.

## Huppert Dies In Plane Crash

The crash of a light plane on the side of a hill on the P. G. Northrup Ranch north of Pipe Creek on March 27 resulted in the death of Donald J. Huppert of San Antonio, president of Jack Huppert Chemical Co. Huppert, 34, was alone in the twin-engine plane.

Huppert was pronounced dead at the scene by Justice of the Peace Ed Jennings of Pipe Creek. Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Anne Swan Huppert, his mother, Mrs. Jack Huppert, two daughters, and a sister.

The Federal Aviation Administration was investigating the accident.

## Maps Tell Who Votes For Whom

New maps showing boundaries of Sections A, B, C, and D of Precinct 255—vast northwest Bexar County voting precinct which includes Helotes and all the surrounding area—have been placed in the office of the Helotes Echo through the courtesy of Mrs. Patric McDonald, unopposed Republican nominee for precinct chairman in 255-A, and may be checked by voters at any time.

Voters residing in 255-A and 255-B will vote for candidates for the state legislature from Legislative District 49, which extends from Hays County (San Marcos) through Medina County (Hondo), and voters residing in 255-C and 255-D will vote for candidates from District 57-H (part of Bexar County), Mrs. McDonald said.

Revised voter registration slips to be mailed from the office of Bexar County Tax Assessor-Collector Charles Davis are supposed to show in which portion of Precinct 255 each voter resides.

The first elections involving the new subdivisions of Precinct 255 will be the Democratic and Republican primaries on May 6.



GREY FOREST good citizen Paul Doerr, Scenic Loop Road, was one of 122 citizens who cast votes in the municipal election on April 1 to elect a mayor and two city councilmen. Winners were Rev. Sam L. Terry, mayor, and H. A. Mikel and Sherwood Nelson, re-elected councilmen. The Northside school board election was held the same day. Coming up on May 6 are the Democratic and Republican primaries for county, state, and national offices.

## Write-ins Boom In Grey Forest

Rev. Sam L. Terry was elected mayor of Grey Forest and H. A. Mikel and Sherwood Nelson were returned as councilmen in the city

election held April 1. Rev. Terry received 76 votes and his losing opponent, Milton James, 45 votes. Rev. Terry succeeds incumbent Mayor C. O. Brown, who did not seek re-election.

Mikel received 86 votes for councilman and Nelson, 79 votes. A total of 122 votes were cast. Election judge was Mrs. Rimmon Ham, assisted by Mrs. Edwin Faust and Chief of Police Dee McKay.

The surprise of the election was the large number of write-in candidates, nine in all. Edwin L. Faust, former councilman, received three write-in votes for mayor and nine write-in votes for councilman. Seven other persons received write-in votes for councilman. They were C. O. Brown 2, Bruce Faust 3, Ed Scharf 3, T. T. Allee 1, Gary Prejean 2, Rimmon Ham 1, and Charles Dreyer 1.

The new mayor and returning councilmen will be sworn in at a special meeting of the Grey Forest city council Friday, April 7, at 7:30 p.m.

In uncontested bids for re-election in Leon Valley on April 1 incumbent Mayor Vernon Schuchardt, Place 2 Councilman Rayford Lewis, and Councilman James Hageman were returned to office.

## Include 4 In Texas

U. S. Attorney William S. Sessions said that the inclusion of Austin and San Antonio on the list of 33 "target cities" where Federal Drug Abuse Law Enforcement teams will operate is "good news for our communities and bad news for the heroin pushers."

Special Assistant Attorney General Myles J. Ambrose, appointed by President Nixon to head the newly-created Office of Drug Abuse Law Enforcement in the Department of Justice, announced the list of 33 "target cities" in Washington. Four Texas cities on the list are Austin, San Antonio, Dallas and Houston.

For the first time, federal and local law enforcement personnel will be working together as actual team members. The objective is to use their combined resources to take the heroin pushers off the streets," Sessions said.

April 30 will mark the kick-off for the National Safety Council's first annual National Defensive Driving Week, April 30 through May 6.

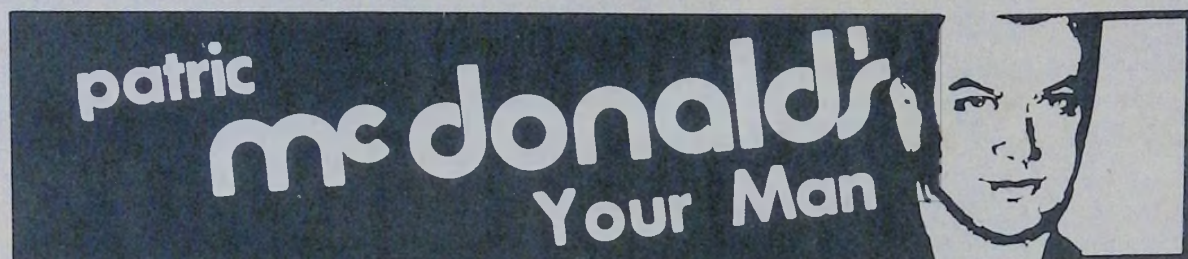
