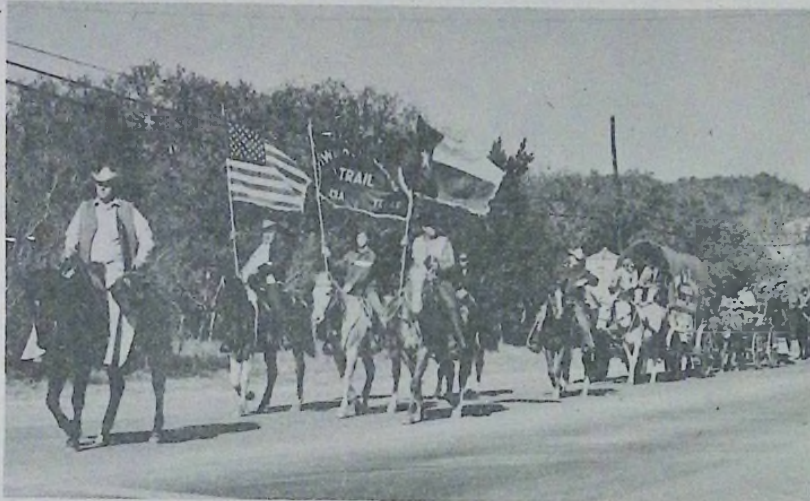

Livestock Show-time went local in 1974 complete with an auction.

Two hundred livestock entries were judged, and many commanded excellent prices for the first time in this area for young future farmers and 4-H members who spent hours bringing their entries into peak condition.

Following a foggy Friday, Saturday dawned bright and warm—and the first annual John Marshall Future Farmers of America Livestock Show and Auction had all the extra it took to make the event Jan. 25-26 a huge success. The sale was one of the first for juniors in the County, and answered a need for this area in

encouraging livestock raising.

The Babcock Road site of the new Show Barn was teeming with contestants and spectators as well as buyers. A barbecue was held also toward the close of the auction.

Crowds filled the balconies, the main floor, and others waited patiently and good naturedly for their turn to get a place inside. Bill Shomette acted as auctioneer.

Grand champion of the show was a 1,005-pound Charolais steer shown by Marshall FFA Darlene Roemer, which took honors the week before at the Bexar County

Stacey Enters District 57th Race



John E. Stacey, a retired Air Force officer, property owner, and businessman, filed Monday at Democratic headquarters as a candidate for the State Representative seat in District 57H being vacated by Representative Wayland Simmons.

Stacey, a native Texan, has lived with his family in San Antonio since 1950. He has been active in fraternal, business, and veterans organizations. He is a member of Alzafar Shrine, the Founder Lions Club of San Antonio, American Legion, and Air Force Association. He has worked for oil companies, banks, and real estate, insurance, and automobile businesses.

He is law enforcement oriented and was Chief of Security and Law Enforcement during his 24 years in the Army and Air Force. Among the places he served were Randolph Air Force Base, Lackland Air Force Base, and throughout the Pacific area with U. S. Air

Force Security Service. He is a veteran of World War II, Korea, and Viet Nam.

Stacey's platform is one of honesty and accountability in government. He feels that governmental action should be responsive to the people and that people should be kept informed. He advocates a quality education in the public school system and an upgrading of all public schools as well as an extensive adult education program. He stated that the Legislature in which he will serve will determine the future of education and its financing. He opposes a state income tax that would be paid by the already overtaxed consumer. He considers the energy crisis and the cost increase of natural gas in San Antonio as a crime against the aged, the poor, the people on fixed incomes as well as the average citizens.

Stacey and his wife, the former Virginia Allred, live at 6042 Sun Dance Lane in Thunderbird Hills. They have two daughters, one is a Capt. in the U. S. Air Force and the other a college student.

Stacey named Curtis L. Drawhorn, principal of Jackson Keller Elementary School, as his campaign manager.

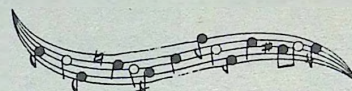
Deadline Reached

Trustees Consider Plans For New Schools

Northside Independent School District's Board of Trustees took action, at the January session, on construction programs to accommodate the projected increased enrollment.

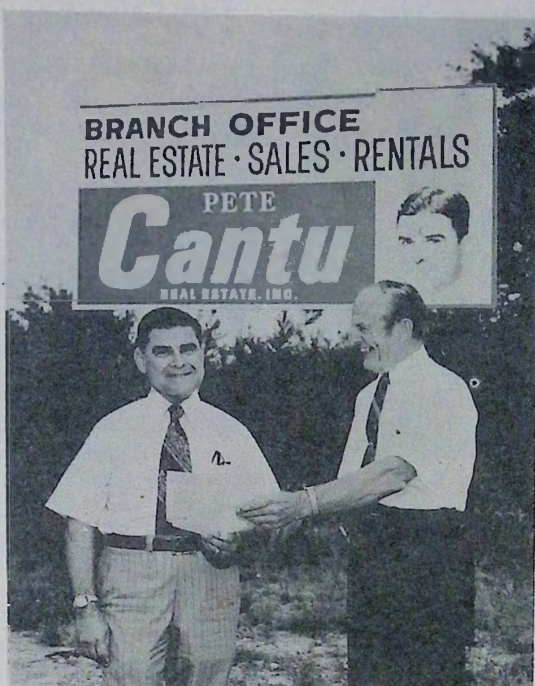
Architects Noonan and Krockner were authorized to let for bidding, the re-design of additions to Sul Ross Middle School. Bids will be opened March 7 at 7 p.m. at District Central Office, 5900 Evers Road.

Trustees voted to name the middle school being constructed at Hunt Lane and Potranco Road, Elisha Marshall Pease (pronounced "peace") Middle School, in honor of a former governor of Texas. Pease Middle School will open this Fall.

Peter Callins Architects were named to design plans for another middle school, to be built northwest of Marshall High School.

Superintendent E. D. Cody remarked on the District's action to secure the safety of elementary school children facing dark mornings due to implementation of nation-wide daylight savings time. Northside schools are now starting classes one-half hour later than usual.

Cody and the Board commended Northside principals who worked beyond the "call of duty" to help children crossing streets in the pre-dawn darkness.

School To Honor Governor Pease

The Board of Trustees, Northside Independent School District, has officially voted to name a middle school currently being constructed in northwest Bexar County, Elisha Marshall Pease Middle School.

According to NISD Board policy, new junior high and middle schools are to be named for Texas governors who made a significant contribution to education in the State.

Pease, who held two-and-one-half terms in the State House, established the free public school system during his administration, and provided state support to institutions for the blind, deaf and mentally retarded.

He fought in the first skirmish of the Texas Revolution, Battle of Gonzales. He carried Texas through two years of harsh Reconstruction trials following the Civil War.

Gov. Pease died in 1883, after he retired from public service to become vice-president of the Austin National Bank.

The recommendation of Pease

as a name for Northside's new school was offered by the Hobby Middle School history class taught by Mrs. Mae Orrick.

The new school, planned for opening this Fall, will include central facilities for 1600 students, grades six through eight.

Man's best friend generally speaking is very satisfied with the arrangement of getting his folks off to work, guarding them in their sleep, playing with the children and going for rides.

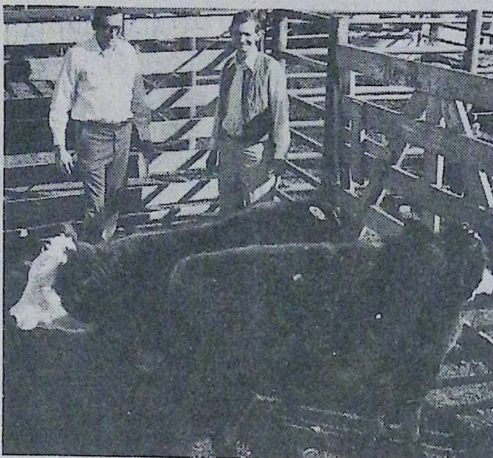
What we do for him, he takes for granted, and usually the arrangement can't be beat for both sides.

Hondo—State Rep. John H. Poerner posted a \$500 filing fee with the State Democratic Executive Committee in Austin

Thursday, January 31 to confirm his entry into the 21st U. S. Congressional race.

Poerner said he paid the filing fee with proceeds from the sale of two calves, raised on his ranch, to emphasize his agricultural background and the need for a Congressman who understands the farming and ranching problems of the district.

"The Bexar County portion of the district, as well as the other 31 counties, is dependent on agriculture, which makes it imperative that citizens have a Congressman familiar with the urban and rural problems of the district," Poerner said.

The legislator's two calves weighed a total of 1,010 pounds and brought a price of \$54.25 per hundred, more than enough to cover the required filing fee.

25 Leadership Teams To Convene

The U. S. Office of Education regional center at Trinity University will conduct the last training cycle of its current program year at Lost Valley

Ranch, Bandera, Texas, February 4-13.

Twenty-five community drug abuse prevention teams, including 22 from Texas, two from Oklahoma, and one from Colorado, are scheduled to attend.

The Trinity Center is one of eight regional resource centers in the nationwide "Help Communities Help Themselves" drug abuse prevention project, serving eight Southwestern states.

Teams to be trained are made up of five to seven volunteers each who will assess needs and resources for drug abuse prevention programs in their hometown, said Center Director James D. Kazen.

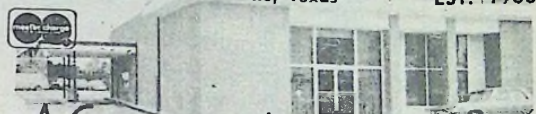

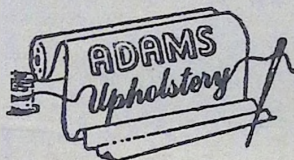

We show how to make a home beautiful and safe at the same time, using rooms by famous interior designers to illustrate." Flammable fabric fires alone take a toll of 5,000 deaths and 500,000 serious injuries every year, and says Dr. Holloway, "These casualties are preventable."

Arts Foundation Names Officers

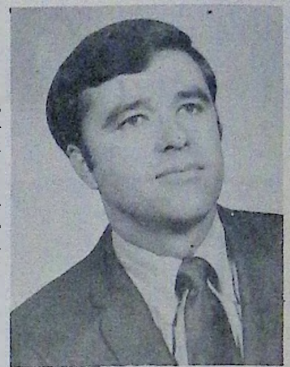
