Voters To Decide On November 14

Trustees of Northside Independent School Board voted unanimously to authorize a school construction bond election Tuesday, November 14. Trustees endorsed the recommendations of a 20-member Citizens Advisory Committee citiga a need for \$25

Committee, citing a need for \$25 million in bonds to be sold during the next four years.

According to Northside Supt. Ed Cody, 91 percent of the building bond funds will be used to build classrooms. Four percent is for remodeling existing older facilities, and five percent is for expanding the District maintenance facility, bus garage, and warehouse, and construction of a multi-use center.

Crowded classroom conditions currently exist in the District of 32,000 students, he said. Classrooms to be built include five new elementary schools, one new middle school, additions to four schools and conversion of some classrooms for special education student

Following growth predictions, a spokesman said, 40 percent of the homes built in the San Antonio Metroplex in the past six months are located in Northside ISD. Three thousand new homes were built in the District last year, and 2,000 the previous previous year. Student enrollment grows at the rate of one elementary school per year. Temporary classrooms are currently in use on thirteen school campuses.

In adopting the bond election

order, Trustees emphasized the sound financial condition of Northside District. No increase in taxes will be necessary to repay the \$25 million issue, they said. The District has reduced the tax rate 31 cents per \$100 value in the last two years, they

YOUR GARDEN

Controlling Pests

The main enemies of any plants appear to be pests (especially insects) and diseases like fungi. Fortunate-ly, most of them can be controlled.

Research workers are turn-Research workers are turning to biological methods of control, using natural parasites or predators to kill pests. For example, Japanese beetles can often be controlled with bacteria. Ladybird beetles are natural predators, sold in bulk to cat aphids and mites.



Most gardeners, however, consider the most sensible approach is to use approved chemical controls in appropriate situations.

One of the latest authorities
on good gardening, the
Reader's Digest Illustrated
Guide to Gardening, an easyto-read, profusely illustrated
guide available at bookstores,
suggests that you watch erons guide available at bookstores, suggests that you watch crops known to be susceptible, apply chemicals only when you actually see the pest or disease and confine treatment to the infested plant and its closest neighbors. Always be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions.




Bestfest participants also may compete in root beer chuga-lug, jalapeno-eating and cowchip throwing contests and sack

Festival Assn. Donates 2,000 To Fire Dept.




Noting the need for community support of the Helotes Area Volunteer Fire Dept., the Helotes Spring Festival Assn. recently voted to donate proceeds from the Cornyval '78 in the amount of \$1800 to buy needed equipment and \$200 more to aid the junior firefighters' of Explorer Post 401 in their volunteer work

Chauffe presented the Festival officials with an itemized list of equipment totaling \$1775.93 which is being bought with the donated Festival funds. These items included chiefly hardware fittings for the new pumper, such as turbojet nozzles, valves, and strainers. Chauffe noted that with the above hardware, the pumper will be fully certified for 750 GPM delivery up to 500 feet from a hydrant. The Explorer's will use the \$200 for planned additions to their equipment, it was reported.

Check

Fire Hazards Careless citizens, who permit

unsafe conditions to exist in their homes, are the target of a fire safety check list campaign

now underway.

Fire fighting authorities contend thousands of homes both in the city and outlying suburbs could go up in smoke without warning because of these hazards.

Major causes of fire listed by officials are careless use of matches and cigarettes, defective electrical appliances, faulty heating and cooking devices and untidy housekeeping habits such as storing rags, paper and flam-mable liquids near water heaters and stoves.

A joint appeal to all citizens to search out and eliminate fire hazards has been issued by the fire chiefs of San Antonio and Bexar County suburban communities

Backing up their appeal, the Independent Insurance Agents of San Antonio have printed 125,000 fire safety check lists, pin-pointing 21 of the most prevalent causes of fires in this

Murray Hacker, chairman of organization's safety committee, urges every homeowner to obtain a copy of the check list and correct all unsafe conditions on their premises.

Hacker said the check list will be available at all fire stations, including the Helotes area Volunteer Fire Department and Leon Valley and Grey Forest
