

Mac Biggs, UTSA grounds maintenance supervisor, said currently in San Antonio only UTSA and USAA use the coarse, blue-green grass for landscaping "We use buffalo grass at UTSA because it saves money on mowing, fertilizer and water," Biggs explained. "Its root system goes three to four feet into the ground, making it drought tolerant, and it doesn't grow as high as carpet grass, so it's mowed less frequently."

Biggs explained that the grass is native to the nation's short grass prairie, which stretches from Canada, through Wyoming Colorado, the Oklahoma penhandia and Central Trauma panhandle and Central Texas to Mexico.


