Chris Marrou To Be Parade Marshal



Council To Canvas Election Results Monday Night

The Helotes City Council meeting Thursday night, on the eve of the city elections, was short and low-key.

The main announcement at the meeting was that the votes in Saturday's election will be canvassed during a special council meeting Monday night, April 8, at the city hall, and the new mayor and council members will be sworn in at the next regular meeting on Thursday, April 18.

The council also heard a report from Lt. Larry L. Perez on activities of the Helotes Police Department. Twenty-eight calls were handled by the department last month. Seven were for burglar alarms that had gone off and could not be stopped because the residents were not home, a problem that has bothered the department for many months.

The department answered four calls for wanted persons and three to assist an officer. Other calls involved check fraud, criminal mischief, disturbance, threats, found property and reckless damage.

The new police car ordered by the council from McCombs Ford two months ago has not been received, Lt. Perez said. It would be a second patrol car for the department.

By resolution, the council approved a joint project with the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation to install new traffic signs throughout the city, at a cost of approximately \$2,000.

The council also approved the city court clerk, Judy Reichardt, to attend a court clerk certification course in Fort Worth in June, at no cost to the city.

Chris Marrou, popular Channel 5 news editor and Eyewitness News anchorman, has accepted an invitation to be Grand Marshal of the 1985 Cornyval Parade, according to Bill Stein, special events chairman of the 1985 Cornyval.

Marrou is expected to arrive in Helotes shortly before the parade starts at 11 a.m. on Saturday morning, May 4, in the Channel 5 helicopter. The helicopter will land in a field near the start of the parade on Highway 16 at Leslie Road if arrangements can be completed with the property owner.

Honorary Grand Marshal of the Parade will be Darrel McCall, nationally-known Country and Western singer who frequently appears in Helotes at Floore Country Store.

Michelle Moorad, chairman of the 1985 Miss Helotes Pageant and Coronation, announced Wednesday that 23 girls have turned in applications

for the Miss Helotes competition. The Pageant and Coronation will be held Wednesday, May 1, beginning at 7 p.m., at the Community Activities Center of Our Lady of Guadalupe Church.

After the coronation, the annual Helotes festival will continue on Friday night and all day Saturday and Sunday, with free street dances, a carnival, street booths, and a variety of entertainment including the Gunfighters and Sahawe Indian dancers.

The Cornyval is sponsored annually on the first weekend in May by the Helotes Festival Association, a non-profit civic organization.

During April the association will meet each Monday night at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church, beginning at 7:30 p.m., to complete preparations for the 1985 celebration. Everybody is welcome at these meetings, said Don Reddout, 1985 president.

The weather has been perfect. Cool nights and mornings, sunny afternoons with temperatures in the 70's. The wildflowers, especially bluebonnets, are thick and profuse. Easter weekend should bring everybody outside to enjoy and rejoice.

Voters To Be Busy Saturday

Elections will take the spotlight, Saturday, April 6, when city elections will be held in Helotes, Grey Forest and Leon Valley, a school board election will be held throughout the Northside District, and a board of directors election will be held in Bexar County Water Control and Improvement District No. 17.

Thirty-nine absentee ballots had been cast in the Helotes city election when absentee voting ended Tuesday, said Judy Reichardt, city secretary. This was a big jump over the five absentee ballots cast in last year's city election.

On the Helotes city ballot are one candidate for Mayor and three incumbent City Council members running for re-election. Mrs. Vivian Hultz is the candidate for Mayor and the council member candidates are James (Gene) Brigman, Reudy Loeffler and Verna Thompson. They are unopposed.

A write-in campaign for Mayor is

being conducted by Guy Murray against Mrs. Hultz.

The other two Helotes City Council members, Leonard Hill and Niels Jensen, have another year on their terms.

In Grey Forest, voters will fill four City Council posts, only one of which is contested. That is the race for the Place 2 post between David Galvan and Clifford Noll. For the other three posts the candidates are: Beverly Boudreau, for re-election in Place 1; Donald Zook, who filed to succeed his wife in Place 3; and Cynthia North, who filed to succeed Peggy Sassaman in Place 5.

In the Northside District school election voters will choose two board members. Four candidates seek the Place 1 post—Howard Atwell, Nancy Collins, LaVerne Griffin and Joyce Hendrix. Three candidates seek the Place 2 post—Harry Cunningham, who is the incumbent, and Connie Salinas and

Roland Cadena.

In the Bexar County Water Control and Improvement District No. 17 election, three candidates are unopposed for three directors' posts to be filled. Two candidates are incumbents, Norris Henly and Jim Armstrong. The third is Harry Sherblom.

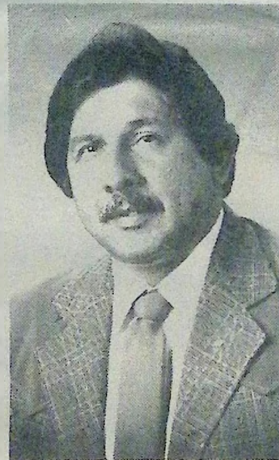

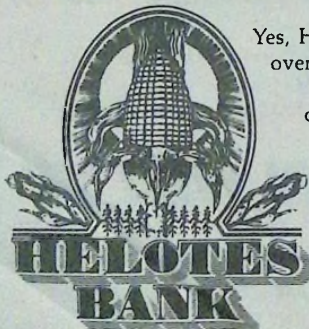

Firefighters Also Provide Medical Aid

Members of the Helotes Area Volunteer Fire Department do more than assist resident with fire emergencies—they answer medical emergencies as well. Firefighters who elect to can take training to proceed as far as the rank of Paramedic, which is the highest a person can go in emergency medical training in the state of Texas.

There are three levels of skill in the Texas licensing system. An Emergency Care Attendant (ECA) undergoes forty hours of emergency and basic life support training. An Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) takes 120 hours of classroom training, in addition to riding with EMS on emergency runs and

spending time in hospital emergency rooms. A Paramedic trains 400 hours in advanced first aid skills and cardiac life support.

The Helotes Area VFD include five ECA's, four EMT's and two Paramedics, who respond to medical emergencies at the request of either EMS or the party involved. Helotes response can be much quicker than EMS which, even if a unit is available, has to come from many miles away. This time saved can be critical in an emergency situation.

So for quickest response in a medical or fire emergency, call Bexar County Fire Alarm at 828-3939, and a Helotes Unit will be dispatched along with EMS.

Aquifer Rises, Streams Flow

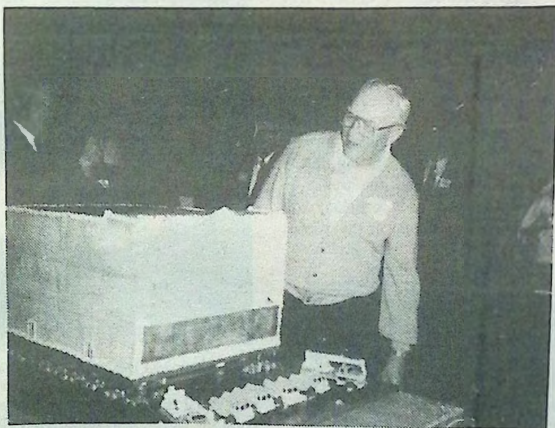
The Edwards Aquifer rose a significant 6.3 feet at the end of February to a level of 658.0 feet. Last year at the end of February it stood at 652.6 feet.

The Frio, Dry Frio and Sabinal rivers and Seco and Hondo creeks are showing increases in flows, according to an Edwards Underground Water District report.

The directors of the District adopted a resolution opposing amendments to the Safe Drinking Water Act, now proposed in Congress, which would bring federal involvement into management of the Aquifer. They believe this to be a state and local responsibility.

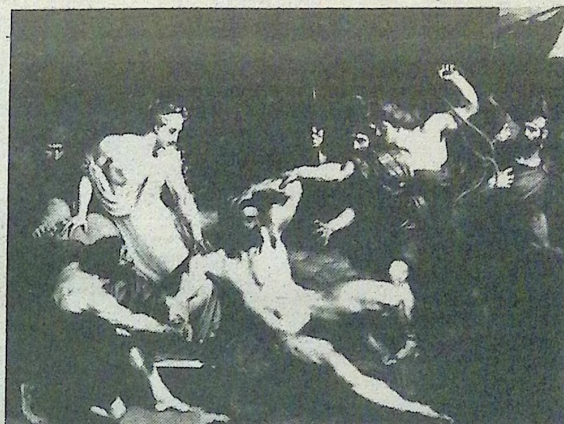

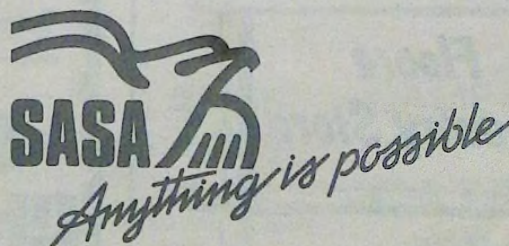

William Garbade, SDHPT supervising resident engineer in charge of the work, estimated that with favorable weather, the improvements should be completed by February, 1986.

THE CHEST PAIN THAT ISN'T A HEART ATTACK

One of the more frequent complaints doctors hear is that of chest pain. The patient is usually male, middle-aged or older, somewhat overweight, and a smoker. He may have just eaten a big meal or lifted something heavy, but often the pain appears after lying down. Heart trouble? Probably not, though this must not be ruled out. Chances are it's the heartburn of esophageal reflux.

This happens when gastric acid, a normal and healthy part of the stomach juices, flows upward out of the stomach into the esophagus. Now this part of our anatomy just isn't built to withstand acid. The lining becomes raw and irritated, causing a burning, cramping, intermittent pain behind the breastbone. It can be severe enough to simulate a heart attack, and even cause changes in the electrocardiogram that have nothing to do with the heart.

The cause of this unpleasant phenomenon is a weak puckering valve (technically, the lower esophageal sphincter) at the bottom end of the esophagus, just before it enters the stomach. In health, this valve is closed at all times except when we swallow; this keeps the acid in the stomach where it belongs and prevents its reflux. But sometimes the valve doesn't work properly, with the end result of chest pain.

Reflux heartburn is common, afflicting almost a third of those past middle age. Some are hit harder than others, or more or less often than others, depending on such things as hiatus hernia or heavy lifting. It's worse after lying down because...tilt...gravity lets the stomach acid run through the loose valve into the esophagus. Moral: do not eat before retiring; go to bed with an empty stomach!

Treatment consists of neutralizing acid with any of a host of antacids (Maalox, Riopan, Gelusil, etc.) at the time of the attack. For those who are bothered sufficiently frequently or severely, prescription drugs may be in order. The production of acid in the stomach is markedly reduced by Tagamet or Zantac; if there's less acid, there'll be less heartburn, obviously. Reglan, of recent use in this problem, has a unique dual action: it tightens the lower esophageal valve to make a more effective barrier to the reflux of acid, and hastens the emptying of the stomach into the small intestine.

If you suffer recurrent chest pain, get it checked out. It's probably not your heart but acid reflux making your esophagus rebel. And a lot can be done to offer consistent relief. See your doctor!

Chamber Reports Building Is Up

Building permit figures are up in Bexar County in almost every category compared with December, according to the Greater San Antonio Chamber of Commerce's Economic Analysis Panel. The exceptions were dollar valuations of residential permits and the number of multi-family units. The city appears to be recovering from the slump in December, when all categories showed decreased from the previous month. The most significant increase was in the number of single-family units permitted; the January figure rose 85.5% from December. Another significant increase (77.7%) was in the dollar valuation of non-residential permits.

Comparing January's figures to the same month last year, the total number of permits decreased 3.5%. All other decreases were in resi-

dential. Non-residential permits increased very slightly—.8%—and dollar valuation of non-residential rose 229% from last January.

Construction activity is expected to slow somewhat this year from the previous two year's tremendous growth. Consequently, employment in the construction area is expected to show the same slow down.

Preliminary estimates of office building space for end-of-year 1984 show 12 million square feet of existing Class A space. Approximately 1.9 million square feet was absorbed last year which is up noticeably from the previous two years.

Retail absorption looked better in 1984 than it has in 10 years. Retail was the most favorable area of real estate last year. From January to June of last year, occupancy was

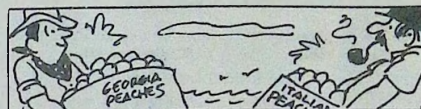

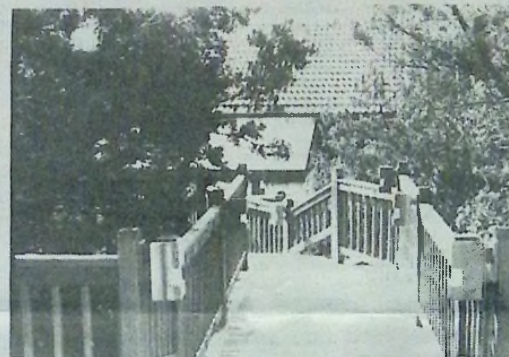
