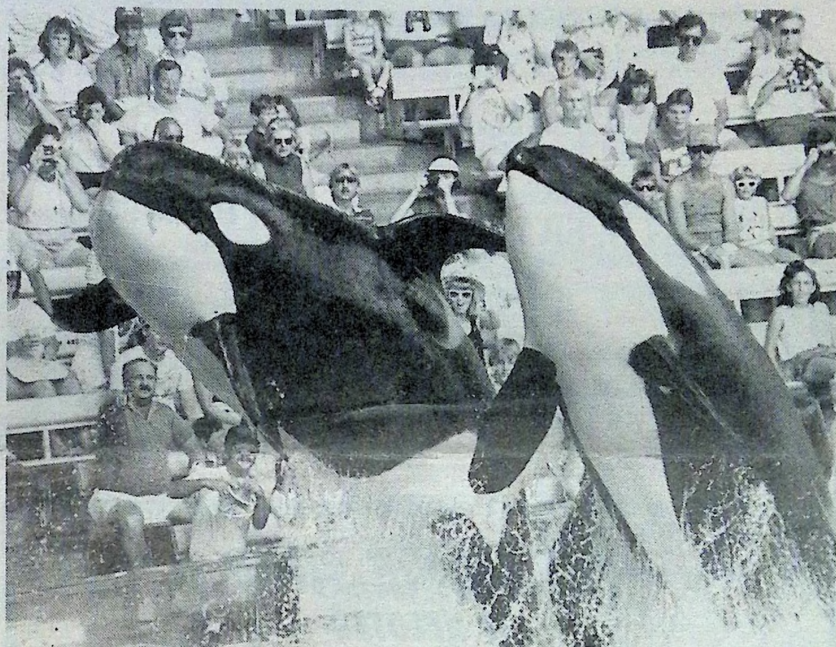
★ Sea World Makes Splash ★



Non-marine attractions include the Garden of Flags, the Texas Walk with 18 new bronze life-size statues of famous Texans, a one-acre United States map, Cap'n Kids World and Cypress Gardens West.



The Penguin Exhibit presents six species of penguins and other birds from the Arctic and Antarctic. At the nearby Reef Presentation is a 400,000 gallon shark tank. Sea World will be open year-around from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. or later on special days — such as its Grand Opening.

Other marine mammal shows feature performances by a variety of whales, dolphins, walruses, sea lions and otters. 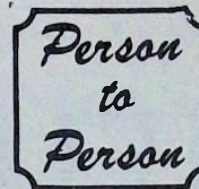

UTSA Looks For Athletic Director

Dr. James W. Wagener, president of The University of Texas at San Antonio, has announced that a search for a new director of intercollegiate athletics for The University will begin immediately.

A screening committee will be named to review applications for the position and will include representatives from the university administration, faculty, alumni and student body. Dean Dwight Henderson, Chairman of the University Committee on Athletics, will serve as chairman of the screening committee. It is anticipated that the search will be completed prior to the end of the summer so that the new athletic director may be in place before the fall semester begins.

Mr. Jim Skaines, who had been serving as Acting Athletic Director since July, 1985, has indicated his desire to relinquish his duties as Acting Athletic Director effective May 31, 1988 and he will not be a candidate for the new position. Mr. Skaines will return to the position of Associate Athletic Director.

In making this announcement, Dr. Wagener said, "I appreciate Jim Skaines' willingness to serve in this interim role. He will continue to make important contributions to the intercollegiate athletic program in his role as associate director.

Because of Mr. Skaines' decision to step down as acting athletic director at the end of May, Mr. Ernest DeWinne, UTSA Business Manager, who has also been serving as Athletic Business Manager, will assume additional responsibilities of the Interim Athletic Director until the new director is named, hopefully, during the month of August.

Foster Parents To Be Trained

The Texas Department of Human Services will hold an orientation for all persons interested in becoming foster parents on June 2 at 7:00 p.m. at the Pickwell Building, 3635 S.E. Military Drive.

Foster homes for abused and neglected children are needed until it is safe for them to return home.

Foster parents must be at least 21 years old, single or married at least 2 years, and able to make at least a 6-month commitment to a child. Working couples or singles, retirees, and military personnel are accepted. Foster parents may choose the age group and sex of the child.

Financial assistance and medical/dental care for the children is provided. Foster parents need no minimum income to qualify.

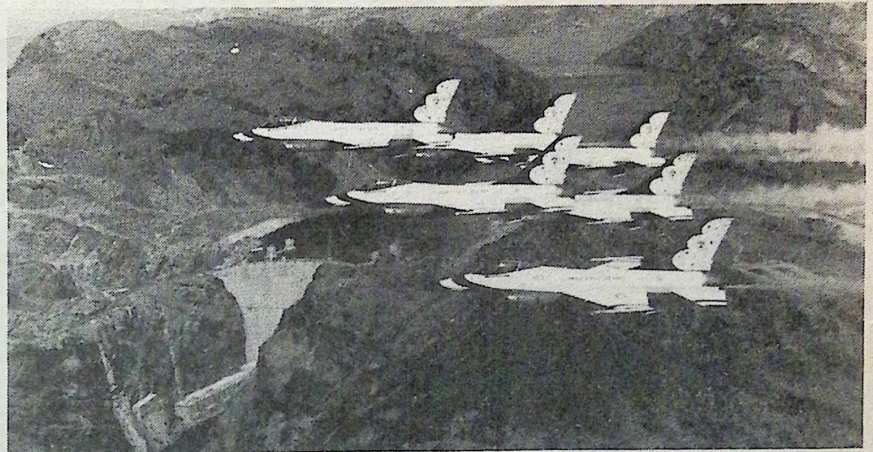

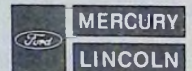
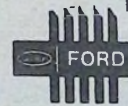
