Mary Jo Sterzenback and Nancy Fulk are two new members of the Grey Forest Planning and Zoning Commission, elected recently by the city council.



Rabid Skunk Killed Here

A skunk which later was confirmed to have rabies was killed in the Helotes Park Estates area this week. It was fighting with two dogs. The hody was preserved in ice and delivered to the rabies control center, where the diagnosis of rabies was made.

The two dogs have been given a rabies booster shot and quarantined for observation.

All area residents are cautioned to beware of any skunks they see, particularly skunks which come out in the daytime. All pets should be vaccinated.

Rate Not Set By Northside District

Big increases in the new assessed value of properties in the Helotes area prepared by the tax assessor's office for Northside School District have caused widespread concern in the area.

Norris Henley, Northside tax appraiser, made two appearances before local groups to explain the district's position. One was before the Grey Forest city council and most recently before a meeting of the Helotes Park Homeowners Association.

Henley said the district has been conducting a reappraisal program for the past five years, with one-fifth of the district being appraised each year. The Helotes area was the last to be surveyed, which gave this area the benefit of lower taxes during the reappraisal process than those paid by other areas, he said.

However, Helotes properly owners believe that this same time lag created a major inequity in that the sections appraised early are now at values close to 50 percent lower than the Helotes area.

The 1979 school tax rate has not been set by the district because it is waiting to know the total district valuations and the amount of money to be needed to run the schools. But based on the new assessments of property values, taxes on Helotes property owners could be 60 to 300 percent higher this year, according to a Homeowners Association spokesman.

"This despite previous indications by Ed Cody (superintendent of Northside) that passage of a recent bond issue would not necessitate an increase in taxes," he said.

Henley told the group that he believes the large increase in valuations, brought about by the reappraisals and by the addition of Ingram Park Mall to the tax base, will result in a substantial reduction in the new tax rate to be announced soon. Approximately \$100 million value has been added to the tax rolls, he said.


Beginning next year there will be one appraisal board for the entire county, and a complete reappraisal is to be made by that board by 1981.

The Homeowners Association has asked the Northside district tax office to equalize all assessments in the district now. The request was referred to the district's board of equalization.



Altenheim Gets Marker

A Texas Historical Commission Marker has been unveiled at the Hermann Sons Home for the Aged on "Altenheim Hill" near Comfort. The marker, which has been affixed to a stone base in the garden of the overlooking the Guadalupe River valley, states:

"Hermann Sons Home for the Aged. A fraternal group, originally for persons of German descent, the Sons of Hermann grew rapidly after the founding of the first Texas lodge in 1860-61. At a meeting in Austin in 1913, members voted to establish a home for the aged, to be called 'Altenheim.' This was one of the first homes for the aged started by a fraternal group in Texas.

"The citizens of Comfort raised \$7,000 to buy this 202acre tract for the facility. Lodge members from around the state contributed funds for the construction of a limestone building in 1915-16."

A number of officers from the Grand Lodge of the Sons of Hermann attended, among them Grand Trustee Ottmar E. Vogel of San Antonio, who attended the dedication of the home as a boy 63 years ago.

Louis B. Engelke, grand president of the 76,000-member fraternal order, said there are 59 resident-members of the Hermann Sons at the home. Most of them are in their 80s

and some are in their 90s.

Engelke explained, "Their membership is enabling them to spend their twilight years at the home. The order is required by law to provide life insurance for its members, and, after reaching age 70, the member my apply for residence at the home. If in good health at time of application and if approved by the Home for the Aged Committee, they may receive a remaining lifetime of residence there for an admission fee of \$200 and making the home the beneficiary of their fir 1 \$1,000 Hermann Sons insurance.

One woman has been at the Home for the Aged for 27 years on \$1,000. This is believed to he the all-time record.




