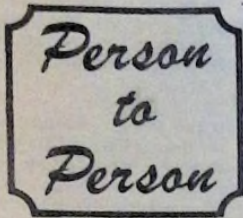

## New Tax Rate To Be 14½ Cents



### Trailwalk Underway Saturday

Hundreds of visitors are expected to be drawn to this area this weekend for the Grey Forest 4th International Trailwalk.

Trailhead for the walk will be the Scenic Loop Playground clubhouse. Participants may begin any time Saturday or Sunday between 7 a.m. and 2 p.m. for the short walk (10 kilometers), and any time between 7 a.m.

and 11 a.m. for the medium walk (20 kilometers). All participants may walk or run at their own pace, but all must finish no later than 5 p.m. each day.

Both breakfast and lunch will be available at the clubhouse, and food and drinks also will be available at locations along the two routes.

### Passage Set For Thursday

Mayor Frank Thompson and the Helotes City Council are expected to adopt a property tax rate of 14½ cents per \$100 valuation at the council meeting next Thursday, Oct. 13.

Mayor Thompson said he would recommend the 14½ cents rate after a public hearing was held Thursday night, Oct. 6, at which no opposition to the proposed rate was expressed by the citizens attending the hearing.

This rate is expected to produce tax income to cover the adopted 1983-84 city budget of \$162,261.38 (not counting revenue sharing funds of \$6,565). The city's fiscal year runs from Oct. 1, 1983 to Sept. 30, 1984.

The total value of taxable property in the city is \$50,849,056, according to an amended total provided for the city council by the Bexar County Appraisal District and Northside Independent School District. A supplementary tax roll is expected soon, but Councilman Guy Burnette said the additional amount is thought to be less than \$600,000.

Last year's city budget was \$122,278.40 with an 18-cent tax rate, but this year's property values have been increased by the new appraisals.

"Don't be mistaken — this year's rate is a tax increase," said Councilwoman Verna Thompson. "If we had the same budget as last year, we would need only an eleven-cent tax rate to produce the same income. But we need the 14½-cent rate to provide for an emergency program to maintain the streets in Helotes — not capital improvement, but just maintenance, to keep from losing all our pavement."

With the new tax rate, the streets can be maintained on a pay-as-you-go basis without needing a road bond issue, Mrs. Thompson said.

The new tax rate will mean an increase in taxes on a \$50,000 house of \$22.50. On a \$75,000 house, the increase will be \$33.75. On a \$200,000 house the increase will be \$30

## Helotes Girl Is 15th Victim Of Loop

Deborah Ann Francovich, 19, of Helotes Park Estates, was fatally injured in a head-on crash on Loop 1604 Sunday morning, Oct. 2. She was a passenger in a car

driven by a friend, Melodi Lee Schuster, 18, of Universal City, who was critically injured.

The driver of the other car, a 31-year-old man from Cedar

Creek was charged with involuntary manslaughter. Later, the police discovered that he had two convictions for driving while intoxicated in another county.

Deborah Ann was a 1982 graduate of John Marshall High and planned to enter UTSA in January, said her father, James Francovich.

She was the fifteenth fatality of recent auto accidents on Loop 1604, and has caused the public and officials to push for widening the two-lane Loop to a divided highway. Approximately \$55 million is needed for the work.

### Marihuana Talk Set

Dr. Susan L. Dalterio of the University of Texas Health Science Center will speak to the Helotes Lioness Club on Tuesday, Oct. 18, beginning at 7:30 p.m., on "Marihuana Effects on Male Sexuality and Reproduction." The session is open to the public, and admission is free.

Dr. Dalterio is a research assistant professor at the Health Science Center. She is a graduate of Boston University, Assumption College and Tufts University.



The State Department of Highways and Public Transportation, in an attempt to reduce fatalities like that of Deborah Francovich of Helotes recently, is using eight special sign trailers on Loop 1604 to warn motorists. The department has prepared plans for developing Loop 1604 into a four-lane divided highway from IH-10 West to IH-35, but it lacks the necessary \$50 million to accomplish the work. Between U.S. 281 and Perrin-Betel Road, Loop 1604 traffic has grown from 510 vehicles per day in 1965 to about 14,000 per day this year.

**CYSTITIS A COMMON PROBLEM**

Do you have to "go" every ten or fifteen minutes? Is this urge a command performance or else face embarrassment in public places? Does it hurt and burn when you do? Is there discomfort or even frank pain just above your pubic bone? Was there some blood in your urine the last time or two? If your answer is yes to most or all of these questions, then you've probably got an acute bladder infection (cystitis).

If you go on to develop chills, fever, or nausea and vomiting, particularly with pain in one or both sides of the low back, then the kidneys are probably involved. That's a totally different ball game. This time we're talking about only the lower urinary tract and not the kidneys.

A word of caution about blood in the urine (hematuria). Three out of every four patients with bladder cancer will pass blood in the urine, and it usually is painless. So the appearance of blood, with or without other symptoms, is a red flag, a danger signal that should send you to your doctor immediately. Eighty percent of the cases of bladder cancer occur after age 50, affecting males about three times more often than females. Another unusual feature of this malignancy is its appearance two to five times more often among cigarette smokers than in the non-smoking population. The youngest bladder cancer patient I've seen was age thirty-one. He's alive and well today because he was sensible enough to get his painless hematuria checked out immediately.

If bladder symptoms develop, start forcing fluids. Gallons of any kind of liquid you can get down. Some sage once said that you seldom find moss in a running stream, and to some extent this is true of the lower urinary tract. The problem may subside and the urine become sterile by this simple expedient. However, if the symptoms persist after one day of "tanking up" on fluids, it's time to get a urinalysis, checkup, and possibly a urine culture.

At this point there is divergence of medical opinion as to management of your problem. Some doctors obtain a culture on the what-bug-and-what-drug thesis before starting treatment; others order an immediate complete urologic diagnostic survey with kidney x-rays and a peek inside the bladder to rule out all the uglies however remote. And many begin treatment once the routine urinalysis shows sufficient pus and/or bacteria to make the diagnosis. Then if treatment (cure rate: 90-plus percent!) doesn't work, they start looking for the rarer causes of these symptoms such as a resistant infection, malignancy, or a stone somewhere in the urinary tract. A physical examination is just as important as the urinalysis because the symptoms may be due to vaginitis or a prostate infection, which require different treatment.

Let's assume your doctor has established the diagnosis of cystitis. What next? If you're really uncomfortable, he may prescribe Pyridium for the relief of symptoms. It never cured much of anything, but it'll sure make you more comfortable while the antibiotic agent is overcoming the infection. It'll turn your urine reddish-orange and may stain your underclothing, but sometimes it's worth it. Remember that relief of symptoms does not mean cure!

If you're not allergic to sulfa, a combination of trimethoprim and sulfamethoxazole (Bactrim, Septra) is very effective. Sometimes tetracyclines, Furadantin, or one of the penicillin derivatives may be used. The average course is ten days, after which a followup urinalysis is very necessary. This shows what happens with antibiotics. Another specimen two weeks later reveals what you do without treatment, bracketing possible relapse. Of course, if it keeps coming back, it's off to the urologist for a complete investigation of your personal plumbing.

If you develop the symptoms of acute cystitis, force fluids for a day. If not relieved, see your doctor. Take your medication as prescribed, and by all means comply with the followup urinalysis. You can feel just fine but still have lingering infection that can eventually jeopardize your kidneys — or may be due to stone or cancer!

Dr. Bailey will provide a modern-day application of a result of Fermat, a French mathematician of the 1600's famed for his work in the theory of numbers. Fermat is an originator of the theory of probability, now widely used in insurance and statistical computations. Bailey will tell how Fermat's theorem forms the basis for a very sophisticated code which has been suggested for use in several present day applications, among them the electronic transfer of funds.

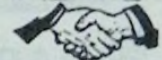

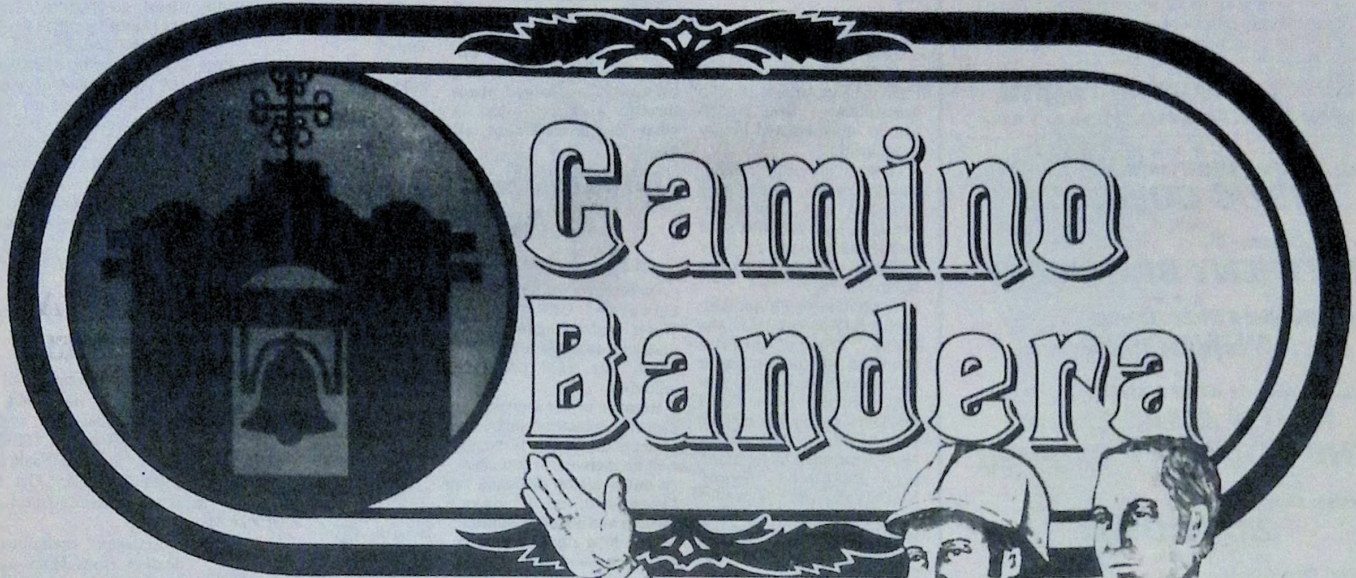

## Hospital Chaplains Help Mend Broken Spirits

Healing the physical needs of patients at Medical Center Hospital is just part of the health care given 24 hours a day.

But in addition to mending broken bones and bodies, six chaplains — four from the Catholic ministry and two from the San Antonio Baptist association — heal broken spirits, emotions and family relationships.

These "spiritual physicians" console, bless, pray with and even, marry patients, as well as MCH staff members, says 12-year Catholic Chaplain Father Mitchell.

In addition to Father Mitchell's ministry at MCH, the three other Catholic chaplains who help minister to the approximately 80 percent Catholic patient and employee population include Father McCarthy, Sister Mary Franz and Sister Dominga Mosqueda. Danny Niedecken and volunteer chaplain Tallie Williams serve as the Baptist chaplains in the Hospital District.

All four Catholic chaplains have been assigned to the BCHD through the Archdiocese of San Antonio, and consider their main ministry to be one of "meeting the spiritual, emotional and psychological needs of the patients, as well as family members."

"It's a little like a M\*A\*S\*H episode around here at times," says Father McCarthy. "There are extremely funny times, but underneath it all there is the seriousness and sadness of death we deal with."

"There is unbelievable sadness and a complexity of problems — from financial to emotional," says Sister Mosqueda.

Through the sad times, death or rejoicing from a baby's birth the key to the chaplains' ministry is communication.

"We don't just give and give of ourselves," says Sister Mosqueda. "So often the patient is my teacher. They have something to offer me that challenges me to grow personally so that I can find strength for the next encounter."

Through these encounters, each of the chaplains have learned they must quickly establish a rapport with patients and family members, so they in turn, can begin dealing with their own problems, emphasizes Sister Franz.

It becomes the chaplains' job to gently lead the patient down the path to his own realizations of self-worth and strength.

In addition, part of their job often is acting as a liaison between the patient and family and medical staff — ensuring the patient knows and understands his diagnosis and treatment,

says Father Mitchell.

As Sister Franz points out, even after the patients leave the hospital there are still strong emotional ties.

"Anywhere I go in the city I've come into contact with people who've been appreciative and loving because I've helped them through a crisis — this is what the rewards are all about."

## Edwards Sets Tax At 1.3 Cents

Directors of the five-county Edwards Underground Water District have set the district's 1983 tax levy at 1.3 cents per \$100 property valuation.

Because of the increase in property valuation in Bexar County, the levy will represent an increase in that county but a slight decrease in taxes in Comal, Hays, Medina and Uvalde Counties.

Tom Fox, district general manager, said the 1.3-cent levy will result in about \$800,000 in additional tax revenue. In August the board voted that any additional tax revenue this fiscal year would be put in the Surface Water Development Fund established in 1982.

## Blood Pressure Studies Seeking Volunteers

Persons who suffer from mild to moderate high blood pressure are needed for two separate drug studies conducted by physicians at The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio.

Volunteers for the first study should be between the ages of 21 to 70 and have no history of diabetes, stroke or heart disease.

Volunteers accepted will be hospitalized for four days in the health science center's Clinical Research Unit located in Audie L. Murphy Memorial Veterans Hospital.

Funded by a National Institutes of Health grant, this study will test response to the drug hydralazine, a compound used in treatment of high blood pressure since the 1950s.

For the second study, a 12-week project which begins in early October, volunteers will make weekly visits to Medical Center Hospital or the Brady/Green Community Health Clinic for blood pressure checks. Blood samples will be taken periodically.

To be eligible for this second study, volunteers should be between the ages of 18 and 70, and in good health. Those accepted will receive compensation for their time as

well as a free physical examination, lab work and an EKG.

This study is part of a national multicenter clinical trial to test a sustained release preparation of hydralazine.

Both studies are conducted by the pharmacology department's division of clinical pharmacology. Alexander Shepherd, M.D., Ph.D., chief of clinical pharmacology, and Arthur Briggs, M.D., professor and chair of pharmacology, are conducting the research.

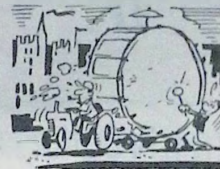

Two EMS recertification training meetings in San Antonio.

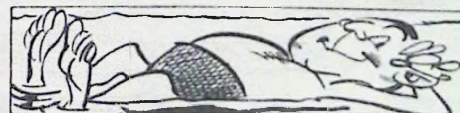
Unknown number of phone calls every day (at least six a day) on fire business.

"This was just a typical month," Ginger said.



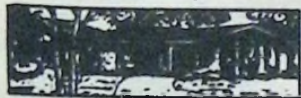

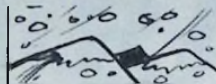

**Blood Bank  
Supply Low**

The South Texas Regional Blood Bank is looking for blood donors to help restore the blood supply to an acceptable level following a summer of low donations.

About 250 blood donors are needed every day in South Texas to fulfill the needs of the 54 hospitals the blood bank serves. During the summer, however, the blood bank sees an average of only 180 donors daily, placing a strain on the available blood supply.

Donors must be between the ages of 17 and 66 with 17-year-olds needing written parental consent. The donation process takes less than a half hour and includes a health screening and brief physical examination to make sure it is safe for a donor to give blood and for a patient to receive it.
