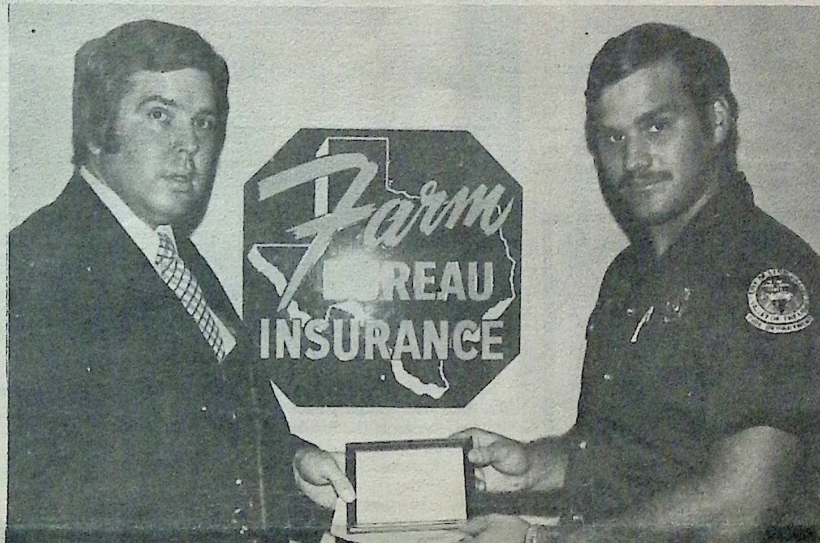

Farm Bureau Sponsors Fire Safety Program

Darrell Steubing, Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Company, recently presented Johnny James, Leon Valley Fire Department, a check and a certificate for his completion of the Texas Fireman's Training School held annually at Texas A&M.

Each year, the Bexar County Farm Bureau, in cooperation with the Texas Farm Bureau

Insurance Company, sponsors a local volunteer fireman at the training school, which is one of several programs Farm Bureau has designed to help curtail fire losses. More than 1,400 Texas firemen have attended the school under Farm Bureau sponsorship in the past 12 years. In addition, the Texas and Bexar County Farm Bureaus also pay \$75 to Fire Depart-

ments for fighting rural fires on Farm Bureau-insured property.

Approximately 1,700 Fire Safety Programs have been presented in 200 counties before schools, civic clubs, and other groups by the Texas Farm Bureau Safety Department staff.

If a local school, civic club, or other group desires a safety education presentation, it may schedule such a program by contacting the Bexar County Farm Bureau, 223-2645.

UTSA's enrollment for the Fall semester totals 7,849.

University president Dr. Peter T. Flawn said the figure represents a five percent increase over the Fall 1976 enrollment.

The figure was determined by the number of students enrolled on the twelfth day of classes. Attending UTSA are 1,961 freshmen; 1,146 sophomores; 1,390 juniors; 1,534 seniors; and 1,818 graduate students.

Post Office Suffers Break-In

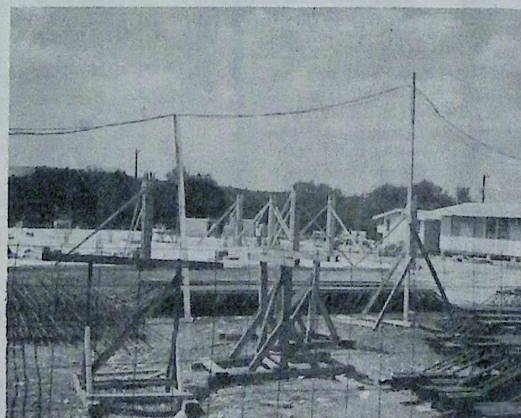
Helotes, which has been plagued by a series of break-ins recently, will have the help of the FBI, in one instance, in solving the crime. The local Post Office was broken into on Friday, Sept. 23, in early morning hours, apparently. When post office personnel arrived, it was discovered that entry had been made by breaking a window. A torch was used to open a safe. Stamps and unwritten money orders were reported taken, along with operating cash. Apparently, mail was left undisturbed, it was reported.

The federal authorities are investigating.

On Friday morning, Sept. 30, between the hours of 1 a.m. and 5 a.m., the Chef John Loft was entered with loss of office equipment, jewelry which was on display in a souvenir case, and other items. Entry was

ASNT Elects National Pres.

Columbus, Ohio—Samuel A. Wenk, Flying W Trail Helotes, Texas, was installed as President of the American Society for Nondestructive Testing (ASNT) on Oct. 3, during the 37th National Fall Conference in Detroit, Mich.

Wenk is presently Institute Engineer with Southwest Research Institute in San Antonio, where he serves in an advisory-consulting capacity. He traces his nondestructive testing (NDT) career from

World War II when he saw duty as Chief of Inspection, Pittsburgh Ordnance District.

After the war, at Battelle Memorial Institute, he organized and was Chief of the Nondestructive Test Research Division, which developed NDT methods for nuclear fuel elements, continuous fluoroscopic examination of longitudinal pipe welds and other NDT solutions to industrial problems.

Later associations included the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory, Varian Associates, Avco Space Systems Division, and High Voltage Engineering. He has gained wide recognition for his work in high energy radiography and the development of linear accelerators.

The American Society for Nondestructive Testing is a world recognized Engineering Society of 10,000 members, over 65 local sections, and its membership crosses the discipline lines of science, engineering, and technology in industry and education.

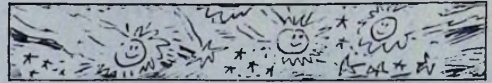
He and his wife, Joan, live at Lakehills, Texas in Pebble Beach subdivision, and have six children and three grandchildren.

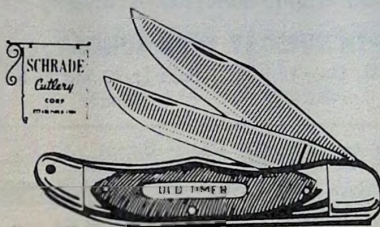

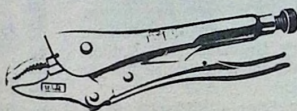

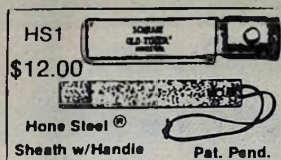
