

That we have sinned, there is no argument (RO 3:23)... What we need to understand is, "What is God's attitude towards those

Congressman Bob Krueger announced recently his full support of the extension of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, H. R. 6219.

This act would apply to areas where less than a 50 percent voter participation occurred in the 1972 Presidential election and where more than 5 percent of the population is of a single language minority group, he said. legislation is currently under committee deliberation and should reach the House floor for a vote soon
