



and provide entertainment for the 60 students at the Center.



The agency budget outlines a 20 percent reduction targeted for 1980. The goal, set by the Executive Committee early in 1979, to reduce core staff by 25 percent was also met. Passthrough funds budgeted for AACOG available to local agencies and member governments will total \$3,740,668. The funds for allocation include programs such as the youth conservation corps and CETA public service employment

Areas within the agency which were eliminated or lessened were the 208 water quality project, historical preservation, 701 comprehensive planning assistance and

public information.
