Aquifer Wells Bounce Back

As the result of above average rainfall in May, water well levels and spring flow in the Edwards Underground Water District reversed a four-month downward trend and posted gains over April by the end of May.

"Only exception to the increased readings was the check well at Kyle, which was down 4.2 feet," Tom Fox, EUWD district manager, announced. "The Kyle well, however, is affected by a local recharge area and is less typical of the wells to the southwest of San Marcos," he said.

Although the gains in May failed to overcome the general decline since the end of 1979, check well levels rose nearly 12 feet in San Antonio and almost 14 feet in Castroville.

The Edwards Underground Water District will hold a public hearing Thursday, June 26, at 5:30 p.m. in the County Commissioner's Court Room, Bexar County Courthouse, to receive public comments regarding the proposed levy of District's taxes for tax year 1980.

The Edwards Underground Water District has had a tax

rate of 2¢ per \$100 of county property valuation for 20 years. Since Bexar County's assessment ratio is being increased this results in an effective tax increase of 15% in district taxes for the property taxpayers in the Bexar County area of the district.

Laura Madla of Helotes, a 16-year-old junior at Marshall High School, is one of only 28 students from across the country who will have an all-expense trip to Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New York, awarded to women and minorities interested in going into engineering.




