In the Northside Independent School District board of trustees election, on April 1, all three incumbents have filed for the places to be open, and all have drawn opposition. Those filing are:

Place 5 - Wayne Nance (incumbent), Dr. Robert B. James, and Walter C. (Kelly) Lange.

Place 6 - Raul B. Fernandez (incumbent), Willis G. Womack, and Dr. Robert J. Reves.

Place 7 - Olan Phillips (incumbent) and Eugene G. Reynolds

Absentee voting in the school district races will be conducted March 13-28 at the district's central office, 5900 Evers Rd., during office hours.

Voting on April 1 will be conducted for residents of the Helotes area at the Helotes School. Precincts to vote at the Helotes School are Bexar County Precincts 244, 245 and 246, Medina County Precinct 5, and Bandera County Precinct 2.

Voters should have their new current gold registration certificates, as the old blue cer-tificates have expired.

LEON VALLEY RACES In Leon Valley, a race for the mayor's position has developed between Bob Williams, now a Leon Valley city councilman,

and Michael R. Martin. They are seeking to succeed Mayor Marcus Semmelmann, who is not running for a new term.

Two other Leon Valley races are for city council Place 2 and Place 4 positions. Filing for Place 2 were Irene S. Baldridge and Bob Scarborough. Filing for Place 4 were Kenneth P. O'Gorman and Philip H. Francis

#### **GREY FOREST CONTEST**

With the filing for mayor Grey Forest March 1 by Virginia Springer, a race developed for the April 1 election to succeed incumbent Mayor Ed Faust. Real estate man Harry Drought had filed for the mayor's post earlier. Mayor Faust is not running for

re-election.

The two city council posts open drew one candidate each. Roland J. Boysen, accountant, who filed for Place 2, and Jim Ed Riadon, aerial surveys editor, who filed for Place 4, have no opponents (unless a write-in campaign develops).

Two incumbent city council members, Ruth Morris and Marion Heisler, have one more year to serve on their two-year terms and so do not have to stand for re-election this year.



# Krueger Reports New Fire Ant Pesticide Tests

U.S. Cong. Bob Krueger this week was told by the Environmental Protection Agency that the pesticide Ferriamicide can be used to curtail fire ants in Texas.

Krueger recently had written EPA Administrator Douglas Costle requesting that Ferriamicide be exempted from strict control because—with the phasing out of Mirex—Ferriamicide is needed.

The fire ant poses a serious problem to the farm hand, the gardener, young children at play, and to crops throughout Texas, Krueger wrote to the EPA.

Krueger was notified of the exemption by FPA Deputy Administrator Barbara Blum, who said Ferriamicide will be exempted for a full year, beginning July 1, to enable testing to determine if the chemical could be permanently exempted.




