Leon Valley Faces \$2.4 Million Bond Issue

Santa's Coming To Town

Voters Go To Polls Dec. 15

Leon Valley residents will vote Saturday, Dec. 15, on a \$2.4 million capital improvements program for drainage and flood control, fire and police facilities and improvements, street repairs and centralizing the City's public works operation.

Mayor Bob Williams noted that "We cannot continue to fund major capital improvement projects from our annual operating budget."

A representative of Rauscher Pierce Refsnes, Inc., says, "Leon Valley residents can take pride in their city's strong financial condition. The Dec. 15 issue is extremely conser-vative."

According to committee chairman Jack Jordan, "The necessary tax increase required to retire this debt will take place with a 6' increase in 1980-81 and a maximum of an additional 7° two years later in 1982-83. The total increase will make a minor dent in our pocket, but a big difference in the quality of our lives."

Noting that the last such vote

in Leon Valley was in 1971, Jordan added, "It's time we did something for ourselves for a change. We are proud of Leon

Valley."
Changes in Leon Valley during the past 10 years from a residential suburb of 2,100 people to a business and shopping hub for the Culebra-Bandera Corridor with a current city population of 8,500 are major contributing factors in the city Council's decision to call the election.

WIDENING WORK BEGINS LOOP 41

Construction has begun on the proposed widening of Loop 410 from Ingram to Fredericksburg Road. The announcement was made by the South Texas Con-struction Company, Allan Construction Company and the Yantis Corporation, the suc-cessful low bidders on the project, at a recent pre-construction safety meeting. The project will cost \$19.8

million and take two and a half years to complete.

The existing four-lane divided

roadway will be widened to pro vide six 12 foot wide lanes with 10 foot paved shoulders. Sixturnarounds, 22 feet wide, will be constructed at Bandera, Evers, Ingram and Callaghan

Twelve ramps will be moved in order to increase safe storage capacity and improve the flow of traffic entering and leaving the mainlanes.

The westbound exit and entrance ramps at Ingram Road will be relocated farther away

from that intersection

The westbound exit ramps at Bandera and Evers Roads will both be reconstructed 500 feet east of their present locations. The existing eastbound entrance ramp at Evers will be moved east of Rolling Ridge. An eastbound exit ramp will be built at the location of the existing entrance ramp.

The westbound entrance at Callaghan Road will be relocated to just west of Baywater. The westbound exit ramp at Callaghan will be moved approximately 700 feet

The westbound exit ramp to Babcock will be moved east to a point near Laurel Hill. In addition the westbound frontage road between Fredericksburg Road and Babcock will be lowered and a retaining wall constructed along the north right-of-way line.

Carry Medical History

Travelers-especially when leaving the country-should carry a one-page personal medical history with them in case of accident or other medical emergency.

A person who contracts a disease or has an accident requiring immediate medical aid can help the attending doctor by having this infor mation available, says a health education specialist, Carla Shearer, Ms. Shearer is with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System.

Follow this advice to prepare yourself for any possible emergencies:

1. Prepare a short medical history on each family member, and keep it with passports or international identification cards for easy locating.
2. Include any drug allergies

or hypersensitivities as well as any information about regular medication that you are taking.

3. Note if you are a diabetic, have a pace maker, wear contact lenses or any other conditions that might influence emergency care.

4. Include the name and address of your personal physician along with the type of health insurance that you have.

5. Be sure that you are not carrying illegal drugs as you enter other countries. Very stiff jail terms or heavy fines are the rule in many countries.

6. Check your health policy on its applicability outside of the United States. Remember that Medicare generally does not pay out-of-country medical bills for persons 65 and over traveling or living abroad.

7. If you are uncertain about local medical services, contact the nearest U.S. Embassy or Consulate.





done at IH-10 and Bandera Road. Storm sewers will be in-stalled on Bandera Road and along the westbound frontage road east of the intersection.

Drainage facilities will be placed across IH-10 east of Kenwick, at Rolling Ridge, and west of Baywater. This work will require detouring mainlane traffic as there will be excavating across mainlanes and frontage roads. During this stage, work will continue around the clock until service can be restored to the mainlanes.

A concrete median barrier with a headlight barrier atop it will be built the length of the project. It will prevent cross median collisions and reduce on-coming headlight glare.

The working areas will be speed zoned for 45 mph. Motorists are urged to use caution in the project areas and obey all signs, barricades and flag persons. Work will begin in Fredericksburg Callaghan Roads areas.

Student Union Fee Okaved

UTSA students have approved the assessment of a fee which will make a university s' ' center possible on cam-

By a vote of 818 to 151, they approved a student fee of \$9 for the 1980-81 school year, \$12 for 1981-82 and \$15 for each year thereafter.

Referendum results will allow the UTSA administration to recommend the fee this spr-ing to The UT System Board of Regents. If approved, the fee will be used for financing, constructing, operating, maintaining and improving a student union building, as well as providing programing for students.

Check Caller To Be Sure

"Social security representatives visiting you at home will carry indentification," accor-ding to Gilbert G. Gonzalez, Social Security district

manager in San Antonio.
"In addition, they do not ask for money unless you have been notified officially that you were overpaid in benefits," he said. "If this is the case, they will give you an official receipt," he

Gonzales cautioned residents that the local social security office has been advised that someone in the area is impersonating a social security representative, promising to increase social security benefits

for a fee.
"If you are visited by someone who says he represents

social security, ask for identification, Gonzalez advised. "If in doubt as to the person's identity, don't allow him in your home, but call the social security office at 229-6400 for verifica tion. If such is not secured, call the police.

Gonzalez said that occasionally social security representatives visit private homes, hospitals, nursing homes, and businesses, but they never ask for money in return for an increase in benefits or medicare coverage.
