Northside PTA Studies TV Viewing

Northside Council of PTA's, which represents 32 Parent-Teacher Associations in the Northside School District, has completed a survey of opinions regarding television violence.

Thirty PTA members from NISD, led by Council President Mrs. Vivian Cade flew to Dallas, Feb. 1 where NISD Superintendent E.D. Cody testified in a hearing before the Federal Communications Commission, NBC, ABC and CBS on television violence.

The hearing is one of eight in the Country sponsored by the National Parent-Teacher Association.

Northside's survey provided background for Cody's testimony. About 14,000 middle school and elementary school students here carried home copies of the survey.

Since figures indicate 2.3 children per family in Northside School District, PTA President Cade feels the group received nearly 100 percent response with return of 8761 surveys.

TV TAKE TIME

Parents indicated they view from five to 10 hours of television each week WITH their children. The children, however, generally watch a great deal more television.

Fifty percent of the children, according to their parents, watch TV from 10 to 25 hours per week; 21 percent watch TV more than 25 hours per week; 24 percent watch from five to 10 hours per week and 5 percent watch less than five hours per week.

Eighty percent of the respondents said they believe there is too much violence on television; 70 percent said they believe there is too much violence during so-called "family viewing hours."

Seventy-seven percent said they felt programming should be changed. Asked if their children view the least violent program when there is a choice of violent and non-violent at the same viewing time, eighty-one percent said, "yes."

ENTERTAINMENT WANTED

Comments of respondents indicated adults as well as children prefer to be "entertained" with pleasant, relaxing programming rather than serious-violent type formats.

Some parents said though they appreciate the PTA participation in an effort to reduce violence on television, they would also like to curb language which is in poor taste and portrayal of immorality and sex on television.

Parents said in most cases they monitor the shows their children watch, and turn OFF the set during objectionable programs. Many respondents spoke enthusiastically of other family activities such as reading, skating, games and music.

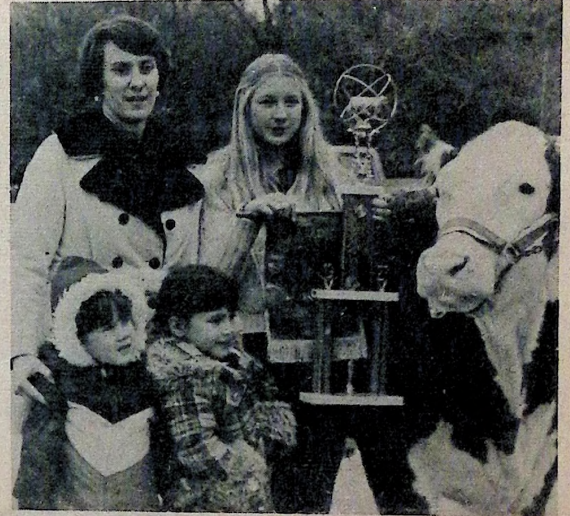

January Was Cold, Rainy

Rainfall for January totalled four inches versus only .4 of an inch in January 1976. February last year had .2 and March 1.5 so that the first eight months of 1976 saw only 6.8 inches. Henry Brauchle who keeps the local records pointed out that this January had 17 days where the temperature was below freezing.

It seems that the steady extreme low temperatures set some kind of record—but not the one for having the coldest day. That honor goes to Jan. 31, 1952—25 years ago—when the weather here was exactly zero degrees Fahrenheit, with snow.

It is too soon to say whether this will be a rainy year—but it looks likely, as rainy January's are not common.

Spencers Set Honor Records At University

Franklin Scott Spencer and his wife, Janet Marie Spencer, have established a record at the University of Texas at San Antonio that will be hard to beat.

Janet graduated Summa Cum Laude (with highest honors) from The University in December with a perfect scholastic record — an overall 4.00 grade point average on a 4.00 scale. Her husband Franklin (or Scott, as he prefers), also a Summa Cum Laude graduate, finished with a 3.97



GPA overall and a UTSA GPA of 4.00 as well.

"In my 15 years association with university administration I've never encountered a student who made straight A's all the way through and can recall only one other record similar to Scott's," declared Richard L. Lewis, UTSA Director of Admissions and Registrar.

Both the Spencers deny any special techniques for amassing such a record. "We studied when we could and did the required work," they stated.

If they could attribute their achievement to one single factor, it would be a family maxim, "Do the best you can," Janet related.

The Spencers, who were married two-and-a-half years ago, are a gregarious couple who enjoy church related activities, sports, music (Scott plays the guitar and sings) and, of course, reading.

Janet says she did most of her studying during the day. "Books

became a natural part of life for English majors," she laughed. "I almost always had a book in my hands, beside the bed, or even on the window sill when doing the dishes."

Janet earned a teaching certificate through UTSA and recently started teaching 6th grade language, art and journalism at Garner Middle School.

Scott, Minister of Youth at Dellview Baptist Church, says he studied mostly in the early mornings or late evenings. He is a history major who enjoys reading about people and the religious influences in history.

Although they were at UTSA together for over a year, the Spencers never had classes together. "We did give each other moral support though," Scott confided. "Fortunately, neither of us had any problems with any of our subjects."

Both the Spencers are 1973 honor graduates of Lee High School, where they finished a

year early. They attended Howard Payne and San Antonio

Helotes Has Orange Tower

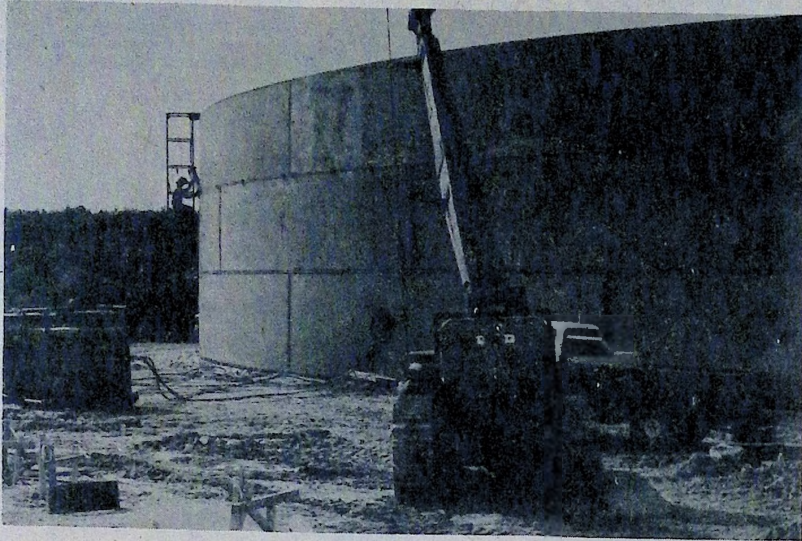
