Northside PTA Studies TV Viewing

Northside Council of PTA's, which represents 32 Parent-Teacher Associations in the Northside School District, has

Northside School District, has completed a survey of opinions regarding television violence. Thirty PTA members from NISD, led by Council President Mrs. Vivian Cade flew to Dallas, Feb. 1 where NISD Superintendent E.D. Cody testified in a hearing before the Federal Communications Commission, NBC, ABC and CBS on television violence. violence.

The hearing is one of eight in the Country sponsored by the National Parent-Teacher Association

Northside's survey provided background for Cody's testimony. About 14,000 middle school and elementary school students here carried home copies of the sur-

vey.

Since figures indicate 2.3 children per family in Northside School District, PTA President Cade feels the group received nearly 100 percent response with return of 8761 surveys.

TV TAKES TIME

Depends indicated they view

Parents indicated they view from five to 10 hours of television each week WITH their children. The children, however, generally watch a great deal more television television.

television.

Fifty percent of the children, according to their parents, watch TV from 10 to 25 hours per week; 21 percent watch TV more than 25 hours per week; 24 percent watch from five to 10 hours per week and 5 percent watch less than five hours per week.

Eighty percent of the respondents said they believe there is too much violence on television; 70 percent said they believe there

70 percent said they believe there is too much violence during so-called "family viewing hours."

Seventy-seven percent said they felt programming should be changed. Asked if their children view the least violent program when there is a choice of violent and convicient at the same and non-violent at the same viewing time, eighty-one percent

ENTERTAINMENT WANTED

Comments of respondents in-dicated adults as well as children prefer to be "entertained" with pleasant, relaxing programming rather than serious-violent type formats

Some parents said though they appreciate the PTA participation in an effort to reduce violence on television, they would also like to curb language which is in poor taste and portrayal of immorality and sex on television.

Parents said in most cases they monitor the shows their children watch, and turn OFF the set during objectionable programs. Many respondents spoke enthusiastically of other family activities such as reading, skating, games and music.

Another Honor For His Honor



January Was Cold, Rainy

Rainfall for January totalled four inches versus only .4 of an inch in January 1976. February last year had .2 and March 1.5 so that the first eight months of 1976 saw only 6.8 inches. Henry Brauchle who keeps the local records pointed out that this January had 17 days where the temperature was below freezing.

It seems that the steady extreme low temperatures set some kind of record-but not the one for having the coldest day. That honor goes to Jan. 31, 1952—25 years ago—when the weather here was exactly zero degrees Fahrenheit, with snow.

It is too soon to say whether this will be a rainy year—but it looks likely, as rainy January's are not common





Helotes Has Orange Tower


