

The order for Place 2 will be: Dr. Carl F. Raba, Jr., Ronald D Ferguson, Keith E. Klein, Larry Hicks.

# Camp Bullis Park Deeded

A ceremony at 9:30 a.m., March in front of San Antonio City Hall marks the title transfer to the city of some 323 acres of Camp Bullis. The transfer is being made under President Nixon's 1971

Legacy of Parks program.

The tract will be used according to announcements—for a game preserve and will be part of the San Antonio park system. It will have a picnic area, trails, and observation points where animals in their natural habitat may be seen. Deer have always been plentiful on Camp Bullis, and motorists passing the area have long been warned to watch for deer crossing. Other small game also abound

The military installation was a key factor in training and defense programs during both World Wars, especially; but the territory being deeded has been sub-sequently marked as surplus federal property.






