### Ranch Town Hits Snag

San Antonio Ranch, after a highly successful opening two weeks ago that drew more than 40,000 visitors, hit another snag this week when the San Antonio City Planning Commission turned down plans for further development on 217 more acres in the Helotes area subdivision.

Again the problem was the Edwards Aquifer recharge zone, thought to underly part of the Ranch Town.

The San Antonio City Council on Sept. 8 adopted a new or-dinance governing approval of development over the recharge zone, specifying, among other things, that lots over the zone had to be five acres or more in size. The Ranch Town lots in the proposed new development area are less than that.

The snag may be a temporary one, however. The San Antonio city council was to consider later whether the developers of the Ranch Town have "vested rights" to develop the property, also specified in the Sept. 8 ordinance as being one cause for the city's moratorium not to be applicable.

San Antonio Ranch had been ten years in developing before its opening on Aug. 27. Much of that time was spent in court trials with environmentalists who were trying to halt development of the new comdevelopment of the new com-munity. In every trial up to and including one before the U.S. Supreme Court the lawyers for Ranch Town proved that all safeguards would be taken for preservation of the area and the recharge zone.







### Bee Hives Operate Efficiently But Tough

To maintain their "city", bees tell time, measure distance, solve geometry problems, operate an air conditioning system and even have a highly developed language all their own.

"When a scout bee returns to the hive fairly bursting with good news of a nectar find, it tells the other bees what kind of food is available, its sugar content, how far away it is and in what direction," says Dr. Irwin Moon, director of Moody Institute of Science in Whittier, California. Most of this information is

conveyed through an intricate figure-eight dance which nearby bees follow with their antennae.

In the latest Moody science film, "City of the Bees", the viewer is taught to understand this language of the bees. In fact, man is on the verge of being able

to get a message through to the bees by "talking" to them in their own language.

The queen bee is not only capable of laying twice her weight in eggs in a single day, but she can control the sex of her babies as well. The unfertilized eggs become drones whose sole purpose is to impregnate the queen. The fertilized eggs develop into workers endowed from birth with expert skills in a succession of such diverse jobs as janitor, nurse, builder, policemen, air-conditioning engineer and field bee, or forager.

Man has often compared the efficiency and order of the hive with the confusion and chaos characterizing his own society. Some have even gone so far as to advocate that man pattern his society after that of the bees.

However, some of the bee's solutions may not be very attractive to man. In the hive there is no unemployment because of rigid population control, and no old-age problems because the foragers literally work themselves to a premature death. The queen and drones are killed as soon as their usefulness has

The efficiency of the hive is an utterly ruthless one in which the state is everything, the individual is nothing



Jack Maguire, executive secretary of the Independent Insurance Agents of San Antonio, believes an insurance discount would encourage thousands of citizens to make their homes safe from burglars, which in turn would reduce insurance losses.

Law enforcement authorities have pointed out security devices could be installed in the average home for less than \$170.

"These devices would include solid wood doors with dead bolt locks as well as locks for windows and doors," Maguire said.

Insurance agents and crime prevention personnel would have

a strong selling point if they could tell the home owner these security devices not only would reduce the chance of burglary, but also the cost of insurance, Maguire said.
