

Utilities Must Move

A meeting has been called by the Grey Forest City Council for Wednesday, July 7, at 7:30 p.m. to discuss relocating offices of the city-owned city-owned gas company somewhere in the area it serves. company

Grey Forest Utilities, which has been located on the Bandera Road in downtown Helotes for about two years, is now faced with moving into other headquarters by August 10. The present property owners exercised their rent agreement and gave 60-day notice that the former lumber yard had been sold to new owners who hope to open their new business in Helotes by

September.

Mayor Ed Faust and Utilities
Manager Tom Kirby—aided by community-have been seeking a temporary or permanent property suitable for the utilities' purposes to lease or buy or have deeded to the company, since the eviction notice was served June 10.

About eight parcels of land have been discussed as possible headquarters for the company. These have ranged on both the

These have ranged on both the downtown Bandera Road and the new Highway 16 and on several sites near Scenic Loop.

At the Thursday, July 1, called meeting, the City Council voted to ask the property owners of the Scenic Loop Playground to allow them to lease or buy two acres of a six-acre park with or without the Youth Building. The next meeting will include the replies to this suggestion as property owners will suggestion as property owners will be notified and polled between now and the meeting time. Improvements needed on all properties are extensive, making the move costly.

There was opposition from Helotes Park Estates individual citizens to a suggestion that the utilities buy a building at the Circle A entrance, although no property has been totally ruled out so far.
