Teacher of the Year



Virginia Malone, right, Rudder Middle School science coordinator, has been named Northside School District's 1982 Teacher-of-the-Year and will represent Northside District in the Texas Teacher-of-the-Year competition sponsored by the Texas Education Agency. Mrs. Malone, who has been with Northside for 11 years, compares teaching to art. "It requires the same type commitment found in any of the arts," she says. "Just as an artist is never done, neither is the work of a teacher. Just as artists have one more picture to paint or one more song to sing, so do teachers have one more child to reach and one more lesson to teach." Mrs. Malone was also named Teacher-of-the-Year at Stevenson Middle School in 1978. She taught at Stevenson for five years before moving to Rudder Middle School. She earned her bachelors of science degree from Southwest Texas State University. She and her husband, Bob, have two children, Dale, 13, an eighth grader at Rudder and Cliff, 10, a fifth grader at St. George Episcopal School.

Mayor Threatens To Veto Ordinance

During a two-and-a-half hour regular session of the Helotes City Council Thursday night, all five members of the City Council—over the objection of the Mayor—passed an ordinance establishing a Municipal Court which shall have jurisdiction within territorial limits of the City of Helotes in all criminal cases under the

ordinances of the City of Helotes and not to exceed fines of \$200.

The Municipal Court, according to the ordinance, will also have concurrent jurisdiction with any Justice of the Peace in any precinct located in the City in cases arising under the criminal laws of the State of Texas where the fine does not exceed \$200. The Court, according to Texas law, has limited jurisdiction over juveniles 14 years or older. They may, however, be tried in the Municipal Court for traffic violations, under the Texas Family Code procedure.

Mayor Tom Beatty, came to the meeting with an alternate version of the ordinance providing for appointment of a judge and clerk by the Mayor, to be confirmed by the City Council. His ordinance failed to be introduced. The Council cited statistics that the judge is appointed by members of the Council in the majority of cities in the State of Texas.

Leonard Hill—liaison Council Member with the committee to research a Municipal Court—pointed out that the measure adopted had been revised by the Helotes City Attorney and that the members of the Council had received it in the mail with sufficient time to look it over.

Before the roll call vote which saw the ordinance passed unanimously, Mayor Tom Beatty said that if the ordinance passed, "I shall exercise the first veto of this term." Leonard Hill moved the ordinance be adopted, and Pat Wootton seconded; Guy Burnett, Reudy Loeffler, and Verna Thompson then voted "Yes."

The main discussion before the adoption centered around qualifications of the judge and Clerk and their alternates. A residency of six months was left in for both sets of offices, but a section requiring an attorney to be

In Leon Springs, Precinct 2062 at the Volunteer Fire Station #1.

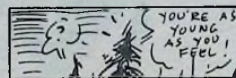

In Bexar County, the Edwards Underground Water District incumbent whose term as director is expiring is Henry Van DeWalle, and the San Antonio River Authority incumbents are Walter W. McAllister III and Irma Mireles.

Loop 1604 Okayed For Widening

The proposed improvement of Loop 1604 from IH-10 northwest of San Antonio to IH-35 northeast of the city, has been cleared for detailed plan preparation, the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation has announced.

Construction of this Loop 1604 project will improve the existing two-lane facility to a divided highway as needs develop.

This project has been approved for construction based on the completion of the formal public hearing process. A public hearing was held for the project on July 6.

As soon as needs occur, plan work completed and funds become available, this project will be scheduled for construction by the Highway Department.

With host institution status, the UTSA program

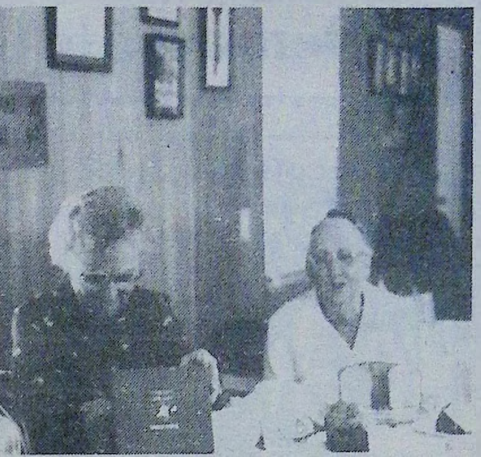
will be able to offer a wider variety of activities for its cadets and additional scholarships and personnel. Eighty-two cadets now participate in the UTSA program.

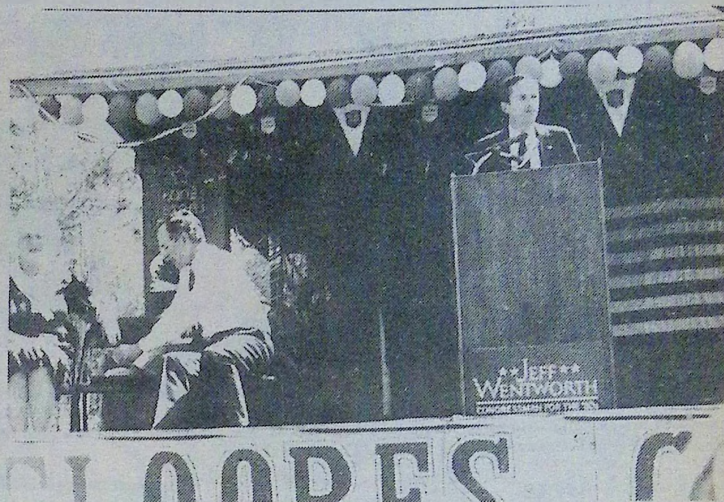

Engineering Courses To Be Given

Clydesdales To Return For Wurstfest, Nov. 5-7

The famed Budweiser Clydesdales, the majestic eight-horse hitch, will make a return visit to New Braunfels for Wurstfest, Nov. 5-7.

As regal representatives of the world's best-selling beer, the Clydesdales are a fitting addition to a celebration like Wurstfest which revolves around good food, good times, and of course, cold beer.

While in New Braunfels, the gentle giants, as the

mammoth horses are often called, will be stabled at the Courtyard Shopping Center parking lot. The public is invited to see and photograph the horses during a stable showing at the shopping center Nov. 5 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The horses will then appear Nov. 6-7 on the Wurstfest grounds at Landa and Seguin streets from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m.

A Budweiser tradition since 1933, the Clydesdales

are bred at Grant's Farm in St. Louis County, Mo. where between 20 and 30 foals are born each year. Descendants of the hugh horses bred centuries ago to carry knights into battle during the Crusades, the Clydesdales stand just over six feet at the shoulder and weigh between 1,000 and 2,000 pounds. They are characterized by their bay color, four fleecy white stockings and feet, a blaze of white on their face, and a black mane and tail.

Easy Pumpkin Pie

The holidays—a time of joy and merrymaking for all—also brings with it a dilemma for the cook: wanting to try new and different recipes, yet not wanting to break tradition. This year, the choice is made easier with "Pumpkin Ribbon Pie." Prepared with unflavored gelatine, it's a combination of two well-loved holiday desserts in one—two layers of spicy pumpkin pie with a "cheesecake" layer in the middle. And, the unflavored gelatine means that except for baking the pastry shell, you don't need to use precious oven space—usually reserved for the turkey. You and your family will all agree, a new tradition has begun!

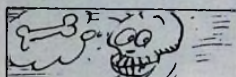
PUMPKIN RIBBON PIE

- 1 envelope Knox® Unflavored Gelatine
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 2 eggs, separated
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 packages (3 oz. ea.) cream cheese, softened
- 3/4 cup canned pumpkin
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 9-inch baked pastry shell

In medium saucepan, mix unflavored gelatine with 1/2 cup sugar; blend in egg yolks beaten with milk. Let stand 1 minute. Stir over low heat until gelatine is completely dissolved, about 5 minutes; add vanilla.

In large bowl, using electric mixer, beat cream cheese until smooth; gradually beat in gelatine mixture. Chill, stirring occasionally, until mixture mounds slightly when dropped from spoon.

In medium bowl, beat egg whites until soft peaks form; gradually add remaining 1/4 cup sugar and beat until stiff. Fold into cheese mixture. Reserve 1 cup cheese mixture. To remaining mixture, fold in pumpkin mixed with spices. Turn 1/2 pumpkin mixture into pastry shell; spread on reserved cheese mixture and top with remaining pumpkin mixture. Chill until firm. Makes about 8 servings.

A brand-new rodeo will ride into San Antonio Nov. 12-14, when Levi Strauss & Co. presents Longhorn World Championship Rodeo at the Freeman Coliseum for three performances.

Longhorn's rodeo production concept focuses on world championship cowboy and cowgirl competition, interwoven with production numbers to form a 2-hour, 20-minute family entertain-

ment package.

This year the production salutes the American Plains Indians with a colorful opening pageant and four specialty acts. The specialty acts include roman riding (standing astride two horses simultaneously) on a pair of matched Appaloosas, favorite mounds of the Nez Perce; tomahawk juggling and the Blackfoot Hoop Dance; a comedy presentation by two men and former national baton twirling champion Joyce Rice spinning fiery coup sticks.

More than 400 professional cowboys and cowgirls will compete at Freeman Coliseum for world championship points and more than \$60,000 prize money in seven events: bareback bronc riding, steer wrestling, saddle bronc riding, team roping, cowgirls barrel racing, calf roping and bull riding.

The San Antonio Longhorn Rodeo is one of the final rodeos of the International Rodeo Association's 1982 season. On Nov. 30, world championship points for the season are tabulated and the top 15 cowboys and cowgirls in each contest will qualify to compete in the 13th annual International Finals Rodeo in Tulsa in January.

Friday's 8 p.m. performance is bargain night with

all seats priced at \$6 general admission.

Saturday 8 p.m. and Sunday 2 p.m. tickets are reserved at \$8.50, \$7.50 and \$6.50. Children 12 and under and senior citizens 62 and over are half-price at the Sunday performance.

Tickets are available through the Coliseum Box Office, all Rainbow Ticketmaster outlets, all Joske's, Kallison's and Harry's Western Wear.

The Real 'Dolly' Comes To Majestic

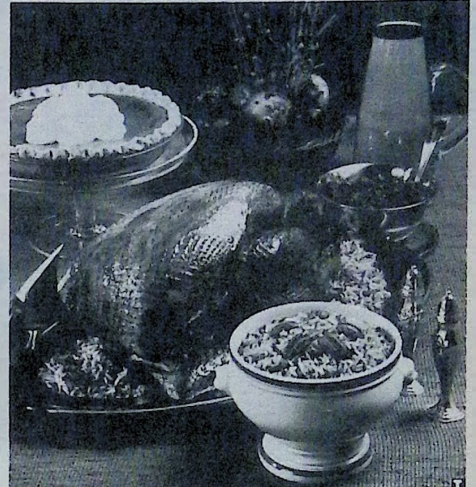

Add an extra festive note to your holiday table this year with an elegant stuffing of rice and pecans for the roast turkey.

Versatile rice is deceptively economical, about four cents for a 1/2-cup serving, and lends itself to a variety of holiday menus. It's equally delicious as a stuffing for poultry, game, or as an accompaniment for other meat dishes.

The U.S. is known throughout the world for producing clean, uniform, high-quality rice. Various forms are available depending upon the degree of milling or extent of processing involved. *Regular-milled* white rice has had the hull and bran removed, and is cleaned and graded, ready to be cooked. *Parboiled* rice is steam-pressure processed before milling. This aids in the retention of vitamins and minerals. After cooking, the grains will be fluffy, separate and plump. *Pre-cooked* rice has been milled, cooked, and dehydrated. It requires a minimum of preparation time since it needs merely to have the moisture restored to it. Nutty-flavored *brown* rice is the whole unpolished grain with only the outer hull and a small amount of the bran removed. Most all packages of rice give cooking directions. Use your favorite form of rice for making stuffings for poultry, game or meats. Remember, cooked rice keeps a few days in the refrigerator.

Rice Stuffs The Bird



Well seasoned rice, herbed chopped vegetables, and pecans make a winning combination to stuff the holiday bird.

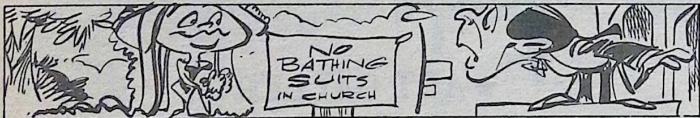
PECAN RICE STUFFING

- 1/2 cup butter or margarine
- 1 cup chopped onions
- 1 cup chopped celery
- 1/4 cup snipped parsley
- 8 cups cooked white or brown rice (cooked in turkey or chicken broth)
- 1 cup chopped pecans
- 2 teaspoons ground thyme
- 1-1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1 teaspoon ground or rubbed sage
- 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper

- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg

Melt butter in a large pan. Add onions, celery, and parsley. Cook over low heat until tender, stirring constantly. Add cooked rice, pecans, and seasonings. Toss together lightly. Makes enough stuffing for a 12 to 15 pound turkey.

Note: Stuffing may be cooked separately in a covered baking dish at 325° for 30 to 40 minutes.

Life And Death Images To Be Shown In Exhibit

An opening reception and lecture Nov. 4 will accompany the first San Antonio viewing of "Images of Life and Death," an exhibition by artist/physician Eric Avery, M.D., at The University of Texas Health Science Center.

Death has both fascinated and horrified artists, scientists and philosophers through the ages. Avery's linoleum relief prints and photographs starkly depict his attempts to deal with the realities of death as he has seen it on medical missions in this country and in the East African country of Somalia.

The opening reception on Thursday, Nov. 4 is from 6 to 9:30 p.m. in the auditorium foyer of the Helath Science Center. The lecture, entitled "Choose Life," will be delivered at 7 p.m. by E.A. Vastyen, chairman, department of humanities, College of Medicine, Hershey Medical Center, Pennsylvania State University. Vastyen is an Episcopal who worked with Avery at Hershey Medical Center.

The linoleum prints in Avery's exhibit often use the human skeleton as depicted by the Mexican printmaker, Posada. "Posada worked in Mexico, doing zinc relief prints for newspapers, posters and handbills," Avery notes. "He used skeletons and the

traditional Mexican folk motif of the skull, or calavera, to communicate his concerns about the Mexican Revolution."

Some of Avery's more recent works with these images reflect his present life in the small South Texas town of San Ygnacio, with its influences from across the Mexican border.

Following the opening events, hours for the free exhibition are Mondays through Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sundays from 1 to 5 p.m.

The exhibition will continue through Dec. 3.

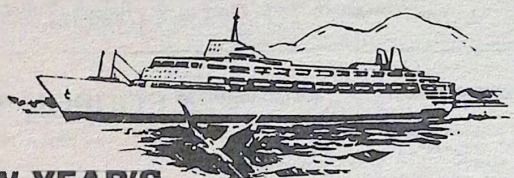

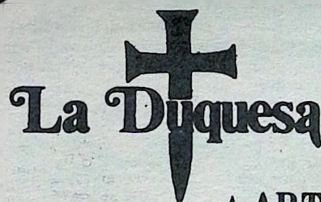

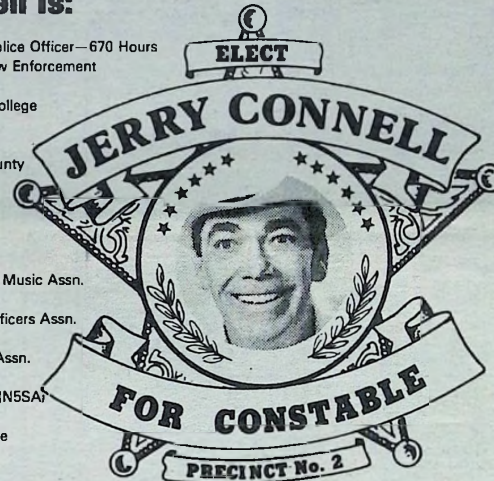

abstracted geometric steel sculpture, "Wellhouse" is shown above, will exhibit works that range in height from sixteen inches to more than ten feet. His works explore the contrast of wood with man-made material and the alteration of scale. He made the sculpture of the missing airplane installed at Randolph Air Force Base last year.

Pritchett, who lives on Scenic Loop Road, is currently an assistant professor at San Antonio College. He was a 1982 nominee for the Awards in Visual Arts program sponsored in part by the Rockefeller Foundation and the National Endowment for the Arts.

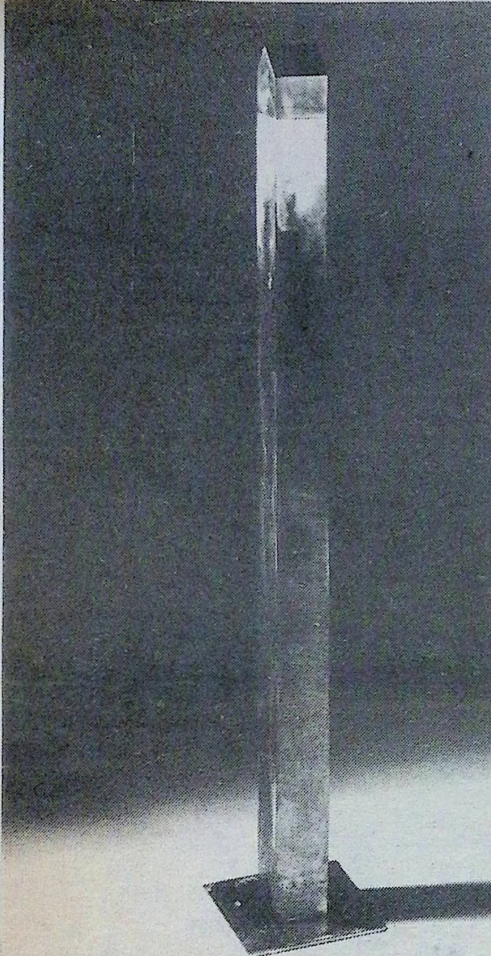
Tiemann, who feels that "art requires the viewer to be experimental and questioning," is represented in the exhibition by graphite

drawings and by constructions that combine both painting vertical shapes stacked upon themselves in a stair-step manner, with order, repetition and texture the fundamental elements.

Tiemann has exhibited widely in Texas, New Mexico, New York and Japan. He was a visiting professor at Harvard University during the summer of 1982 and is currently chairman of the Trinity University art

department in San Antonio. "Contemporary Work Series, 1982: Mark Pritchett and Robert Tiemann" will continue at the San Antonio Museum of Art through Jan. 2.

The Museum of Art is located at 200 W. Jones Ave. and is open Tuesday through Sunday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission is \$2 for adults and \$1 for children under twelve. Admission is free on Saturday and Sunday mornings until noon.

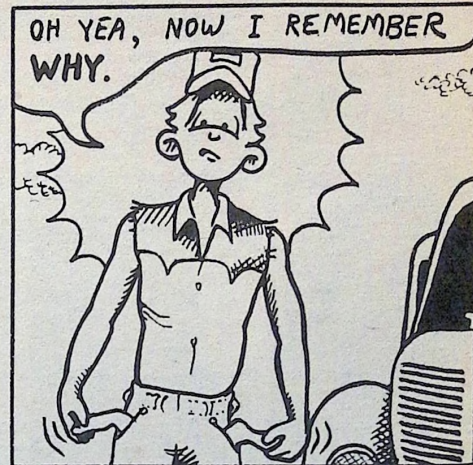
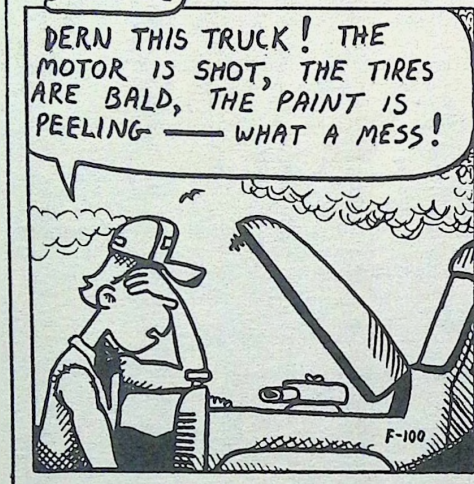

of interest to VETERANS

From 1944 through early 1982, veterans obtained over 10.8 million GI home loans totaling \$197 billion. The Veterans Administration guarantees part of a bank or other loan to help a home-buying veteran get a mortgage, often with no down payment and at lower than market rates.

Current high interest is preventing many young vets from buying a home, even with this government guarantee. Last year, a veteran needed a gross annual income of \$28,000 to meet the \$910 monthly payment on the average new GI loan of \$54,000 at 16 percent interest.

This year VA started two programs to encourage lenders to finance more GI loans. Under the "buy-down" plan, VA will okay creative financing when the seller agrees to lower the interest rate for the first three to five years of the loan. In the "guaranteed mortgage payment" plan, VA will back loans with a down payment where monthly payments start low and rise 7.5 percent a year for the first five years.

Borrowers can use a GI loan to buy a condominium or mobile home instead of a house, to refinance an existing loan and to repair their home or add energy-conservation improvements. Those who used their entitlement before Oct. 1, 1980 — when the maximum VA guarantee rose to \$27,500 — have additional government-backed borrowing power.

Bandera Road — 1/4 Mile North of Scenic Loop
