

> The act contains a list of 20 practices which are specifically declared illegal among which are:

1. Knowingly making false or concerning the need for parts, replacement or repair service,

2. Representing that goods are

In addition to those practices provided that the act shall be liberally construed in order to promote its underlying purpose of consumer protection. This means customers. that the courts will be able to keep pace with that small segment of the business community which continually finds new means to deceive the consumer.

Remedies available to the his consumer include State action to enjoin practices which violate the act when it deems that such action would be in the public interest The State can also seek civil penalties up to \$10,000.00 and restitution. Private citizens, ac-




