Texas State Committee to Stop Sanguine.

Krueger, a Hill Country native who joined the state-wide effort to stop Project Sanguine in its early stages, explained, "The countryside around Llano is just too beautiful to allow the en-vironmental disaster that Sanguine would cause.

Referring to efforts by the U.S. Navy to build a major underground communications system in the Texas Hill Country, Krueger said, "I've talked with Senator Bentsen's (D-Tex.) office about this, and we agreed that every effort must be made to insure that Sanguine is kept out of

"I grew up in this area," Krueger continued, "and I intend to work closely with both Senator John Tower and Senator Lloyd Bentsen to see that the environment of the Hill Country is preserved.

Emphasizing that he is not opposed to the American military enhancing the nation's defense by building such an underground communication system, Krueger explained that there are "more appropriate sites than the Texas Country for Project Sanguine.'
