18 Candidates Crowd Precinct 2 Race

An amazing total of 18 candidates — 4 Republicans and 14 Democrats—filed for the race for County Commissioner of Precinct 2, which includes the Helotes area. One candidate in each party will be chosen in the primary elections on May 5, and the commissioner will be chosen in the general election in November.

Precinct 2 includes the northwest quadrant of Bexar County, from San Pedro Avenue on the east and West Commerce Street on the south to the north and west boundaries of the country.

For many years the county commissioner for this precinct was Ollie Wurzbach, and few dared run against him. After he retired, Tom Stolhandske won the post. Two years ago Stolhandske resigned and Paul Elizondo was elected. Then Elizondo resigned in February to run for county judge, and Jim Perkins was appointed the interim commissioner. He is not one of the candidates for the primary elections on May 5.

Running in the Democratic primary will be:

Andy Casias, a district fire chief; Mike Garcia, city planner; Herman Segovia, attorney; Frank Sepeda, insurance executive; Felix Ybarra, businessman; Alice Sorenson, social worker; Perry Salinas, real estate investor; Louis T. Rosenberg, attorney; Jose Pepe Lucero, business-

man; Aroldo O. Lerma, pharmacist; Glenn Lacy, attorney; Tino Duran, management consultant; Roland Cadena, school counselor; and David L. Alvarado, salesman.

Running in the Republican primary will be:

Simon H. Castillo, restaurant executive; E. E. Gonzales, college teacher; Connie De La Garza Salinas, businesswoman; and George N. Shuler, businessman.

Edwards Wells Drop

Increased farm, yard and garden irrigation, coupled with a month of scant rainfall, caused a decline in water well levels throughout most of the Edwards Underground Water District by the end of February, the district office here has announced.

Hays County was the only exception, the report showed. San Marcos Springs were

flowing 114.5 cubic feet per second at the end of the month, increasing 13.2 cfs over January. The index well there remained relatively stable, showing only a tenth of a foot gain over the previous month.

Following are the water well levels at the end of February shown in feet above mean sea level with the alltime recorded highs in parentheses:

Uvalde: 870.6 feet, down 2.6 feet (886.3). Sabinal: 749.3 feet, down 5.5 feet (835.4). Castroville: 680.0 feet, down 4.0 feet (737.8). Hondo: 704.2 feet, down 4.1 feet (773.8). San Antonio: 654.6 feet, down 2.1 feet (696.5). New Braunfels: 624.2 feet, down 0.1 foot (630.2). San Marcos: 574.9 feet, up 0.1 foot (581.9).

Comal Springs at New Braunfels declined 14 cfs to a flow of 208 cfs, well below the average flow of 299 cfs. Leona River Springs at Uvalde, which are measured every six weeks, were flowing 10.7 cfs, also below the average flow of 13.5 cfs.

Local Filings Show Apathy

City elections in Helotes, Grey Forest and Leon Valley are coming up on Saturday, April 7, but the candidates are few. Absentee voting will begin Monday, March 19, at the city hall in each community.

In Helotes three members of the city council are to be chosen. The terms of Mayor Frank Thompson and Council Members Verna Thompson and Ruddy Loeffler have another year to go.

Council Members Pat Wooton and Guy Burnett, whose terms are expiring this month, chose not to stand for re-election. Leonard Hill did file for re-election in Place 1. Herbert Mayfield is a new candidate for Place 1, and Place 2 did not draw a candidate. It will have to be filled either by write-in votes or by an appointment by the new city council after it is sworn in.

Mayor Thompson said a special meeting of the council will be held Monday night, April 9, to canvass the April 7 votes, and the new council will be seated immediately.

Mrs. Thompson has been on leave of absence for three months to attend a U.S. Air Force school in Dayton, Ohio, but is expected back in Helotes on March 30.

In Grey Forest, two candidates have filed for the mayor's position being vacated by Manuel Vara, who also chose not to run again. Filing for the mayor's position were Jerry Martin, owner of Grey Moss Inn, and Matt Vyverman, currently a member of the Grey Forest city council.

The position on the council being vacated by Vyverman drew no candidate. Filing for other council places were incumbents Beverly Boudreau and Lou Hecker.

Voting will be at the Grey Forest city hall.

In Leon Valley two candidates filed for the mayor's post. They are Irene

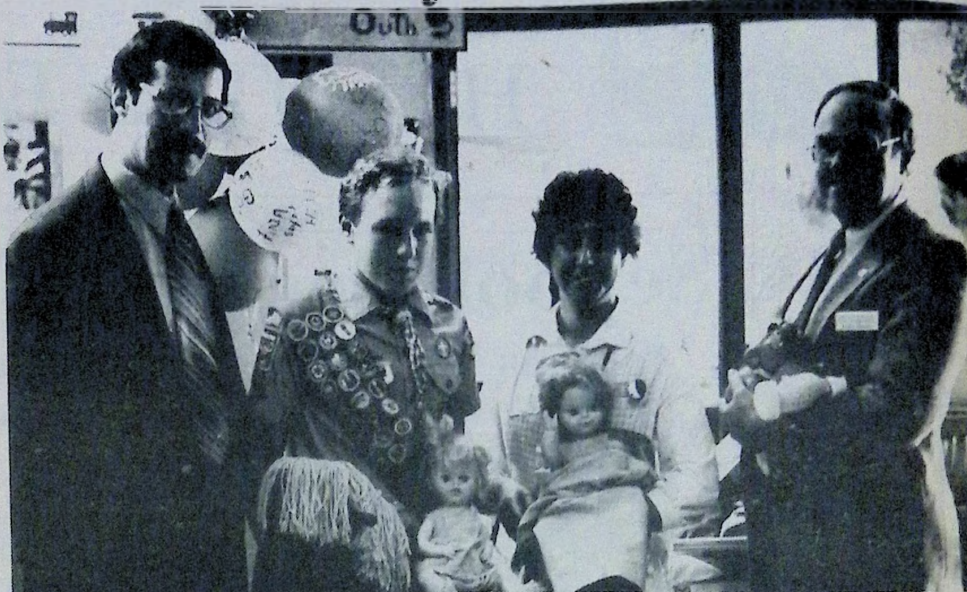

Constable North Aids Bexar County Pets

Cynthis North, Bexar County's first Cruelty Investigator for the Animal Defense League, covers the county from edge - to - edge and this week investigated cases of cruelty or neglect

from the Northwest to the Southeast area. Animals who need her attention range from little known species to cats, dogs, cows and horses.

Cynthia, who is a certified peace officer with the Bexar

County Constable's office also, can take action where there are overt cases of cruelty violating statutes and laws of Texas and Bexar County. But she reports this is almost never necessary.

Most cases she has called to her attention are chiefly neglect or ignorance on the part of the animal's owners. She says that a widespread education is needed to tell adults as well as children what is necessary to do when an animal is adopted. She

also believes that neutering and spaying will control the over-population which occurs when pets are taken into neighborhoods.

She saw the need of a full time investigator when making her calls with the Humane Society or while she was on duty enforcing the law.

The regional office of the Animal Defense League is in Corpus Christi and covers investigations of five States.

Wreck At The Curve



On Sunday, March 4, at 11 a.m., two late model cars, each driven by a young lady of the area, collided on Scenic Loop Road near the Menchaca-Wagner curve. There were no passengers. The driver of one car was taken to Methodist Hospital, where she was treated and released. The other driver did not require hospitalization, she said at the time.



Both cars received total front-end damage when they met head-on on the outer side of the curve. A lack of visible striping on the road may have contributed to the cause. Bernie Weller, head of the Regional Office, noting that Bexar County had no one, choose Cynthia to lead the investigation in one of the most populous counties in the State. Cynthia has found that most people are willing to help abandoned animals find a suitable way-of-life if these people are aided by knowledge of what to do.

Mrs. North, who has a son, has been City Secretary and Clerk of Grey Forest and a peace officer there. She works now full time being a friend to the animals who are also residents of Bexar County.

Helping Lawns Recover

Lawns will be slow to recover this spring due to the severe cold weather in December and January, says a turfgrass specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System. But homeowners can help the recovery process with several practices, including scalping the lawn and recovering clippings, applying a complete fertilizer at the rate of one pound of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet, and applying a pre-emergence herbicide to control weeds.

Donald Falcon by Don Motz. The suit also asks \$500,000 in punitive damages. The mayor was notified of the filing of the suit on Tuesday.

The council also approved purchase of a new light bar and siren for the police department's automobile, and approved purchase of a used typewriter for the city hall.

Construction records submitted by Roger's Cablevision to prove that the cablevision system for Helotes was completed by Oct. 3, 1983, were accepted by the council. Although the contract with Roger's Cablevision required that the

system be completed by Aug. 19, the cablevision company invoked an "act of God clause" that permitted delays because of bad weather.

Councilman Guy Burnett said that the matter should be closed and the experience with Roger's Cablevision be considered a good lesson in what to be careful about in signing contracts.

The council postponed until the April 5 meeting action on a new ordinance covering the police department and an agreement with Bexar County Water and Improvement District on repairing streets after construction jobs.

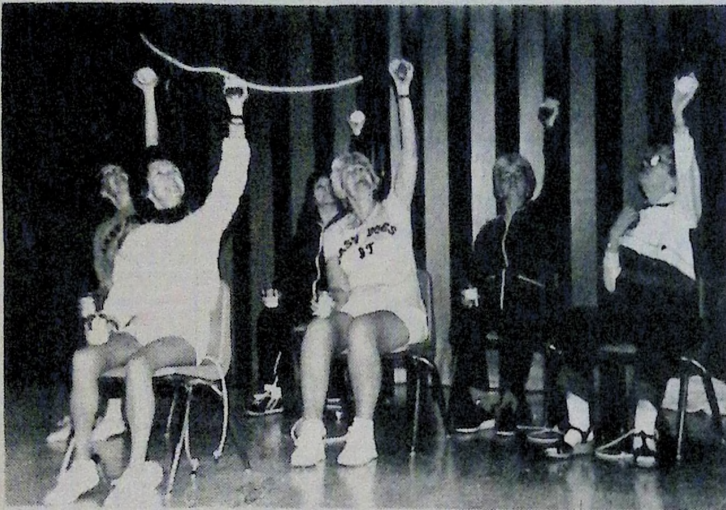

Controlling Wind Erosion

More than a million acres of Texas cropland have been damaged by wind erosion the past few months. Current cropping systems in many areas just do not provide the

needed protection to prevent soil erosion by wind, notes a soils specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System. To

control wind erosion, a combination of practices is most effective, with conservation tillage systems offering good potential for many erosion-prone soils. A rough surface and cloddiness can serve as barriers

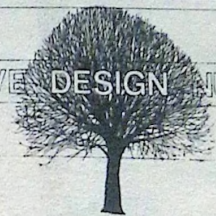

Homestead Exemptions

Texas homeowners have until May 1 to file for a homestead exemption. By claiming their home as a homestead (principal residence on Jan. 1), taxpayers are entitled to a \$5,000 exemption off the market value of the homestead for school tax purposes, notes a real estate specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System. Once an exemption is granted by the appraisal district, it remains in effect as long as the property qualifies. Taxpayers 65 or older or disabled can get an additional \$10,000 exemption.

CURRENT MANAGEMENT OF MIDDLE EAR INFECTIONS

Earaches due to middle ear infections (otitis media) account for more visits to the doctor than any other childhood disorder. By age two, it has happened at least once to two-thirds of all infants; by age six, about a quarter of the children have suffered six or more episodes. After age six, otitis media occurs much less often because the child has had a chance to develop considerable immunity, resistance, to various bacteria and viruses. Also, growth has changed the shape of the eustachian tube connecting the middle ear to the throat to make bacterial invasion less likely.

The eustachian tube is important, maintaining the proper air pressure inside the ear. When the patient has the flu, a cold, a throat infection, or allergy, the wall of the eustachian tube swells, which prevents air from passing through. Fluid then forms in the middle ear and bacteria from the nose and throat cause infection to start. The child becomes irritable, sleeps and eats poorly, and usually develops fever. An older child will tell you that his ear hurts; babies communicate by crying and tugging at their ear. Occasionally, the fluid buildup causes the eardrum to rupture, and you may notice pus coming from the child's ear. While this obviously represents severe infection, it frequently is accompanied by relief of pain.

If you suspect your child has an ear infection, take him to your doctor as soon as you can. If the child is uncomfortable, give aspirin or acetaminophen; have him lie on an electric hot pad or hot water bottle. It's best not to put anything in the ear before your doctor takes a look.

An acute middle ear infection is usually treated with a combination of an appropriate antibiotic plus a decongestant. For instance, Bactrim may be given concurrently with Dimetapp. In some cases, your doctor may want to insert a needle through the eardrum to relieve the intense pressure and to obtain some of the pus to find out exactly what bug is at fault and what drug will work on it. This lancing of the eardrum, known as myringotomy, can provide instant relief and make the treatment quite accurate.

If your child gets one ear infection after another, and the hearing seems to be impaired, your doctor may decide it's tube time. This involves making a tiny hole in the eardrum and inserting a plastic tympanostomy tube into the middle ear chamber. It's a relatively simple and safe procedure, done with local anesthesia in the office, or with brief general anesthesia in out-patient surgery. This drains and ventilates the middle ear, greatly assisting the eustachian tube to heal up and resume normal function. Sometimes swollen adenoids contribute to chronic ear infection by blocking the eustachian tube, in which case your doctor may recommend the adenoids be removed at the time of the tube insertion.

While the tubes are in place, there's not much change in normal activity, except for precautions to take when swimming or bathing. The tubes usually come out by themselves without any pain, and the eardrum promptly heals. If they don't come out after six months or so, your doctor may remove them.

Does all this affect the hearing? Probably not, provided each infection is caught and treated early, and tympanostomy tubes are inserted when and if the antibiotics/decongestants don't promptly overcome the middle ear infection.

The name of the game, of course, is to protect your child's hearing, so always pay attention to any ear complaints and seek medical attention promptly. Most schools have access to an audiometer, and I think it's a good idea to have your child's hearing tested every year.

Law Requires Drivers Use Investigation Sites

If motorists involved in main lane freeway accidents moved the affected vehicles to the frontage roads or the designated accident investigation sites as required by state law, traffic stack-ups wouldn't occur so frequently.

Clearing involved vehicles helps prevent secondary accidents. These occur when

motorists have to slow down or stop because of accidents up ahead and are themselves struck from behind. Often, motorists who have no need to slow down will do so in order to satisfy their curiosity. This frequently creates traffic snarls and sometimes more secondary accidents.

Freeway drivers involved

in accidents are required, if possible, to move their vehicles off the main lanes, ramps, shoulders and medians. The law previously requiring drivers to remain at the scene no longer applies to freeway accidents.

Accident investigation sites are well lighted and have telephones with which to call the police.

Four sites have been built, two on IH-10, and one each on IH-35 and Loop 410. The IH-10 sites are at Colorado Street, on the westbound frontage road and at Poplar Street, under the IH-10 overpass accessible from the eastbound frontage road.

The IH-10 site is under the overpass at San Marcos Street, on the southside of the intersection. It can be reached from either the north or southbound frontage road.

On Loop 410, the Accident Investigation Site is located in the southeast corner of the Vance-Jackson interchange. It can be reached directly from either frontage road or by westbound frontage road traffic crossing under the overpass.

If there is no AIS nearby, motorists should just park their vehicle on the frontage road and wait for an investigating officer.

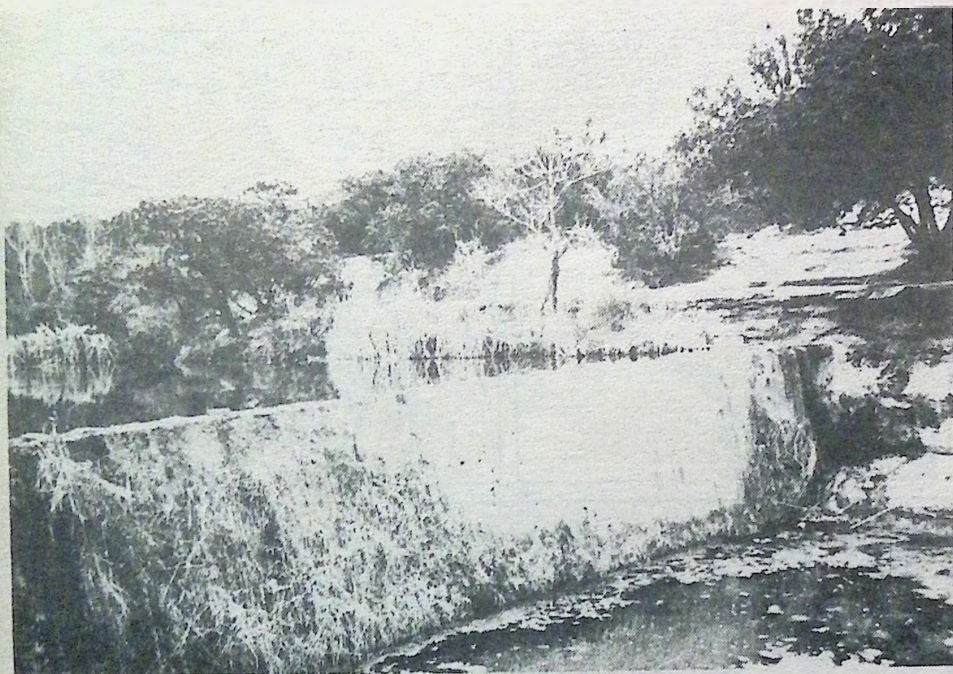

What's In A Name—When '12-Foot' Is Twice That?

Limpid waters of Helotes Creek provide a timeless tranquility to the favorite fishing hole in Grey Forest (left). Here those with patience can brag about the big catfish they caught, or spend hours trying to lure the great white one that always gets away. The name of the fishing spot used by most folks is "12-foot," and newcomers ponder the meaning when first told. Actually, the dam was dedicated as "Roosevelt Dam" when it was first built in the early 1930's by the Civilian Conservation Corps. to replace an ancient stone and earthen dam. The CCC was, of course, a Roosevelt idea to put unemployed youth to work during the Great Depression. So why "12-Foot"? Since the dam would allow small boats to cruise on the waters, the main speaker of the day — Judge Augustus McCloskey — waxed eloquent regarding Huckleberry Finn and Tom Sawyer. And he added, "Many a boy will call out, 'Mark Twain,'" which, of course means "two fathoms" or "twelve foot." And that's the way it was — and is. (The dam, however, is 24 feet high.)

Buffer Zone Sought For Edwards Aquifer

Directors of the five-county Edwards Underground Water District voted Tuesday to ask the Texas Department of Water Resources to add a buffer zone to extend the department's "Edwards Aquifer Rules" to include an area south of the southern boundary of the Edwards Recharge Zone.

Noting that recent investigations indicate that geologic and hydrologic conditions exist south of the recharge zone which could allow for

possible contamination of the aquifer from underground hydrocarbon storage and solid waste disposal sites, the 15-member board passed a resolution requesting the buffer zone and asking that appropriate rules be promulgated covering installation, inspection and monitoring of underground hydrocarbon storage.

A committee composed of Robert Hasslocher of Bexar County, Oliver Hass of Comal, S. R. Gregg of Hays,

Gilbert Haby of Medina and Leslie Pepper of Uvalde was named to develop a set of recommendations to propose to the TDWR this spring.

The action is related to the gasoline leadage discovered late in December at a Gulf service station site in the Thousand Oaks Boulevard area in north San Antonio. In discussion of the resolution the board formally commended the Gulf Oil Co. for its quick response to the occurrence, declaring the company had acted "in an

extremely responsible manner."

In other action the EUWD board voted to increase the budget of the Water Conservation Task Force by \$75,000 to fund work on a landscape water conservation demonstration project modeled after the City of Denver's "Xeriscape."

Tom Fox, EUWD general manager, pointed out that this project, to be developed in cooperation with the San Antonio Botanical Center, involves landscaping with

low water usage plants. Work should get underway this May, he said.

The board also authorized

Fox to conduct a preliminary investigation into the feasibility of spring flow conservation.

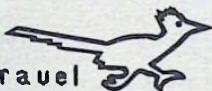

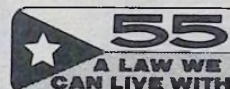

Historic Building To Be SAC Headquarters

A part of San Antonio's past will come back to life when the Alamo Community College District moves to its new headquarters on West Houston Street on March 26.

The ACCD office building combines a piece of San Antonio's past, the old Talerico Building, with new construction for an office building that will serve as the district's administrative headquarters at 811 West Houston.

The Talerico Building, a Victorian Italianate structure built in the early 1890's, forms the cornerstone of a 32,000 square foot building in Cattlemen's Square, from which the district will oversee operations of St. Philip's College, San Antonio College, Southwest Center and its planned southside college.

The historic Talerico Building will house a meeting room for the board of trustees and executive offices for the chancellor and vice chancellors. Departments moving to the new building include computer services, development, finance, institutional research, internal audit, operations, personnel, printing, program development, public information,

purchasing and school and college relations.

The offices will move from the San Antonio College campus to provide more space for the college and better serve the entire district.

As home for a thriving produce business and family residence, the Talerico Building served as an integral part of the neighborhood. Francesco Talerico, known throughout the Southwest as the "Banana King," helped other Italian immigrants by giving them jobs and temporary living quarters in his home on the second floor.

Sometime in the early 1900's, the family moved to another residence but the building continued to house the Talerico wholesale produce business until 1914. After 1914, the building changed hands several times, serving as a variety of bars and cafes until it was taken over in 1927 by the National Pecan Shelling Company. Between 1951 and 1964, the building again changed hands several times as the Happy Hour Bar, The Lucky Bar, Los Buddies Lounge and Hotel Latina.

Despite 20-8 Record, UTSA Passed Over By NCAA And NIT

The fastest rising star in major college basketball, The University of Texas at San

Antonio, completed its 1983-84 regular season this past weekend in New Orleans, and finished the year with a superb 20-8 record. However, when the NCAA and NIT berths were announced, UTSA found out this season is over.

New Orleans defeated the Birds, 68-49, in New Orleans Saturday, March 3, and an experienced Lamar squad came from behind to defeat UTSA in San Antonio, Wednesday, Feb. 29, 86-73.

A Convocation Center record crowd of 4,040 watched UTSA take an early lead against Lamar, but saw the lead dissipate in the second half because of a sticky Cardinal press. Lamar raced to a 14-point lead and

was never headed. The Roadrunners, with the loss to Lamar, saw their 13 game winning streak snapped. It had been the nation's longest to that point in the season. Derrick Gervin gave another of his excellent performances against Lamar, as he scored 24 points and had 6

rebounds. Rick Doyle added 17 points and 11 rebounds while Ike Thornton contributed 14 points.

The New Orleans game saw the Roadrunner's deadeye shooting sidelined. UTSA shot only 31.6% (18-57) for the game, their

lowest of the season. They were also out-rebounded 43-33. Ike Thornton led UTSA with 15 points and Alden Wren had 10. Derrick Gervin was held to his lowest point total of the year (5) by a tough box-and-one defense put on by UNO.

Trinity Men's Tennis Team 6th In Nation

The Trinity University men's tennis team now ranks sixth among colleges in the nation.

According to the latest rankings released by the Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches' Association (ITCA), the Tiger netters dropped two places from the fourth place standing established in the pre-season poll. Rankings are determined by a vote of ITCA-member tennis coaches.

Although the team dropped two notches, the top Trinity doubles combination of David Edges and Charles Honey, currently with a 10-4 record, maintained its third ranking nationally among all collegiate doubles competitors.

The Tigers' No. 2 duo of Tomm Warneke and Chris Kennedy fell from 10th place in pre-season to 29th position in the latest rankings despite their good 9-2 record.

Edges and Kennedy, off to good starts in early season play, made the most dramatic moves upward in the singles rankings set by the Head Intercollegiate Tennis Standings (HITS) point system. Edges, now at 10-5, moved up from 27th to

14 place in the nation, while Kennedy, 10-4, moved into the rankings for the first time in a tie for 54th position.

Warneke fell from ninth in the nation to 49th, while Honey toppled from 10th to 72nd singles ranking. Both are off to slow starts with 6-9 early-season marks.

Four of Trinity's five losses in compiling a 10-5 record through the first half of the season have been against teams ranked in the top 10—Clemson (No. 4), Pepperdine (No. 5), SMU (No. 7) and Texas (No. 9). Trinity has split a pair of matches with both Clemson and SMU. The only Tiger setback to a non-ranked team was to North Carolina, 5-4, earlier last week.

Lady Roadrunners

Win Oil Country Title

The UT San Antonio Lady Roadrunner basketball team wrapped up its biggest prize of the year by winning the first Oil Country Athletic Conference title outright in defeating UT El Paso, 72-68, in El Paso Saturday, March 3. UTSA concluded its regular season with an overall record of 21-6 and an OCAC mark of 9-1.

The Lady Roadrunners finished the regular season with the second best record for Division I schools in Texas (behind UT Austin, the nation's #1 team). Their 21 wins was a new school record.

But the Lady Roadrunners were not selected to the NCAA playoffs or to the National Women's Invitational Tournament (NWIT) in Amarillo, March 22-24.

In clinching the OCAC title, the Lady Roadrunners had to withstand a tough second half comeback by UT El Paso to win their final conference game. UTSA's recent wins over Oral Roberts (75-64), Oklahoma City (113-91), and UTEP, combined with Oral Roberts' convincing 86-67 victory over West Texas State gave UTSA the OCAC crown. UTSA also edged Rice, 73-72, Wednesday, Feb. 29, on a last second shot by Kim Maxwell.

5th Army Band To Play Sunday

The 5th Army Band will present a free concert at 7 p.m., Sunday, March 18, in Fort Sam Houston's Road Runner Recreation Center.

Open to the public, the musical event will feature songs celebrating Texas independence and St. Patrick's Day.

A baritone solo, "All Those Endearing Young Charms," will be performed by Specialist Five David Cook. "Blue Topaz" will be a bass trombone solo by David Jones, accompanied by the 5th Army Band trombones.
