## Mike Tidwell Named First President

UTSA students, in an enthusiastic turnout Monday and Tuesday, Nov. 15 and 16, elected Mike Tidwell, a senior political science major, president of the University's recently chartered Student Representative Assembly.

Other elected officials include Gloria Castillo, vice-president; Craig Youngblood, parliamentarian; Sylvia Foster, recording secretary; and James Warren, corresponding secretary.

Lynne Dawson and John La Freniere are still in contention for treasurer. A run-off election will be held Monday and Tuesday Nov. 22 and 23 to make the selection.

Developed to explore student concerns and foster awareness of the student's role in the academic community, the assembly "provides an official student body through which student opinions may be expressed and by which student representatives may participate in the decision-making processes of the University."

The constitution proposing the Student Representative Assembly was adopted by an overwhelming majority of UTSA students during elections on campus in mid-October.

As president Tidwell will act as official representative and spokesman of the Student Representative Assembly during formal occasions and will serve on the UTSA University Assembly.

In addition to the executive committee, the students also elected three class representatives for each of the four undergraduate levels and graduate student delegates to the Student Representative Assembly. These are: Jim Fisher, Gilbert Sanchez and Celestino Trevino, graduate delegates; Rebecca Marsch, Steve Linahan and Luis Salazar, senior representatives; Gerald Flores, Andres Gonzales and Carlos A. Latorre, junior representatives.

Also Veronica Ibarra, Elizabeth Landez and Rich Mangum, sophomore representatives; and Robert Jannasch, John Maldonado and Bruce Garcia, freshmen representatives.

Dr. Peter T. Flawn, UTSA President, will host a coffee at 2 p.m. Nov. 24 in the Humanities-Business Building Galeria for the student officials.

## Virginia Stacey Seeks TSTA Office

Four candidates for Texas State Teachers Association president will win or lose in one of the hardest fought elections in the history of the organization. Voting takes place December 2-3.

Virginia Allred Stacey, president-elect of Texas State Teachers Association, is a Lackland High School teacher with an impressive classroom record. She has 19 years also of

leadership in organizations affiliated with education which

influence the child's classroom education in countless ways. She is Mrs. John Stacey and has two daughters, so she understands the parent's point of view as well.

The three other candidates are from Houston, Borgér and Abilene.

For working with teachers to solve problems—Virginia has won numerous awards. She was cited as Woman of the Year in Education in 1975, one of 10 outstanding San Antonio leaders. She has held office in the TSTA and in

the Science Teachers Association of Texas. Nationally she has been a delegate to Representative Assemblies of the National Education Association and has been a Texas representative to the NEA Political Action Committee.

Mrs. Stacey, who is the niece of former Texas Governor James V. Allred, grew up in a politically oriented family which always put leadership above politics. Gov. Allred, later a federal Judge, and his brother, who is Mrs. Stacey's father, believed in the people's right to representation. Mrs. Stacey, a small but dynamic person, finds their philosophy natural. She plans to remember the children, teachers, and parents involved in education as well as the administrators.

San Antonio and Bexar County and South Texas would do well to have her as a representative and she will do well by the rest of the State as well, her proponents say.

## Social Security

### Number Needed

Some employers won't hire people unless they have a social security number so students and others planning to get a holiday jobs should apply for a number without delay if they don't already have one, according to Gilbert G. Gonzalez, social security district manager in San Antonio.

"When you don't recall having had a social security number before," Gonzalez said, "your application is screened against central files in Baltimore to make sure a second number isn't issued to you—and screening takes time."

"You should apply for your social security number at least several weeks before you need it for a job," he said. "You can get information about applying by calling any social security office."

More than nine out of 10 jobs are covered by social security.

"Your social security number is yours alone and remains the same for life," Gonzalez said. "When you get a job covered by social security be sure your employer copies your name and number correctly from your social security card to his record."

People applying for a social security number for the first time may be asked to prove their age, identity, and citizenship, according to Gonzalez.

The San Antonio social security offices are at 309 Dwyer Avenue, 4452 W. Commerce Street, and 670 S. W. Military Dr. The phone numbers are 229-6400 for the downtown office, 229-5622 for the Westside office and 229-5660 for the Southside office.

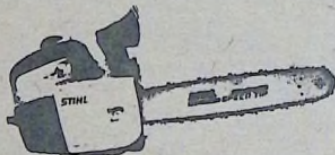

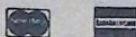

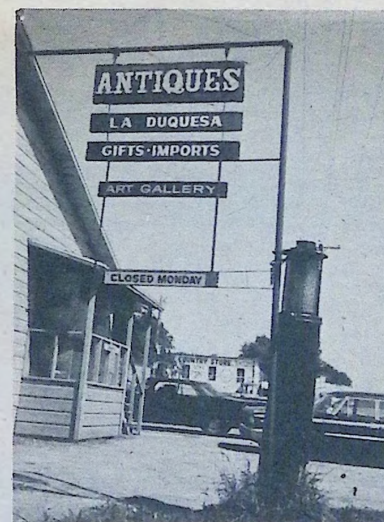

## Seven Point Deer Bagged

## Trinity Takes Championship

Trinity's Tigers, winners of the first Texas Intercollegiate Athletic Association football championship with a perfect 4-0 conference record, have also ended the season as the team leader in three of the four statistical categories.

The Tigers, 6-5 for the year, led the TIAA in total offense, rushing and team defense. Only in passing offense, where Austin College's John Simmons threw for 1463

yards, did Trinity fail to finish on top.

Trinity ended its season with 3,188 yards total offense and 2,132 rushing yards to lead in both categories. The Tiger defense allowed opponents only 2,072 total yards: 1,076 rushing and 996 passing.

Sul Ross' Ricky Watts wound up as the scoring leader with nine touchdowns for 54 points, and McMurry's Austin Chamness was the punting leader with 48 kicks for a 39.8 average.

Simmons finished as the individual total offense leader with a net 1,249 yards, all of it through the air. The 5-11, 175-pound senior from Mesquite, Texas, actually threw for 1,463 yards, completing

103 of 186 attempts for 55.3 percent, but he lost 214 yards rushing. Watts was second with 1212 yards, and they were the only two players in the conference to go over 1,000 yards total offense.

Austin's Paul Solomon won the rushing title with 908 yards on 197 carries; Simmons also took the passing title; Wendell Brown of Austin was the receiving leader with 38 catches for 578 yards and four touchdowns, and the kickoff return leader with 21 for 504 yards. The Kangaroos' Willie Williams led in punt returns (14 for 226 yards) and interceptions (eight).

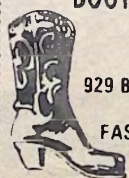

## Internships Offered Nurses



Nurses gain experience in maternal-child health nursing during internship program.

Bexar County Hospital District is now accepting applications for internship programs in critical care and maternal-child health nursing.

New graduate nurses and practicing registered nurses are eligible for the six month internships. Enrollment is limited to ten critical care nursing and six for maternal-child health. Deadline for application is December 10 for the classes which begin January 3, 1977. A salary is paid from the beginning and is

raised to full registered nurse pay at the end of three months.

The internships are designed to prepare nurses for a place in the specialized world of modern health care. "Both programs are designed to supplement nurse education with heavy emphasis on clinical experience under supervision," said Marilyn Locke, RN, assistant director, Education and Training.

The internships include theory presentations and practical application through discussions of

actual patient cases. Critical care nursing includes anatomy laboratories and cardiac crisis laboratories in which emergency situations are simulated. The maternal-child health program includes graded care nursery supplemented by a large neonatal intensive care unit, high-risk

pregnancies, and fetal monitoring. Experiences in the various types of research projects, such as the new toxemia research laboratory, are also included. About 425 babies are born in District facilities each month.

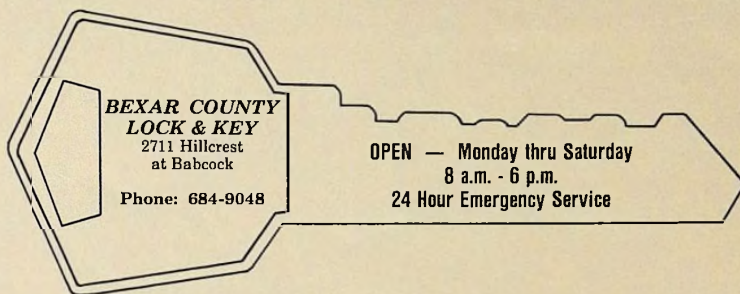
