## Contract Let For School Here

The contract for building the new Helotes School additions has been awarded by the Northside District trustees to Mesquite Construction Company. Their bid was \$662,449.

The contract includes a new classroom building to replace the original school building, which will be torn down; a new gym; and remodeling of the cafeteria building to increase its dining and kitchen areas. The new complex is scheduled to be completed in time for the school year to begin in September, 1978.

For the school year beginning in September, temporary classrooms will be used.



## Rainfall

A sprinkle during the parade on April 30 ended the measurable rainfall for April with a total of 5.5 inches for the month. Although it rained steadily before daylight, the sun and moon cooperated to wind up Cornyval '77 with ideal weather. Much of the month's rainfall occurred while San Antonio's Fiesta was in progress.

The total for the month tallied

about one-half the amount which fell last year in April.

Rainfall for 1977 stood at 12.2 inches by May 1, according to records kept by Henry Brauchle at his Poor Boy Ranch here. May is generally one of the rainiest months of the year, but the first of the week remained humid, but bright, with little threat of rain.

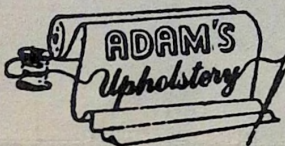

Memorial services were conducted Tuesday morning, May 3, at Roy Akers Funeral Chapels, with Rev. Tom Neal officiating.

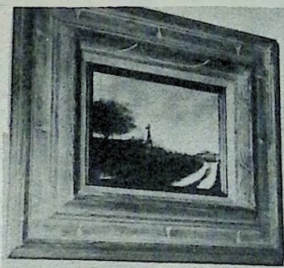
Sympathy is extended to her loved ones.

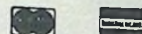

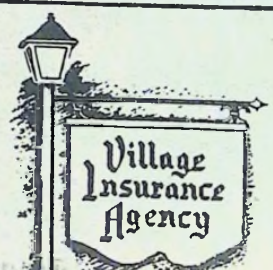

My special thanks are to the Lions Club members and their families, whose loyalty and unselfishness made our project an outstanding success.

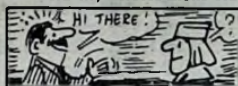
