





# Investigation Course Offered

The Police Training Academy of the Alamo Area Council of Governments will offer a 40-hour specialized course in Primary Criminal Investigation, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. September 17-21 at the Terrell Hills Police Department, 5100 North New Braunfels, San Antonio

The course will be conducted by the Law Enforcement Division of the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service and will emphasize proper investigative procedures. The training project is funded through a grant from the Texas Criminal Justice Council. No fee will be charged for registration and materials.

The purpose of licensing child day care homes is to assure good care for children away from their own home during part of the twenty-four hour day. During the licensing process, some of the things the day care worker will discuss with you are: 1) The number and ages of the children to receive care in your home; 2) Whether or not there are any safety hazards in the home or in the yard and what you may need to do to correct any existing hazards so that you may be licensed; 3) How you propose to plan for a developmental program of daily activities appropriate for the ages of children in care; 4) What equipment you have and what additional equipment seems necessary for future planning; 5) The importance of good nutrition; 6) How you plan to meet emergencies such as fire, accident or sudden illness, and the use of medications, 7) Agreements you

Providing day care is a public hours per day and so many days per week. The Department and parents have also made




