Greetings from the Philippine American Educational Foundation, also known as the Fulbright Commission in the Philippines. I am writing this letter to support Mr. Norman Greenhawk's application for the Indianapolis Prize. Mr. Greenhawk is currently based in the Philippines under the support of the Fulbright Specialist program, a US Department of State exchange program. As the first Fulbright Specialist for the Philippines since the start of the pandemic, Mr. Greenhawk is working closely with the team at the Museum of Natural History at the University of the Philippines Los Baños (UPLB) on a conservation action project related to the monitoring of endangered frog species (Project Palaka).

Mr. Greenhawk received his first Fulbright grant to the Philippines as an American student researcher in FY 2015-2016, working on a grant titled "Ex Situ Conservation of Philippine Amphibians", under the supervision of UPLB. Mr. Greenhawk was invited to return to the Philippines to present further research findings in 2018. His long-standing connection with conservation efforts and amphibian related research in the country has supported monitoring activities by the academic community in the country. The Fulbright commission supports his professional resolve to enhance the research capacity of university students and academics in the Philippines in the areas of natural resource management.
