The Issue

Casinos use live entertainment simply as a

loss leader

to draw people to the gaming floor and generate gaming receipts

This impacts a local venue's ability to

book talent

and drives up the price

consumers pay

Casinos restrict local venues' access to talent and entertainment by imposing crippling clauses



Exclusivity Clause

talent can only perform at facilities owned by the casino



Radius Clause

talent cannot perform within a certain distance of the casino



Duration Clause

talent cannot return to the market for a specified period

For venues, talent and entertainment is critical because it drives ancillary income


Without casinos, Georgia venues operate within the

The only provision that is sure to protect and preserve our valued community assets is to prohibit casinos from owning or operating entertainment facilities
