

REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING WEDNESDAY, MAY 27, 2015 7:00PM

The Orrock Township Board met in regular session, on Wednesday May 27, 2015 at 7:00PM, at the Orrock Town Hall, 26401 – 180th St. NW, Big Lake, Minnesota. The meeting was called to order by Chair Gotzian, at 7:00PM, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Supervisors Bryan Adams, Charles Gotzian, Eric Peterson and Corrie Silverberg, Treasurer Laura Jones and Clerk Brenda Kimberly-Maas were in attendance. Town Engineer Mike Nielson, a number of residents and observers were also present. Supervisor Bob Hassett was absent.

APPROVAL OF MAY REGULAR MEETING AGENDA:

SHERIFF'S REPORT:

Commander Doran presented the report to the Board. Calls for service were down by 23 from the month of April. Calls were for traffic stops, DUI, theft, residential burglary, as well as trespassing and property damage, at the Shores of Eagle Lake.

ROADS

ROAD ENGINEER: PATCH/OVERLAY 243RD AVE:

Mike Nielson reported he reviewed the information given to him from past studies done on the section. He recommended to the Board, pavement cores be taken from the road to evaluate the bituminous depth and evaluate the composition of the underlying earth. He presented the Board with a letter of proposal to complete a feasibility study report on repair options. The WSB cost would be \$2750, soil borings would cost not to exceed \$700 for a total cost of \$3450. This would give the Board more accurate information on the options for the repair of the road and give more accurate costs for the options.

MOWING QUOTES/CONTRACT AWARD:

Three quotes were returned: B&G Excavating \$2938 first mow, \$6748 second mow, total \$9686. D.Borgquist & Assoc. \$3010 first mow, \$6510 second mow, total \$9520. Darryl Waletzko, LLC.\$3500 first mow, \$5500 second mow, total \$9000.

ROAD TOUR NOTES:

Generally, the roads are in good condition. Troublesome areas are 182nd St., where some patching should be done and vehicles are cutting the corner off of CSAH 10, onto 182nd St.. Mike N will ask the County Engineer if there is a solution in the works with the rebuilding of CSAH10.

There is a storm drainage situation that needs to be addressed on Big Eagle Lake. Mike N felt the simplest solution would be to put in a drain, catch basin and baffle system. Grants will be researched to assist with costs of any reconstruct, of the drain.

Across 241 ½ Ave. are some utility lines which are causing areas of the pavement to sink. Clerk Kimberly-Maas will contact Gopher One and ask to have the utility lines marked. Mike N thought the utility whose lines were causing the undermining, would be responsible for repair costs.

When the roads were crack filled, the vacated section of 232 Ave. was repaired. A letter to the owners will be sent, indicating the Township's contractor erroneously repaired the road. It was also suggested to have the barricades removed from the end of the vacated portion of the road.

Clerk Kimberly-Maas noted there were some residences where retaining wall block had been used at the end of driveways to create garden spaces. She asked if and how the Board would like to address these situations. The Board indicated their wish to visit the locations before sending any formal letters to the property owners.

There were some areas of undermining by animals, which were filled by Chair Gotzian.

Motion/Second to have WSB prepare a cost estimate on patching/repair of 182nd St and an engineering proposal for restructuring the drains on Big Eagle Lake by: Adams/Silverberg Approved: Adams, Gotzian, Peterson and Silverberg Opposed by: None Abstaining: None Motion Carries

PERMANENT WEIGHT RESTRICTION SIGNS:

Clerk Kimberly-Maas will give Supervisor Peterson a copy of the Resolution which lists the roads needing permanent weight restriction signs. Supervisor Peterson will contact Sherburne County on placement of signs on county roads.

Supervisor Adams spoke on the need to have a permanent weight restriction sign posted on 235th Ave. east of CSAH 15 leading into State Forest land. This road is used by logging trucks, which are working on the DNR land. Chair Gotzian noted 253rd Ave. is also used heavily by logging trucks. Those roads should have permanent 5-ton restriction signs. Those roads are listed on the adopted, weight restriction resolution.

Motion/Second to amend Resolution 20140414 to include 235th Ave. east of CSAH 15 and west of the DNR land, as well as 253rd Ave east of CSAH 5 and west of the DNR land by: Gotzian/Silverberg Approved: Adams, Gotzian, Peterson and Silverberg Opposed by: None Abstaining: None

ATVs:

Supervisor Silverberg spoke with Mary Stokka from the DNR. She told Supervisor Silverberg there was no ability for us to receive grant money for damages, since they are allowed to operate in the ditches. At this point our only option seems to be working with the county to make a more permanent repair to the areas damaged, since much of it is occurring on county road ROWs.

OLD BUSINESS:

ON-CALL MAINTENANCE RFQ:

Supervisor Adams presented the Board with an RFQ for an on-call, as needed maintenance contractor. He thought that in the event the Supervisors are unable to handle work that needed to be done, especially in the event of a storm. Discussion of how the Road Authority may be able to spend more than the current \$2000 per occurrence, should the need arise.

PAY SURVEY:

The Board discussed the results of the surrounding township's pay survey, done by Clerk Kimberly-Maas. Townships which responded were Baldwin, Haven, Big Lake, Livonia and Santiago.

Motion to increase the hourly compensation rate of the Clerk and Treasurer position to \$20/hour effective June 1, 2015 by: Adams

NEW BUSINESS:

TOBACCO LICENSE RENEWAL:

The Board reviewed and discussed the Tobacco License Renewals for Sand Dune Spirits and Station Operations II (Sandune Stop). There were no concerns and the licenses were approved.

The Board was presented a Joint Powers Agreement for the Sherburne County Association of Townships. Supervisor Silverberg asked for clarification on how the dues were collected and spent. Clerk Kimberly-Maas will get more information on this and report to the Board in June.

PLANNING COMMISSION UPDATE:

Supervisor Adams updated the Board. He attended the Sherburne County Planning Commission meeting. He stated there were two Ordinances which had passed the committee. One ordinance was to allow the county to inspect SWIP plans, since the State has shifted that responsibility to the county level. The other had to do with MS4 compliance. Supervisor Adams noted there are two townships which are currently required to be MS4 compliant. And that Orrock will need to become compliant in the near future and an Ordinance will be needed, at that time.

TRUCK AND EQUIPMENT:

Chair Gotzian stated the truck is in need of some repair and maintenance work. The brakes seem to have a sticky caliper and it is also in need of routine maintenance, such as an oil change.

He also suggested the lawn tractor have the blades sharpened, the small engine equipment be started and used, to see if they are in working order.

He noted the salt/sand spreader is in need of a belt. Chair Gotzian will investigate the current value of the spreader to see if it should be repaired and report back to the Board.

There is also a 55 gallon drum of unopened oil in the shed, which is not needed. It could be sold. Supervisor Peterson will find the value of the oil and report back to the Board.

Motion/Second to have Eric Peterson look at the brakes on the truck, make necessary repairs and have the oil changed. The cost of parts shall not exceed \$500.00 by: Gotzian/Adams Approved: Adams, Gotzian and Silverberg Opposed by: None Abstaining: Peterson Motion Carries
