Purpose

- 1. Process factors that control many defects, especially those concerning surface finish, cold flow and non-fills*
- 2. Metallurgy issues associated with defects. While all metals are covered, there is a special emphasis on aluminum.*
- 3. Identifying defects and diagnosing root causes and corrective actions*
- 4. Troubleshooting guide studied by type of defect in order to swiftly take the appropriate action.*
