COLORADO PRAISE REPORT

SIS. EMILY PERE



"I thank the Lord for giving me the opportunity to attend the Colorado meetings. That alone was such a blessing. Before traveling, my heart's desire was to set myself aside and allow God to use me however He saw fit. With a desire like that, Satan was not happy and began to create havoc. On Saturday morning, I felt completely fine. However, when the brothers called us to sing, a sudden and intense pain came out of nowhere while I was singing. The pain became so severe that I had to stop singing and hold my head during the song.

After we finished singing, the pain became almost unbearable. I thank God for my sister, Gael, who quickly came to help me and brought me to the bathroom, where I began vomiting. Soon, several other sisters came to help and comfort me as well. We then called our pastor, Bro. Edmond Raphino, and Minister Bro. Naully Jean-François, and they prayed for me. About 30 minutes later, I began to feel some relief as the pain slowly started to subside.

After the service, I returned to the hotel and rested before the evening service. When I woke up, I felt so much better. As I made my way back to church, I suddenly realized that the headache was completely gone.

I truly thank the Lord for hearing our prayers, healing me from that terrible headache, and turning the experience into a testimony."

"I am so grateful to have had the opportunity to attend the Colorado meetings again for the second time. Every time I come, I can truly feel the love of the believers, and these meetings taught me a very important lesson: when one soldier falls, another must be ready to step in and hold the position. That became my testimony during the meetings. My little sister, Emily, suddenly became very sick with a severe headache and wasn't able to monitor the camera or record the services. Without hesitation, I knew I needed to step in and help so that every moment of the meetings could still be captured. I had never been responsible for operating the camera on a missionary trip before, but I remembered that *when one soldier is down, another must rise to the occasion.*

I thank God for calming my nerves and giving me the strength and confidence to do something unfamiliar. I was also so thankful for the help of Sister Gael, who was such a blessing and willingly assisted wherever she could.

Looking back at the pictures and videos, I can still feel the anointing behind every image and every recording. I thank God for allowing me to serve in this way and for reminding me that no matter our role, we must always be ready to stand in the gap for one another."

THE HISTORY & INSPIRATION

ODCT CAMP

From a tiny spark of inspiration to a decade and a half of fellowship, we remember the humble beginnings that brought us to where we are today and the power behind our collective journey. At Open Door Community Tabernacle, our camp story began in 2009 when Br. Dan and Br. John Martin invited us to a camp in Idaho. From that powerful experience, ODCT was deeply inspired to establish its own camp.

What started as intimate gatherings in believers' houses officially found its home in 2013 when we bought our church building. Since that milestone, we have officially completed 14 camps but the true foundation stretches back much further than the building itself. Now, we look at where we came from and where we are today as a single unit. It is easy to look into the kitchen and notice the same hands serving, but every single one of us has a distinct position to play in this church. There is no hierarchy here, the kitchen crew is not higher than the media team, and the media team is not above the preacher.
