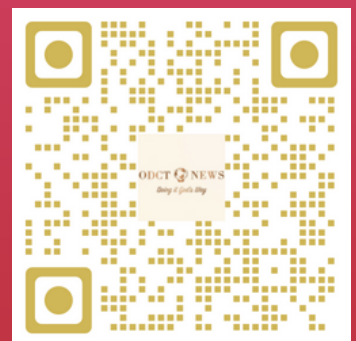

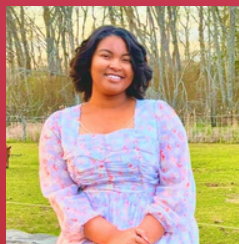

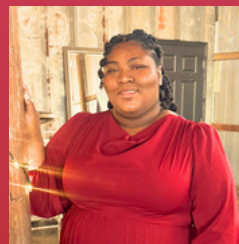

Phileo vs. Agapao

Love



February arrives, and with it, love seems to dance in the air. It's in the warmth of a mother's embrace, the steady support of a father's hand, and the unbreakable bond between family and friends. But beyond the love we know—the love we give and receive—there exists a deeper, divine love. A love that surpasses all human understanding. There are two kinds of love: Phileo love and Agapao love. Phileo love is what we feel for our parents, our children, and our closest friends—it's love from the mind, a natural affection. But Agapao love? That is something far greater. It is love from the heart, a love so pure and selfless that it asks for nothing in return.

Some may wonder: What's the difference between the love I have for my mother and the love God has for me?

As message believers, we understand that Agapao love is the truest love of all. It is the love that led Christ to the cross—not because He had to, but because He chose to. In the message *Earnestly Contending For The Faith That Was Once Delivered Unto The Saints*, Brother Branham paints this contrast vividly: **“Agapao love is of above. Just listen to this. Phileo love is what you have for your wife, your children: that's Phileo. Now, if someone insulted your wife, that kind of love would make you kill the man that insulted your wife. That's Phileo. But Agapao love would make you pray for his lost soul. That's the difference.”** That is the power of Agapao love—it transforms vengeance into mercy, anger into prayer. It calls us to love even those who wrong us, just as Christ loved us in our imperfections.

And so, as we move through this season of love, let us strive not just for affection, but for Agapao love—the love that prays, forgives, and endures. A love that doesn't seek its own but gives itself freely, just as He did for us.
