Anderson Creek Garden Club

Bylaws

Approved December 10, 2024

Article I.

Name

This organization shall be called the Anderson Creek Garden Club, hereafter referred to as ACGC.

Article II.

Purpose

Section 1. The purpose of this club shall be to stimulate interest in horticulture, gardening, youth gardening, and flower arranging; to encourage and improve civic planning; to cooperate in the protection of wildlife, wildflowers, and native plants; and to support the projects of the Garden Club of North Carolina, Inc. (GCNC) and National Garden Clubs, Inc.

Article III.

Membership Board

Section 1. Any person actively interested in the objectives of this garden club shall be eligible for membership.

Section 2. A garden club member may sponsor applicants for membership by recommendation to the garden club membership, as documented in the minutes of the meeting.

Section 3. The Membership Board consists of all members in good standing as dues paying members who regularly participate in the garden club activities during the club year.

Section 4. Dues must be current to participate in ACGC membership board activities; however, anyone may attend two meetings as a guest of the club in a year.

Article IV.

Dues

Section 1. ACGC existing members must pay annual club membership dues, which must include GCNC state/council dues, by March 15, using an approved method of payment. New membership dues to ACGC may be paid at any time, but dues paid after September 15 will be for ACGC only and will not include any state/council membership for the current GCNC year ending March 31.

Section 2. Any changes in the amount of annual ACGC dues shall be approved by the Executive Board no later than the January meeting and presented to the membership at the February meeting for a vote by the members.

Article V.

Governance

Section 1. The Officers of the club shall be President, First Vice President, Second Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Section 2. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Officers of the club and shall have general administrative powers and authority to transact business on behalf of the Committee between regular

meetings of the board. Executive Committee meetings shall be called on an as-needed basis by the President.

Section 3. The Executive Committee, at its discretion, may create subcommittees to operate under the Executive Committee's approval, appoint chairpersons of those subcommittees, and invite those chairs to attend Executive Committee meetings.

Section 4. The President shall: preside at all general and Executive Committee meetings; be an ex-officio member of all sub-committees; approve all club expense and income ledger entries and so advise the Treasurer; represent the club on public occasions and with other organizations; represent the club or appoint a representative at the annual State and District meetings; be a shared contact on the ACGC email service; be a co-administrator of the ACGC website; appoint two members-at-large to join the Secretary as a nominating committee for new Executive Committee elections; and be responsible for GCNC Rating Sheets.

Section 5. The First Vice-President (1st VP) shall: perform the duties of the President in their absence; serve as an ex-officio member of all sub-committees; and act as Program Chairman.

Section 6. The Second Vice-President (2nd VP) shall: coordinate marketing for club events and membership; act as a shared contact for the ACGC email service; and co-administer the club website along with the President.

Section 7. The Secretary shall: keep an accurate record of all general and Executive Board meetings; serve as Chairman of the Nominating Committee; maintain copies of all Executive Committee correspondence; and be responsible for maintaining correspondence,

as required, between the Executive Board of ACGC and the members, including serving as a shared contact for the ACGC email service.

Section 8. The Treasurer shall: keep all accounting records regarding ACGC income and expenses, pursuant to appropriate documentation and approval by the President; reconcile accounting records monthly; prepare a proposed budget one month prior to the new fiscal year for presentation to and approval by the Executive Committee; and retain all financial records and supporting documents for no less than a period of three (3) years, seeking approval from the Executive Committee before destroying such records.

Section 9. Commencing in 2026, officer elections will be held every two years at the May meeting. A slate of candidates will be presented by the Nominating Committee at the April meeting. The Nominating Committee shall be comprised of the Secretary, as Chairman, and two members-at-large appointed by the President. In the event of a vacancy of an Executive Committee position prior to the next election, the President shall fill the vacancy with the approval of the Executive Committee.

Section 10. The ACGC first-year budget will be developed by the Executive Committee upon receiving its charter from the Garden Club of North Carolina, Inc. and will be presented to the membership for approval by a simple majority. In subsequent years, a

new Annual Budget will be presented by the Executive Committee and offered for approval by a majority vote of the members present at the April meeting.

Article VI.

General Membership Meetings

Section 1. During the club year, membership meetings will be held on the second Tuesday of each month at ten a.m. (10 a.m.) unless otherwise noted.

Section 2. The presiding officer shall conduct meetings in an orderly manner using Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised. A quorum shall consist of any members present. For issues requiring a vote, a quorum shall consist of a majority in attendance. For issues requiring a vote outside of the regular scheduled executive and board meetings electronic voting will be allowed, and the votes of a simple majority of members present shall prevail.

Section 3. General Membership meetings will be held on the second Tuesday of the month, except as occasionally modified by agreement of the Executive Committee members. Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, shall be the guidelines for all meetings.

Article VII.

Disclaimer

Section 1. Any member, guest invitee, vendor, or contributor shall bear responsibility for any and every incident that occurs at any event, program, or upon any premises where a meeting shall be held. Anderson Creek Garden Club shall not indemnify any guest member, invitee, vendor, speaker, and/or other participant on the premises where an event involving ACGC is transpiring.

Article VIII.

Dissolution

Section 1. In the event of the dissolution of ACGC, all funds in the treasury at that time shall be used to satisfy any outstanding debts or obligations. Any remaining funds and assets shall be donated to a

charitable organization that aligns with our mission and purpose, as recommended by the Executive Committee.

THE ELIZABETHAN GARDENS

The Elizabethan Gardens is a 10.5 acre public garden location within the Fort Raleigh National Historic site adjacent to the Waterside Theatre nestled near North Carolina's Outer Banks in Manteo, N. C. The Elizabethan Gardens, Inc., is a subsidiary of the Garden Club of North Carolina, Inc. Founded and supported by the Garden Club of North Carolina, Inc., the gardens are one of the finest examples of the Elizabethan era and noticeably featured in landscape books and calendars. The Elizabethan Gardens is a tribute to the first English colonists in the New World at the site of the original settlement. The Gardens contain over 500 different species of plants. Featured collections include hydrangeas, camellias, historic herbs and a wide variety of native coastal species. The gardens are open to the public year-round, seven days a week except for certain holidays. MARTHA FRANCK FRAGRANCE GARDEN

This unique 1.1 acre garden is on the campus of the Governor Morehead School for the Blind , in Raleigh. And has been a cooperative project between the school and The Garden Club of North Carolina, Inc. since 1960. It is used as an outdoor classroom that allows visually impaired students and those with multiple physical challenges to experience scent, sound, and touch. Signage and labeling throughout the garden is done in Braille or raised letters. In 1997, the Garden Club of North Carolina, Inc. designated the Martha Franck Garden as its official South Atlantic Region United State Project. Because the garden is located on the grounds of the Morehead School for the Blind, garden visitors must stop by the office for a visitor's pass.
