As I mentioned at our last meeting, we are in the process of setting up a new program for our membership called PIN – Probus Information Network. Its overall purpose is twofold - to provide our membership with information concerning small, basically unadvertised events that are taking place in our community, and to assist our membership in locating reliable craftspeople or skilled labourers, people that have done good work for other members.

For example, you decide that you want to hire a painter, or a reliable person to clear your snow, etc. You then send an information request to the PIN email address. This request is then forwarded to all members of PIN. If anyone has dealt with someone capable of supplying the services that you require, and would recommend them, they will forward this information directly to you, describing the work done and their level of satisfaction in the completed project. Hopefully this will be helpful to the requesting member.

Or perhaps you have a table saw, or other items in good working order that you no longer have a need for and wish to offer "<u>free of charge</u>" to a PIN member. This could also be posted and perhaps someone might have a use for the item.



To join the PIN Network, you must acknowledge that you consent to receiving this information. A brief email will be sent to each of our members in the near future. If you wish to join PIN, please reply to the email as directed.

Sergeant Ryan Snow, Supervisor, Traffic Services Unit, Halton Regional Police Service, provided a very interesting presentation about impaired driving.



He discussed the rules and regulations with both drug use and alcohol use and what constitutes an impaired driver. The definition of an impaired driver is anyone that is unable to safely operate a motor vehicle.



Here are a few interesting statements that Ryan made:

- A third of all impaired charges are as a result of a call from the public
- The RIDE program always includes a chase car...never make a U-turn to avoid a RIDE check
- A person can be charged with impaired even though the car has not moved
- Failure to take a breathalyzer can result in a criminal charge
- Use CAA, roadside assistance or request a towing company from the police if you require a tow never sign a contract

Bill Turnbull, a former policeman, introduced Sergeant Snow and Diane Miller thanked him.

Member Experiences at November meeting: Jockie Loomer-Kruger talked about "Creativity in the Elderly" - highlighting the three years she conducted an individualized art program with residents at a Kitchener retirement home.


Member experiences



We had three for three. David Hunt, Brian Murphy and Carol Streeter each won all three of their games. Check out those smiles...three happy winners!!!


The games were followed by social time where Gaye served us a delicious light lunch and beverages. Thanks everyone for a fun afternoon.


As is common, the conversation was varied in content from asking for medical advice to the latest travel or projected travel plans.
