

## From our President:



### “C” is for “Change”

This month’s message is brought to you by the letter “C” and the number “Infinity”. [OK. I know Infinity is not a number – just work with me here.]

“C” is for COVID-19, but more importantly, “C” is for “Change”. If there is a universal truth that we can all agree on, it is that the pandemic spread of the virus has forced Change upon us like never before. This Change has been faster, has been broader based and has affected more of the world’s population than any previous Change event.

It was only three months ago that we were making plans to travel abroad, play cards with friends, go to a play or sports event, visit grandchildren or attend a Probus meeting. The prudent and unavoidable public health response to the spread of the virus brought on Change virtually overnight.

Wherever you look, Change is visible. There are fewer planes flying over Milton on the way to Pearson International Airport. There is more than ample parking available in the Milton GO Train lot. All sports and entertainment events are cancelled. All schools are closed for the remainder of the school year. For the past two months, all but essential businesses and services have closed their doors. Record numbers of people are working from home using remote technology. You haven’t had a hair cut in 9 weeks and you look like your Grade 11 school photo (just greyer). The list goes on and on and seems Infinite.

There has been no escaping this Change. Two hundred and thirteen countries and territories around the world have reported confirmed cases of COVID-19. The viral spread of disease has apparently reached everywhere except icy Antarctica and, thankfully, Nunavut. Even island nations, including St. Pierre and Miquelon, have not been spared from exposure.

Happily, humans are change experts. *Homo sapiens* are well-positioned to deal with Change. As a species, we have adapted to Change at a rate, and with a facility, unknown to any other living organism. Think of the

As adults, we enjoy kale, shitaki mushrooms, quinoa, tofu and a broad range of foods and flavours unknown to us as kids. Each of us has successfully faced the massive Change that comes with retirement. Membership in Probus is an element of our response to that big Change.

Club Management benefited from meeting over ZOOM on May 18th to start charting a course for the Club in the months ahead. At the District level, there are plans for a meeting of club presidents in early June, to explore the use of ZOOM technology in club meetings and activities.

As is customary in the spring, there has been a Change in Club Management. Heartfelt thanks and farewell to Joe Bernardino, Bonnie Chapman, Pat McIntyre, Werner Krebs, Rose Ryan and Bill Scarrow, who have completed their Management term. We welcome new Management members, Alice Carey, Anne Eadie, David Hunt, Shirley Matthews, Diane and Jim Miller and Henry Popp to the Committee. I am confident that our 2020 Management Team is up to the task of tackling the Change.

I will end my comments with “Infinity”, that pesky not-a-number. As I sit in sunlight with the birds singing and the trees blossoming, I realize that in all of the Change, the natural world around us has taken its usual course unaltered. Against the reliable backdrop of nature, we are told to expect a “New Normal” in our futures. I believe that it is the Infinite Hope we all share that will see us through these times of Change.

### **Travel Insurance with JOHNSON INSURANCE and COVID-19**

Members should refer to the Johnson Insurance website for information regarding travel insurance related to covid-19.

Click the Johnson website link <https://www.johnson.ca/coronavirus> and then click on Travel Insurance Updates.

That should answer people's questions about the status of Medoc Probus travel insurance.



Below is an interpretation of some of the policies but members need to contact Johnson Insurance if they have specific questions.

There will be no refund of premium paid except under strict limitations:

*"An annual plan covers multiple trips and can be paid over 12 months. For annual plans, a refund is only available for the Base Plan if the policy was in force for 60 days or less and no claims were made"*

Customers with travel planned:

*"If your trip was booked before any formal travel advisory was issued by the Government of Canada (March 13<sup>th</sup>), you may have coverage for Trip Cancellation, subject to the terms and conditions of the Policy."*

If your travel provider offers a future credit rather than a refund

*Travel insurance policies with trip cancellation and trip interruption coverage are designed to cover costs for cancelled trips that are non-refundable and non-transferrable. Amounts that are reimbursed via refund, voucher or credit are not eligible for a claim.*

*"Johnson has also made the decision to pause the selling of new MEDOC® Travel Insurance & Prestige Travel Insurance and Trip Cancellation/Interruption products, while we continue to evaluate the impact of Coronavirus on our travel insurance coverage."*

So far, the guys have 29 wins to the girls 30 wins.


Give it a try, it's fun to play Jokers with another couple using FaceTime.



The highlight of the meeting was seeing the faces of our friends and making connections once more.




The angel waits patiently as the bushes rustle and giggling ensues.


After fifteen minutes, the two return, out of breath and laughing.

At 55 the Vietnam War begins and doesn't end for 20 years. 4 million people perish in that conflict.





When you turn 75, the Vietnam War finally ends.



Think of everyone on the planet born in 1900. How do you survive all of that?
