From our President:



Lessons from COVID-19

Through the last 150 days we have experienced living our lives in the headlines. The events we read about in the newspaper and watched on television were the events we were experiencing directly, day to day. We watched in amazement as a germ that originated half a world away, spread across the globe, reached Canada's shores and eventually appeared in our little town.

Through the last 150 days we have learned a lot about the spread of contagion, the resilience of our community and the impact of each individual's actions as part of a collective response. We have quickly learned to categorize activities and events as

either essential or luxuries. We have each established our personal risk thresholds, those boundaries that determine whether we accept or reject the risk inherent in an action. Will we shop for our own groceries or have them delivered? Will we meet our friends in person or only by telephone or with computer video technology?

The last 150 days have taken us through a crash course in Behaviour Adaptation. Whether we know it or not, we now assess everything we do by first applying our Risk Thresholds. This has resulted in widespread changes, or adaptations, in our individual and group behaviour. Over the past 4 months, your Probus Management has met regularly to assess how best to guide our Club through this process of adaptation. With September, the month Probus traditionally re-activates after the summer months, just around the corner, I want to outline what Probus activities will be like through the remainder of 2020.

Monthly General Meetings

We will hold our monthly meetings on ZOOM. ZOOM is a video conferencing technology that is widely available to a full range of devices and provides easy to use, functional ways of gathering large numbers of participants in a single event.

It is management's goal to have our ZOOM meetings be as much like our in-person gatherings as possible. From the national anthem to the President's Joke, we plan to have it all. Or almost all. The Share the Wealth draw has us stymied at this point. For September, we have an engaging speaker lined up and Pat McIntyre will be featured in our Member Experience segment.

If you are unfamiliar with ZOOM we hope you will take advantage of our small group introductory sessions with Bob Streeter and Walter Eadie. Details of these sessions will be provided in a separate email message to members. Included with this newsletter is a helpful Zoom Meeting Etiquette Guide to get you started.

If you can't attend our ZOOM sessions, we will record the proceedings and you can watch the video on our Milton Probus Club webpage in the Members Only section at your leisure.

We know other Probus clubs in the District have successfully used ZOOM for their general meetings. Our ZOOM debut in September will be an exciting Adaptation Adventure. Plan to join us in this brave new world.

Your Management Committee does not normally meet over the summer but, because of these exceptional circumstances, the Committee has met each month over June-August using Zoom videoconferencing. Our focus has been in two main areas – how can we keep Probus fellowship alive during the Covid pandemic and how can we prepare to resume Club activities in September.

The Committee agreed to have Club directors make calls to members to keep them updated on our plans and to gather feedback and suggestions for the future. A first round of calls was made in June and it has been agreed to repeat the exercise in the fall.

Our Special Interest Groups are the lifeblood of Probus. Many have found new ways to continue to operate and the Management Committee has agreed to offer help wherever needed to allow all SIGs to adapt their activities to provide members with some degree of social interaction and involvement.

It was agreed to prepare and distribute a 2020 Membership Directory but to make it available via the club website since we could not hand it out at meetings. (Please ask if you do not know how to access the new 'members-only' section of the website).

Monthly General Meetings will resume in September using Zoom videoconferencing. (Please see details elsewhere in the Newsletter).

We agreed to make these on-line meetings as close as possible to our typical agenda and to do it in a way that makes it as easy as possible for members to join and listen in.

Short training sessions will be offered in late August for anyone unfamiliar with or uncomfortable with using Zoom. The meeting will also be recorded so that members without computers can watch it later.

The Management Committee believes that the current restrictions on meetings and gatherings will be with us for the foreseeable future and are now looking plans for the balance of 2020 and into the new year. All Special Events have been removed from the calendar for 2020. Financial projections and budget plans for next year will be examined in detail next month.

Short **introductory sessions on Zoom** will be held on August 24th, 26th, 28th. A letter with details will be sent to all members. For the general meeting, all that members will need to do is to log-in to Zoom and watch/listen to the talks. Members will not be seen or heard on the screens.

Zoom Meeting Tips

Meeting Preparation

- **Camera** position your laptop or tablet so the camera is at your eye level. If necessary, sit the laptop/tablet on something (never hold it). Then we see your face and not under your chin ⁽²⁾.
- **Lighting** avoid having a window or bright light directly behind you as you will be in shadow to everyone else. A light or window in front of you and behind your camera is much preferred.
- **Sitting position** try to sit close enough to the camera so that your head and shoulders are visible to the participants in the meeting.
- Tablets always position them sideways for a bigger image on the screen
- **Headphones** with mics, are not needed but are recommended for better audio and transmission of your voice, eliminating extraneous noises, and also making it less annoying for your family.
- Technical issues if you lose connection to the meeting for any reason, just exit right out then join again.
- **Internet Connection** if you are using a wireless connection, use <u>www.speedtest.net</u> to check your internet speed in the room you use. A download of 25-50 Mb/sec is good. Perhaps try another room if you have problems connecting and your number is low. Upload speed may also be important if you are doing a presentation, especially with video.

Tips for Best Participation

• **Rename yourself** - some participants show up as 'Owner' or 'Mary's i-Pad'. We all want to know who is who, so an easy first step when you join the meeting is to Rename Yourself so your first/last name is on your image.

Right click on your picture and select Rename, or open Participants, highlight your name, go to More, and then Rename.

- Know How to Use Mute Effective use of Mute and Unmute is critical for Zoom meetings. This is the responsibility of each attendee, so please try to master this function.
- In general, you should be Unmuted when you first join the meeting, but please Mute your microphone as soon as you are sure you are connected OK and are just waiting for the meeting to start. This allows the moderator to focus on ensuring that everyone else joining after you is connecting OK.






